1. Project Summary:

The goal of this project is to educate and entertain the people of Gila County of the diverse role Gila County has played in the first hundred years of Arizona. Funds will be used to present centennial programming at each of the eight community libraries within Gila County. A portion of the funds will be used to refresh the Southwest Collections within the public libraries. Community members will benefit by learning about the history of Gila County in an entertaining way. The collections will be revitalized with updated/new materials about the history and culture of the Southwest.

2. Project Description:

a. What will you do, and how will you do it?

Each of the eight public libraries within Gila County will pick one month of the Arizona Centennial Year in which to celebrate Arizona's statehood anniversary. The individual libraries will be responsible for planning a signature event to enlighten, educate and entertain their patrons and the members of their communities about the historical role Gila County has played in the last one hundred years of Arizona Statehood. The Gila County Library District will assist the libraries by ordering new materials to rejuvenate their Arizona/Southwest Collections.

b. What role will each of the institutional partners play?

The Globe Public Library during the month of March will partner with the Cobre Valley Center of the Arts to celebrate Arizona's Centennial by having a full day of activities including a mock ceremony involving the first governor of Arizona, George P. Hunt, entertaining historical presentations by Chautauqua's, and a community musical presentation at the City of Globe's Train Station.

The Hayden Public Library has chosen September for their presentation about Ghost Towns of Arizona.

In July 2012 the Isabelle Hunt Memorial Library will partnership with the Pine Strawberry Museum (Margret Parker, President), the LDS Church (unconfirmed) and Pine Strawberry Business Association (unconfirmed) and the Isabelle Hunt Public Library Give narrative tours on the Oldest School House in Arizona, located in Strawberry, Arizona for a communitywide event. They hope to present a live performance of holding school during that period at the school house, (Museum)History presentations on the Pine Strawberry Community – Guest Speaker: Mike Anderson, PhD – Local Historian (Library), have an art and photo show of the Pine Strawberry Community (Library), recreate the Pioneer Community Parade (LDS Church & Pine Strawberry Business Association), hold an old fashion BBQ and Ice Cream Social with

the whole community, and print a current map with photos along with updating the history of the Historical Building in the community (Museum).

The Miami Memorial Library will hold its historical event in the month of April, 2012, commemorating the importance mining played in the last 100 years.

Payson Public Library will choose a month in the spring of 2012. They will partner with their Friends Group and invite Arizona Humanities Speakers, local historians, hold an open house at the library and explore the foods of Arizona history.

San Carlos Public Library has picked June, 2012 which is the month of the San Carlos Apache Independence Day. Their activities will center on the rich history of the Apache Tribe and Geronimo.

The Tonto Basin Public Library in March, 2012 hopes to hold its Centennial event at the school with a potluck which will include the whole community. They would hire someone to come in and tell Arizona History. The librarian, Kathy Womack is sure that with enough notice she could encourage some of the "old-timers" to speak up about Tonto history.

Liz Hutton at the Young Public Library would like to "kick" off their Centennial events in early August, 2012. She is in the early planning stages of events which the library will host. The library has begun soliciting ideas from their patrons.

The Gila County Library District will supply a traveling pull-up promotional banner, and commemorative pins and certificates to anyone who participates in the Centennial celebrations.

c. How will the general public participate or use this product? Who will participate, and how many will directly participate in the first year? How will you publicize this activity or product?

The general public will participate by attending Centennial events in each of the communities of Gila County that have a public library. Patrons of the libraries will have access to revitalized Arizona and Southwest collections.

All events will be publicized through local media via Public Service Announcements, letters to the Editors and news releases.




