Dear Don,

On behalf of Bose Public Affairs Group (Bose) and for our federal government relations services for Gila County, enclosed is the May 2014 invoice reflecting April's monthly retainer and ordinary business expenses. Please note that, in accordance with our contract, Bose bills our monthly retainer for the work completed the month before along with covered expenses accrued the month before.

Tommie Martin returned to Washington in early April for the National Association of Counties (NACo) Rural Action Caucus fly-in. Tommie joined 20 other county officials from rural counties across the country for a series of briefings and meetings with legislative staff and members and executive branch officials to both learn about and inform federal policy and legislative development on issues of greatest concern to rural counties, including transportation, agriculture and rural development, immigration, education, land management and related resource issues, and water. I accompanied Tommie to all of these meetings and covered additional meetings where appropriate (see below).

In addition to our on-going monitoring of issues of interest to Gila County, such as federal budget related to forest and transportation, surface transportation reauthorization, and forest management issues, I provide the following activity update:

- Prepared for and joined Supervisor Martin during her visit to Washington for the NACo's Rural Action Caucus fly-in.
- Attended meetings included: Department of Transportation (DOT) Acting Deputy Secretary Victor Mendez and his staff; Senator John McCain and his staff; Rep. Paul Gosar and his staff; staff for Senator Jeff Flake and Rep. Ann Kirkpatrick; DOT legislative staff; and Department of Agriculture Rural Development and other staff.
- Continued to research new approaches to funding the County's transportation projects, including legislative options.
- Continued to monitor County priorities including forest health and wildfire threats and 4FRI, transportation needs, including ongoing forest road projects


