OUR PROGRAMS:

Improve Safety & Well-being with a 24/7 Crisis Hotline, Emergency Shelter, Safety Planning, Crisis Intervention

Increase Healing through trauma counseling, access to health care, substance abuse education

Strengthen the Family by providing parenting education, children’s groups, Mother/Child Healing Garden, access to community based services

Ensure Justice with Lay Legal Advocacy, Court accompaniment, Victim Compensation Benefits

Build Economic Stability with education assistance, employment readiness training, career advancement workshops, job search assistance, financial literacy education, transitional housing

WHO WE SERVED IN 2012-2013:

- Women & Children came from 9 AZ counties, 4 Native American Reservations & 3 states
- 9903 bed nights of safe shelter were provided
- 1700+ crises call answered
- 2,092 hrs. of individual counseling were provided
- 20 transitional housing residents (3765 Transitional Shelter bed nights)
- Assisted 200 clients with Lay legal Advocacy (including 8 men)
- 19 women gained regular employment; 1 received a Pell Education Grant

Our 12 full and 12 part time staff were supported through 849 volunteer hours at the shelter

The Time Out Thrift Store provides opportunities for volunteerism, job related skills training and material and financial resources for our Programs. 7,779 volunteer hours were given and it was voted Payson Round-up best Thrift Store 2013.
