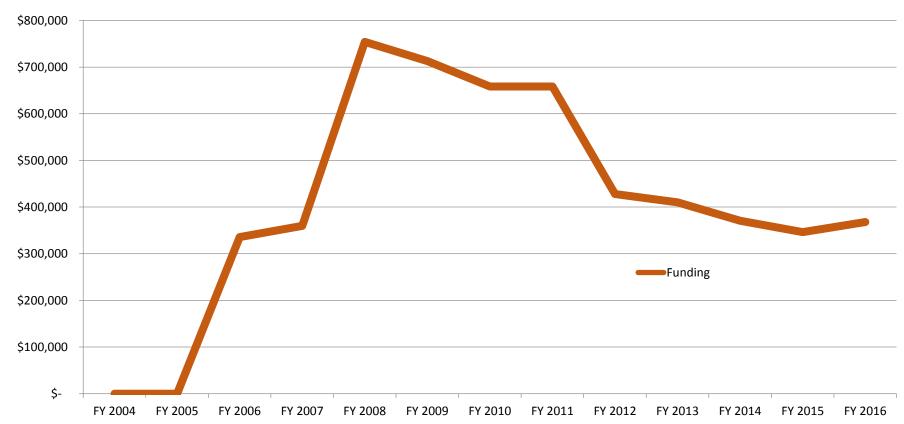

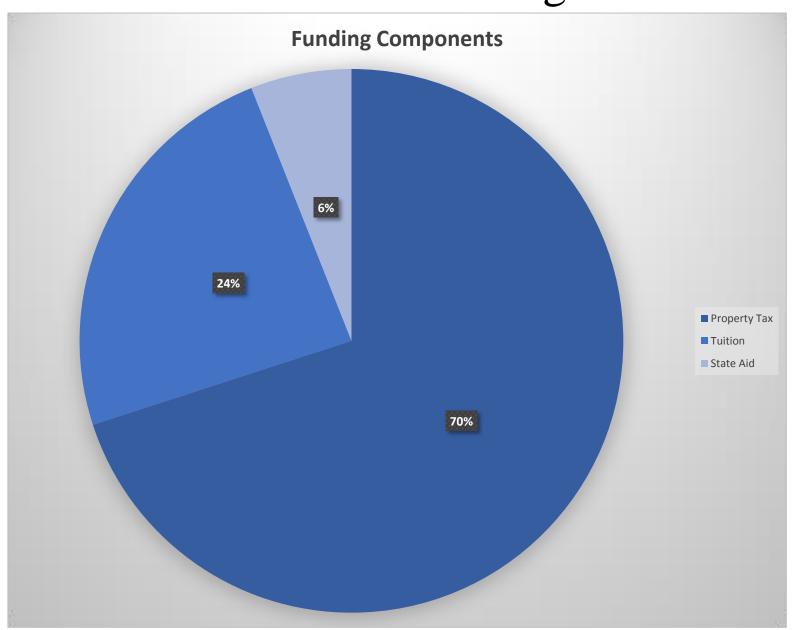

Rich Petrus, Team Leader with Atwell, has been the County's Landfill Consultant for the past 20 plus years. During that time Mr. Petrus developed expansion plans for both Buckhead and Russell Gulch. Task 1 – Prepare Plans and Specifications

Atwell will develop plans and specifications for the expansion. The expansion design will include a system compatible with the previous expansion. The liner system will include, from top to bottom:

- One foot of protective cover
- Geonet for transmission of landfill leachate
- 60 ml HDPE liner
- Geosythetic Clay Liner
- Prepared subgrade

All design specifications will be developed in accordance with the Construction Specification Institute Standards. The plans will be in accordance with engineering best management standards and will tie into the previous construction stages. The following specifications will be included:

Task 2 – Submit Application for Alternative Cover and Landfill Height Change

Atwell will meet with ADEQ Plan Review Unit prior to commencing the study and design work for the landfill expansion, alternative cover design, and increased landfill height. In this meeting Atwell will summarize the concept of landfill design, preliminary layouts and site map.

It is anticipated that a Type IV modification will be required for the alternative cover design and height change. At well will complete the application in accordance with the existing Application Plan Format. The final cover design will consist of an Evaporative Transpiration cover system similar to the one designed at the Russell Gulch Landfill. The proposed landfill height will increase 20 feet with a final elevation of approximately 5290 feet.

The alternative cover design will be evaluated using numerical simulations of a 30-year hypothetical weather series applied to a one-dimensional representation of the expansion. Simulations of precipitation to be used in the one-dimensional water balance modeling of the expansion cell will be used for evaluating infiltration in the prescriptive and variations of the alternative cover designs.



The alternative cover designs will then evaluated by comparing the simulated water fluxes though the alternative covers with the simulated water flux through the prescriptive final cover.

The numerical simulations will be conducted using HYDRUS 1-D (HYDRUS), a one-dimensional finite element model for simulating water flow in variably-saturated soils (Simunek et al., 2008). HYDRUS uses Richards' Equation to solve the variably saturated flow problem, and includes the hydrological processes relevant to landfill cover design: e.g., time variable precipitation and potential evaporation; root water uptake and root growth; and moisture retention – soil suction and hydraulic conductivity – moisture relationships. HYDRUS is widely used for modeling laboratory and field-scale applications, including alternative landfill cover design. A minimum of two alternative designs will be evaluated against the performance of the prescriptive cover. These designs will have variable thickness of cover, vegetative layers, and capillary breaks.

Slope Stability Analysis – Atwell does not anticipate a slope stability analysis will be needed for the increased height the final landfill configuration.

Task 3 - Conduct Pre-Bid Conference and Bid Support

Following completion of the bid documents, Atwell will assist in advertising the project and placing the documents in Plan Rooms in Phoenix. Atwell will serve as a distributor of the bid documents and will maintain a bidders list and addenda log.

Atwell will conduct a mandatory pre-bid conference at the landfill to discuss the project and allow prospective bidders to walk the site. Atwell will prepare an agenda for the meeting and will respond to all questions asked by prospective bidders in the form of an addendum.

Atwell will also attend the bid opening which is anticipated to be at the County offices and assist the County in the review, evaluation and award of the project.

Task 4 – Conduct Construction Oversight

Atwell will provide time and material (T&M) pricing for two (2) months of construction management services (4 weeks for soils and 2 weeks for geosynthetics) for the landfill closure project which will include, but not be limited to the following:

Atwell will provide professional staff to inspect, observe, and collect pertinent data, and to facilitate the construction efforts and provide some level of assurance that it is executed in accordance with the Contract Documents. Atwell will hire a geotechnical engineer to provide compaction testing during preparation of the prepared subgrade and foundation backfilling. Additionally, Atwell will compile all of the field testing (compaction testing, liner testing, liner repair) results, selected photographs during construction and required field notes. All test reports will be submitted to the County in a final construction report.

Atwell will review up to ten (10) contractor requests for information (RFI's) and provide written responses to same. Services will include review of shop drawings, which shall be submitted by contractor all at one time. Atwell will make every attempt to review shop drawings and return to contractor within three business days or less.

Atwell will also conduct and document discussions on weekly construction meetings. Develop a monthly report, including: weekly meeting notes, schedule progress status, projected tasks, relevant pictures and issues arising during that time period.



Task 5 – Prepare and Submit CQA Certification Report

Following completion of the construction phase, Atwell will prepare the Construction Quality Assurance (CQA) Certification Report. The CQA report will address the construction quality assurance of the soils, geosynthetics, and related liner components for landfill. The report will be divided into the following sections:

Approval to use State Contract No. ADSPO12-013788 with SD Crane Builders, Inc. for the renovation of the first floor of the Globe Courthouse building.

Background Information

In 2013, the Board of Supervisors asked staff to identify space options in an attempt to alleviate overcrowding. Various alternatives for acquiring additional office space have been explored. In recent years the second floor of the Courthouse was remodeled and the School Superintendent's Office moved from the first floor to the second floor. This gave the County Attorney room to move the staff from the Michaelson building to the Courthouse so all of the staff was in the same area. Planning had been ongoing but was on hold until the Copper Building could be completed. In January 2017, all of the remaining County Attorney staff was removed from the Michaelson building in Globe and temporarily placed in an area of the first floor at the Courthouse. It is not an ideal working space so the quicker the remodel is completed, the better it will be for the public and the employees.

The Justice Court has also been planning to rearrange its office space and accommodate safer public access and more efficient work areas for staff. Working on remodeling both offices at the same time will reduce contractor mobilization costs and make the HVAC system renovations complete at the same time. Climate control has been an issue for years with small office remodels affecting, but not addressing the entire first floor HVAC system.

Equally important to the above issues, this tenant improvement addresses

the necessary security for the County Attorney, Justice Court offices and improves the south elevator security for the Sheriff Detention staff and inmates during transport.

Evaluation

Designing the space for the Globe Courthouse first floor to accommodate the County Attorney from the Michaelson building and remodeling the Justice Court to enhance the flow of work and public traffic in its offices has been in progress since 2016. The design work was planned with the assistance of an architect and the final drawings were accepted by the County Attorney and Justice Court. The Public Works Facilities staff sought a proposal from SD Crane Builders because of the previous projects' successes. The attached proposal was submitted by SD Crane Builders and confirmed by the Gordian Group in the amount of \$369,880.20 for the work that will be required on the project. Public Works Facilities will add an additional ten percent (10%) to the cost for contingency only to be expensed with prior authorization of the County Project Manager. With job order contracting contingency it has only been used for the unknowns on the previous projects, not what was missed by the contractor.

Conclusion

The Public Works Facilities team has concluded that the most viable, direct route of accomplishing the County's objectives in completing a fully functional Courthouse building can be obtained by utilizing a cooperative contract with the State of Arizona Procurement Office with SD Crane Builders, Inc., a General Contractor, for the construction of interior improvements and all associated facets of construction.

Recommendation

The Finance Division Director and the Public Works Division Director recommend that the Board of Supervisors approve the use of the State of Arizona Procurement Office Contract No. ADSPO12-013788 with SD Crane Builders, Inc. for the construction of interior improvements, exterior improvements and all associated facets of remodel on the Courthouse building.

Approval of Amendment No. 2 to an Intergovernmental Agreement (Contract No. ADHS17-133182) with the Arizona Department of Health Services for Public Health Emergency Preparedness Funding. This amendment gives Gila County Department of Health Services and additional \$14,029.43 for Public Health Emergency Preparedness activities and \$10,000.00 for Zika Virus public education materials.

Background Information

The purpose of the Gila County Public Health Emergency Preparedness program is to readily prepare the staff and community for any public health emergency. This includes staff training, development of disaster plans, organizing disaster exercises, and procuring emergency supplies and equipment. The program exists to enhance all hazard strategic planning and direction, coordination and assessment, surveillance and detection capacities, risk communication and health information dissemination, telecommunications capabilities and education and training.

This Intergovernmental Agreement (Contract No. ADHS17-133182) began a new contract period for the public health emergency preparedness grant extending our funding from July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017, in the amount of \$186,389.67 and was approved by the Board of Supervisors at its June 21, 2016, meeting. Amendment No.1 to Contract No. ADHS17-133182 provided an additional \$55,870 in funding to be used for Zika Virus community outreach, public education, and mosquito surveillance programs. Amendment No.2 to Contract No. ADHS17-133182 provides an additional \$14,029.43 for Public Health Emergency Preparedness activities and \$10,000 for Zika Virus public educational materials.

Evaluation

This funding will allow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management Division, Department of Public Health Emergency Preparedness, to continue to provide staff and community preparedness training; develop disaster plans; organize disaster exercises; and procure emergency supplies and equipment as well as the continued review and improvement of all hazard strategic planning and direction, coordination and assessment, surveillance and detection capacities, risk communication and health information dissemination, telecommunications capabilities and education and training. In addition, this funding will allow further community outreach and the creation of public educational materials for Zika Virus.

Conclusion

Approval of Amendment No. 2 to Intergovernmental Agreement-Contract No. ADHS17-133182 will allow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management Division to continue to improve emergency preparedness services and support to Gila County residents and additionally better prepare the county to respond and mitigate new and emerging infectious diseases.

Recommendation

1. BACKGROUND

As of April 11, 2016, local vector-borne transmission of Zika virus was identified in more than 40 countries and U.S. territories in the Americas, including Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Marshall Islands, and American Samoa. To date, Zika has not spread by mosquitoes in the continental United States, but travel-associated cases are being reported. CDC continues to evaluate cases of Zika transmission in the United States and U.S. territories and has developed response plans to reduce the spread of ZVD associated with Aedes aegypti and Aedes albopictus mosquitoes and minimize maternal-fetal transmission of Zika virus. As the recipient of Zika supplemental funding (Sub-awardee) from the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), your organization is required to adhere to Federal and State grant requirements.

2. DELIVERABLES

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. With the increase of emerging infectious diseases such as Zika, local public health partners should maintain the capacity for surveillance, investigation and control of infectious diseases and public health incidents.
- 1.2. The first section of this document will outline the requirements set forth by Center for Disease Control (CDC) and ADHS that all County partners will need to address to ensure they are met during the reporting period. Progress on these requirements will be measured throughout the year through frequent communication and mid-year reporting.
- 1.3. Electronic exchange of personal health information should meet applicable patient privacy-related laws and standards, including state or territorial laws. These include the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act, and standards from the National Institute of Standards and Technology and the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

2. REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. As a recipient of Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) Zika funds from the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), you are required to adhere to Federal and State grant requirements. Below you will find a list of the program requirements for the funding.
 - 2.1.1. County shall investigate 100% of suspected cases of Zika and provide public health actions.
 - 2.1.1.1. Public health actions could include, but are not limited to:
 - 2.1.1.1. Vector control strategies as new cases are identified;
 - 2.1.1.1.2. Education about mosquito abatement;
 - 2.1.1.1.3. Education about mosquito bite prevention;
 - 2.1.1.1.4. Education about sexual transmission;
 - 2.1.2. County shall create a Zika protocol within 90 days of receiving funds and share on the Health Services Portal (HSP) with ADHS.

3. CONTRACT INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 <u>Arizona Law.</u> The law of Arizona applies to this Contract including, where applicable, the Uniform Commercial Code as adopted by the State of Arizona.

- 3.8 <u>Headings</u> Headings are for organizational purposes only and shall not be interpreted as having legal significance or meaning.

4. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION

- 4.1. <u>Term.</u> As indicated on the signature page of the Contract, the Contract shall be effective as of the Begin Date and shall remain effective until the Termination Date.

- 4.3. New Budget Term. - Title and Rights to Materials. To the extent any copyright in any Materials may originally vest in the Contractor, the Contractor hereby irrevocably transfers to the ADHS, for and on behalf of the State, all copyright ownership. The ADHS shall have full, complete and exclusive rights to reproduce, duplicate, adapt, distribute, display, disclose, publish, release and otherwise use all Materials. The Contractor shall not use or release these Materials without the prior written consent of the ADHS. When this Contract is terminated, the disposition of all such Materials shall be determined by the ADHS. Further, the Contractor agrees to give recognition to the ADHS for its support of any program when releasing or publishing program Materials.

- 4.10.3 Notwithstanding the above, if the Contractor is a State agency, the following shall apply instead: It is the intention of ADHS and Contractor that all material and intellectual property developed under this Agreement be used and controlled in ways to produce the greatest benefit to the parties to this Contract and the citizens of the State of Arizona. As used in this paragraph, "Material" means all written and electronic information, recordings, reports, findings, research information, abstracts, results, software, data, discoveries, inventions, procedures and processes of services developed by the Contractor and any other materials created, prepared or received by the Contractor and subcontractors in performance of this Agreement. "Material" as used herein shall not include any pre-existing data, information, materials, discoveries, inventions or any form of intellectual property invented, created, developed or devised by Contractor (or its employees, subcontractors or agents) prior to the commencement of the services funded by this Agreement or that may result from Contractor's involvement in other service activities that are not funded by the Agreement.
- Title and exclusive copyright to all Material shall vest in the State of Arizona, subject to any rights 4.10.4 reserved on behalf of the federal government. As State agencies and instrumentalities, both ADHS and Contractor shall have full, complete, perpetual, irrevocable and non-transferable rights to reproduce, duplicate, adapt, make derivative works, distribute, display, disclose, publish and otherwise use any and all Material. The Contractor's right to use Material shall include the following the right to use the Material in connection with its internal, non-profit research and educational activities, the right to present at academic or professional meetings or symposia and the right to publish in journals, theses, dissertations or otherwise of Contractor's own choosing. Contractor agrees to provide ADHS with a right of review prior to any publication or public presentation of the Material, and ADHS shall be entitled to request the removal of its confidential information or any other content the disclosure of which would be contrary to the best interest of the State of Arizona. Neither party shall release confidential information to the public without the prior expressly written permission of the other, unless required by the State public records statutes or other law, including a court order. Each party agrees to give recognition to the other party in all public presentations or publications of any Material, when releasing or publishing them.
- In addition, ADHS and Contractor agree that any and all Material shall be made freely available to the public to the extent it is in the best interest of the State. However, if either party wants to license or assign an intellectual property interest in the material to a third-party for monetary compensation, ADHS and Contractor agree to convene to determine the relevant issues of title, copyright, patent and distribution of revenue. In the event of a controversy as to whether the Material is being used for monetary compensation or in a way that interferes with the best interest of the state or ADHS, then the Arizona Department of Administration shall make the final decision. Notwithstanding the above, "monetary compensation' does not include compensation paid to an individual creator for traditional publications in academia (the copyrights to which are Employee-Excluded Works under ABOR Intellectual Property Policy Section 6-908C 4.), an honorarium or other reimbursement of expenses for an academic or professional presentation, or an unprofitable distribution of Material.



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- 4.11 <u>E-Verify Requirements</u> In accordance with A.R.S. § 41-4401, Contractor warrants compliance with all Federal immigration laws and regulations relating to employees and warrants its compliance with Section A.R.S. § 23-214, Subsection A.
- 4.12. Federal Immigration and Nationality Act. The Contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local immigration laws and regulations relating to the immigration status of their employees during the term of the Contract. Further, the Contractor shall flow down this requirement to all subcontractors utilized during the term of the Contract. The State shall retain the right to perform random audits of Contractor and subcontractor records or to inspect papers of any employee thereof to ensure compliance. Should the State determine that the Contractor and/or any subcontractors be found noncompliant, the State may pursue all remedies allowed by law, including, but not limited to; suspension of work, termination of the Contract for default and suspension and/or debarment of the Contractor.

Payments. Payments shall comply with the requirements of A.R.S. Titles 35 and 41, net 30 days. Upon receipt and acceptance of goods or services, the Contractor shall submit a complete and accurate Contractor's Expenditure Report for payment from the State within thirty (30) days, as provided in the Accounting and Auditing Procedures Manual for the ADHS.

5.2. Recoupment of Contract Payments.

- 5.2.1 Uneamed Advanced Funds. Any unearned State funds that have been advanced to the Contractor and remain in its possession at the end of each budget term, or at the time of termination of the Contract, shall be refunded to the ADHS within forty-five (45) days of the end of a budget term or of the time of termination.
- Contracted Services. In a fixed price contract, if the number of services provided is less than the number of services for which the Contractor received compensation, funds to be returned to the ADHS shall be determined by the Contract price. Where the price is determined by cost per unit of service or material, the funds to be returned shall be determined by multiplying the unit of service cost by the number of services the Contractor did not provide during the Contract term. Where the price for a deliverable is fixed, but the deliverable has not been completed, the Contractor shall be paid a pro rata portion of the completed deliverable. In a cost reimbursement contract, the ADHS shall pay for any costs that the Contractor can document as having been paid by the Contractor and approved by ADHS. In addition, the Contractor will be paid its reasonable actual costs for work in progress as determined by Generally Accepted Accounting Procedures up to the date of contract termination
- Refunds. Within forty-five (45) days after the end of each budget term or of the time of termination of the Contract, the Contractor shall refund the greater of: i) the amount refundable in accordance with paragraph 4.2.1, Unearned Advanced Funds; or ii) the amount refundable in accordance with paragraph 5.2.2, Contracted Services.
- 5.2.4 Unacceptable Expenditures. The Contractor agrees to reimburse the ADHS for all Contract funds expended, which are determined by the ADHS not to have been disbursed by the Contractor in accordance with the terms of this Contract. The Contractor shall reimburse ADHS within 45 days of the determination of unacceptability.
- 5.3 <u>Unit Costs/Rates or Fees</u>. Unit costs/rates or fees shall be based on costs, which are determined by ADHS to be reasonable, allowable and allocable as outlined in the Accounting and Auditing Procedures Manual for the ADHS.



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5.4. Applicable Taxes

- 5.4.1 State and Local Transaction Privilege Taxes. The State of Arizona is subject to all applicable state and local transaction privilege taxes. Transaction privilege taxes apply to the sale and are the responsibility of the seller to remit. Failure to collect taxes from the buyer does not relieve the seller from its obligation to remit taxes.
- Tax Indemnification. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all federal, state and local taxes applicable to its operation and any persons employed by the Contractor. Contractor shall require all subcontractors to hold the State harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal, and/or state and local laws and regulations and any other costs, including transaction privilege taxes, unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security and Worker's Compensation.
- 5.4.3 *LR.S. W9 Form.* In order to receive payment under any resulting Contract, the Contractor shall have a current LR.S. W9 Form on file with the State of Arizona.
- Availability of Funds for the Next Fiscal Year. Funds may not be presently available for performance under this Contract beyond the first year of the budget term or Contract term. The State may reduce payments or terminate this Contract without further recourse, obligation or penalty in the event that insufficient funds are appropriated in the subsequent budget term. The State shall not be liable for any purchases or Subcontracts entered into by the Contractor in anticipation of such funding. The Procurement Officer shall have the discretion in determining the availability of funds.
- 5.6. <u>Availability of Funds for the Current Contract Term.</u> Should the State Legislature enter back into session and decrease the appropriations through line item or general fund reductions, or for any other reason these goods or services are not funded as determined by ADHS, the following actions may be taken by ADHS:
 - 5.6.1 Accept a decrease in price offered by the Contractor;
 - 5.6.2 Reduce the number of goods or units of service and reduce the payments accordingly;
 - 5.6.3 Offer reductions in funding as an alternative to Contract termination; or
 - 5.6.4 Cancel the Contract

6. CONTRACT CHANGES

- Amendments, Purchase Orders and Change Orders. This Contract is issued under the authority of the Procurement Officer who signed this Contract. The Contract may be modified only through a Contract Amendment, Purchase Order and/or Change Order within the scope of the Contract, unless the change is administrative or otherwise permitted by the Special Terms and Conditions. Changes to the Contract, including the addition of work or materials, the revision of payment terms, or the substitution of work or materials, directed by an unauthorized State employee or made unilaterally by the Contractor are violations of the Contract and of applicable law. Such changes, including unauthorized Contract Amendments, Purchase Orders and/or Change Orders, shall be void and without effect, and the Contractor shall not be entitled to any claim under this Contract based on those changes.
- 6.2. <u>Subcontracts</u> The Contractor shall not enter into any subcontract under this Contract without the advance written approval of the Procurement Officer The subcontract shall incorporate by reference all material and applicable terms and conditions of this Contract.
- 6.3 <u>Assignments and Delegation</u>. The Contractor shall not assign any right nor delegate any duty under this Contract without the prior written approval of the Procurement Officer The State shall not unreasonably withhold approval.



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7. RISK AND LIABILITY

- 7.1. Risk of Loss. The Contractor shall bear all loss of conforming material covered under this Contract until received and accepted by authorized personnel at the location designated in the Purchase Order, Change Order or Contract. Mere receipt does not constitute final acceptance. The risk of loss for nonconforming materials shall remain with the Contractor regardless of receipt.
- Mutual Indemnification. Each party (as "indemnitor") agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party (as "indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) (hereinafter collectively referred to as "claims") arising out of bodily injury of any person (including death) or property damage, but only to the extent that such claims, which result in vicarious/derivative liability to the indemnitee, are caused by the act, omission, negligence, misconduct, or other fault of the indemnitor, its officers, officials, agents, employees or volunteers
- 7.3. Indemnification Patent and Copyright. To the extent permitted by A.R.S. § 41-621 and A.R.S. § 35-154, the Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the State against any liability, including costs and expenses, for infringement of any patent, trademark or copyright arising out of performance of the Contract or use by the State of materials furnished by or work performed under this Contract. The State shall reasonably notify the Contractor of any claim for which it may be liable under this paragraph.

7.4. Force Majeure

- 7.4.1 Liability and Definition. Except for payment of sums due, neither party shall be liable to the other nor deemed in default under this Contract if and to the extent that such party's performance of this Contract is prevented by reason of force majeure. The term "force majeure" means an occurrence that is beyond the control of the party affected and occurs without its fault or negligence. Without limiting the foregoing, force majeure includes acts of God; acts of the public enemy; acts of terrorism; war; riots; strikes; mobilization; labor disputes; civil disorders; fire; flood; lockouts; injunctions-interventions not caused by or resulting from the act or failure to act of the parties; failures or refusals to act by government authority not caused by or resulting from the act or failure to act of the parties; and other similar occurrences beyond the control of the party declaring force majeure, which such party is unable to prevent by exercising reasonable diligence.
- 7.42. Exclusions. Force Majeure shall not include the following occurrences:
 - 7.4.2.1 Late delivery of Materials caused by congestion at a manufacturer's plant or elsewhere, or an oversold condition of the market;
 - 7.4.2.2 Late performance by a subcontractor unless the delay arises out of a force majeure occurrence in accordance with this force majeure term and condition; or
 - 7.4.2.3 Inability of either the Contractor or any subcontractor to acquire or maintain any required insurance, bonds, licenses or permits.
- 7.4.3. Notice: If either party is delayed at any time in the progress of the work by force majeure, the delayed party shall notify the other party in writing of such delay, as soon as is practicable and no later than the following working day of the commencement thereof, and shall specify the causes of such delay in such notice. Such notice shall be delivered or mailed certified-return receipt and shall make a specific reference to this article, thereby invoking its provisions. The delayed party shall cause such delay to cease as soon as practicable and shall notify the other party in writing when it has done so. The time of completion shall be extended by Contract Amendment for a period of time equal to the time that the results or effects of such delay prevent the delayed party from performing in accordance with this Contract.



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- 7.4.4 Default. Any delay or failure in performance by either party hereto shall not constitute default hereunder or give rise to any claim for damages or loss of anticipated profits if, and to the extent that, such delay or failure is caused by force majeure.
- 7.5. Third Party Antitrust Violations. The Contractor assigns to the State any claim for overcharges resulting from antitrust violations to the extent that those violations concern materials or services supplied by third parties to the Contractor for or toward the fulfillment of this Contract.

8. DESCRIPTION OF MATERIALS

The following provisions shall apply to Materials only:

- 8.1. <u>Liens.</u> The Contractor agrees that the Materials supplied under this Contract are free of liens. In the event the Materials are not free of liens, Contractor shall pay to remove the lien and any associated damages or replace the Materials with Materials free of liens.
- 8.2. Quality. Unless otherwise modified elsewhere in these terms and conditions, the Contractor agrees that, for one year after acceptance by the State of the Materials, they shall be:
 - 8.2.1. Of a quality to pass without objection in the Contract description;
 - 8.2.2. Fit for the intended purposes for which the Materials are used;
 - 8.2.3. Within the variations permitted by the Contract and are of even kind, quantity, and quality within each unit and among all units;
 - 8.2.4. Adequately contained, packaged and marked as the Contract may require; and
 - 8.2.5. Conform to the written promises or affirmations of fact made by the Contractor
- 8.3. <u>Inspection/Testing</u>. Subparagraphs 8.1 through 8.2 of this paragraph are not affected by inspection or testing of or payment for the Materials by the State.
- 8.4 <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The Materials and services supplied under this Contract shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, and the Contractor shall maintain all applicable license and permit requirements
- 8.5. Survival of Rights and Obligations After Contract Expiration and Termination.
 - 8.5.1 Contractor's Representations. All representations and warranties made by the Contractor under this Contract in paragraphs 7 and 8 shall survive the expiration or termination hereof. In addition, the parties hereto acknowledge that pursuant to A.R.S. § 12.510, except as provided in A.R.S. § 12-529, the State is not subject to or barred by any limitations of actions prescribed in A.R.S. Title 12, Chapter 5.
 - Purchase Orders and Change Orders. Unless otherwise directed in writing by the Procurement Officer, the Contractor shall fully perform and shall be obligated to comply with all Purchase Orders and Change Orders received by the Contractor prior to the expiration or termination hereof, including, without limitation, all Purchase Orders and Change Orders received prior to but not fully performed and satisfied at the expiration or termination of this Contract.

9. STATE'S CONTRACTUAL REMEDIES

9.1 Right to Assurance. If the State, in good faith, has reason to believe that the Contractor does not intend to, or is unable to, perform or continue performing under this Contract, the Procurement Officer may demand in



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writing that the Contractor give a written assurance of intent to perform. Failure by the Contractor to provide written assurance within the number of Days specified in the demand may, at the State's option, be the basis for terminating the Contract.

9.2. Stop Work Order.

- 9.2.1. Terms. The State may, at any time, by written order to the Contractor, require the Contractor to stop all or any part of the work called for by this Contract for a period up to ninety (90) Days after the order is delivered to the Contractor, and for any further period to which the parties may agree. The order shall be specifically identified as a stop work order issued under this clause. Upon receipt of the order, the Contractor shall immediately comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage.
- 9.2.2. Cancellation or Expiration. If a stop work order issued under this clause is canceled or the period of the order or any extension expires, the Contractor shall resume work. The Procurement Officer shall make an equitable adjustment in the delivery schedule or Contract price, or both, and the Contract shall be amended in writing accordingly.
- 9.3 <u>Non-exclusive Remedies</u> The rights and remedies of ADHS under this Contract are not exclusive, and ADHS is entitled to all rights and remedies available to it, including those under the Arizona Uniform Commercial Code and Arizona common law
- Right of Offset. The State shall be entitled to offset against any sums due the Contractor in any Contract with the State or damages assessed by the State because of the Contractor's non-conforming performance or failure to perform this Contract. The right to offset may include, but is not limited to, a deduction from an unpaid balance and a collection against the bid and/or performance bonds. Any offset taken for damages assessed by the State shall represent a fair and reasonable amount for the actual damages and shall not be a penalty for non-performance.

10. CONTRACT TERMINATION

- Cancellation for Conflict of Interest. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511, the State may cancel this Contract within three (3) years after Contract execution without penalty or further obligation if any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the Contract on behalf of the State is, or becomes at any time while the Contract or an extension of the Contract is in effect, an employee of or a consultant to any other party to this Contract with respect to the subject matter of the Contract. The cancellation shall be effective when the Contractor receives written notice of the cancellation, unless the notice specifies a later time. If the Contractor is a political subdivision of the State, it may also cancel this Contract as provided in A.R.S. § 38-511.
- 10.2 <u>Gratuities.</u> The State may, by written notice, terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, if the State determines that employment or a Gratuity was offered or made by the Contractor or a representative of the Contractor to any officer or employee of the State for the purpose of influencing the outcome of the procurement, securing the Contract or an Amendment to the Contract, or receiving favorable treatment concerning the Contract, including the making of any determination or decision about Contract performance. The State, in addition to any other rights or remedies, shall be entitled to recover exemplary damages in the amount of three times the value of the Gratuity offered by the Contractor.
- 10.3. <u>Suspension or Debarment.</u> The State may, by written notice to the Contractor, immediately terminate this Contract if the State determines that the Contractor or its subcontractor has been debarred, suspended or otherwise lawfully prohibited from participating in any public procurement activity, including but not limited to, being disapproved as a subcontractor of any public procurement unit or other governmental body.



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10.4. Termination Without Cause.

- 10.4.1 Both the State and the Contractor may terminate this Contract at any time with thirty (30) days' notice in writing specifying the termination date. Such notices shall be given by personal delivery or by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- 10.4.2. If the Contractor terminates this Contract, any monies prepaid by the State, for which no service or benefit was received by the State, shall be refunded to the State within 5 days of the termination notice. In addition, if the Contractor terminates the Contract, the Contractor shall indemnify the State for any sanctions imposed by the funding source as a result of the Contractor's failure to complete the Contract
- 10.4.3. If the State terminates this Contact pursuant to this Section, the State shall pay the Contractor the Contract price for all Services and Materials completed up to the date of termination. In a fixed price contract, the State shall pay the amount owed for the Services or Materials by multiplying the unit of service or item cost by the number of unpaid service units or items. In a cost reimbursement contract, the ADHS shall pay for any costs that the Contractor can document as having been paid by the Contractor and approved by ADHS. In addition, the Contractor will be paid its reasonable actual costs for work in progress as determined by GAAP up to the date of termination. Upon such termination, the Contractor shall deliver to the ADHS all deliverables completed. ADHS may require Contractor to negotiate the terms of any remaining deliverables still due.
- 10.5. <u>Mutual Termination.</u> This Contract may be terminated by mutual written agreement of the parties specifying the termination date and the terms for disposition of property and, as necessary, submission of required deliverables and payment therein.
- 10.6 Termination for Default. The State reserves the right to terminate the Contract in whole or in part due to the failure of the Contractor to comply with any material obligation, term or condition of the Contract, to acquire and maintain all required insurance policies, bonds, licenses and permits, or to make satisfactory progress in performing the Contract. In the event the ADHS terminates the Contract in whole or in part as provided in this paragraph, the ADHS may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as deemed appropriate, Services or Materials, similar to those terminated, and Contractor shall be liable to the ADHS for any excess costs incurred by the ADHS in obtaining such similar Services or Materials.
- 10.7. Continuation of Performance Through Termination. Upon receipt of the notice of termination and until the effective date of the notice of termination, the Contractor shall perform work consistent with the requirements of the Contract and, if applicable, in accordance with a written transition plan approved by the ADHS. If the Contract is terminated in part, the Contractor shall continue to perform the Contract to the extent not terminated. After receiving the notice of termination, the Contractor shall immediately notify all subcontractors, in writing, to stop work on the effective date of termination, and on the effective date of termination, the Contractor and subcontractors shall stop all work.
- 10.8. <u>Disposition of Property</u>. Upon termination of this Contract, all property of the State, as defined herein, shall be delivered to the ADHS upon demand.

11. ARBITRATION

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-1518, disputes under this Contract shall be resolved through the use of arbitration when the case or lawsuit is subject to mandatory arbitration pursuant to rules adopted under A.R.S. § 12 -133

12. COMMUNICATION

12.1. <u>Program Report.</u> When reports are required by the Contract, the Contractor shall provide them in the format approved by ADHS.



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12.2 <u>Information and Coordination</u>. The State will provide information to the Contractor pertaining to activities that affect the Contractor's delivery of services, and the Contractor shall be responsible for coordinating their activities with the State's in such a manner as not to conflict or unnecessarily duplicate the State's activities. As the work of the Contractor progresses, advice and information on matters covered by the Contract shall be made available by the Contractor to the State throughout the effective period of the Contract

13. CLIENT GRIEVANCES

If applicable, the Contractor and its subcontractors shall use a procedure through which clients may present grievances about the operation of the program that result in the denial, suspension or reduction of services provided pursuant to this Contract and which is acceptable to and approved by the State.

14. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-621(O), the obtaining of insurance by the State shall not be a waiver of any sovereign immunity defense in the event of suit.

15. ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES

The Procurement Officer, or authorized designee, reserves the right to correct any obvious clerical, typographical or grammatical errors, as well as errors in party contact information (collectively, "Administrative Changes"), prior to or after the final execution of a Contract or Contract Amendment. Administrative Changes subject to permissible corrections include: misspellings, grammar errors, incorrect addresses, incorrect Contract Amendment numbers, pagination and citation errors, mistakes in the labeling of the rate as either extended or unit, and calendar date errors that are illogical due to typographical error. The Procurement Office shall subsequently send to the Contractor notice of corrections to administrative errors in a written confirmation letter with a copy of the corrected Administrative Change attached.

16. SURVIVAL OF TERMS AFTER TERMINATION OR CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT.

All applicable Contract terms shall survive and apply after Contract termination or cancellation to the extent necessary for Contractor to complete and for the ADHS to receive and accept any final deliverables that are due after the date of the termination or cancellation.

17. HEALTH INSURANCE PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 1996 (HIPAA).

- 17.1. The Contractor warrants that it is familiar with the requirements of HIPAA, as amended by the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH Act) of 2009, and accompanying regulations and will comply with all applicable HIPAA requirements in the course of this Contract. Contractor warrants that it will cooperate with the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) in the course of performance of the Contract so that both ADHS and Contractor will be in compliance with HIPAA, including cooperation and coordination with the Arizona Department of Administration-Arizona Strategic Enterprise Technology (ADOA-ASET) Office, the ADOA-ASET Arizona State Chief Information Security Officer and HIPAA Coordinator and other compliance officials required by HIPAA and its regulations. Contractor will sign any documents that are reasonably necessary to keep ADHS and Contractor in compliance with HIPAA, including, but not limited to, business associate agreements.
- 17.2. If requested by the ADHS Procurement Office, Contractor agrees to sign a "Pledge To Protect Confidential Information" and to abide by the statements addressing the creation, use and disclosure of confidential information, including information designated as protected health information and all other confidential or sensitive information as defined in policy. In addition, if requested, Contractor agrees to attend or participate in HIPAA training offered by ADHS or to provide written verification that the Contractor has attended or participated in job related HIPAA training that is: (1) intended to make the Contractor proficient in HIPAA for purposes of performing the services required and (2) presented by a HIPAA Privacy Officer or other person or program knowledgeable and experienced in HIPAA and who has been approved by the ADOA-ASET Arizona State Chief Information Security Officer and HIPAA Coordinator



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18. The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) or

Transparency Act - P.L. 109-282, as amended by Section 6202(A) of P.L. 110-252 (https://www.fsrs.gov)

If applicable, the Contractor shall submit to ADHS via email the Grant Reporting Certification Form. This form and the instructions can be downloaded from the ADHS Procurement website at http://azdhs.gov/procurement and returned to the ADHS by the 15th of the month following that in which the award was received. The form shall be completed electronically, and sent to the following email address: ADHS_Grant@azdhs.gov. All required fields must be filled including Top Employee Compensation, if applicable. Completing the Grant Reporting Certification Form is required for compliance with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), found at http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/open. Failure to timely submit the Grant Reporting Certification Form could result in the loss of funds. This requirement applies to all subcontractors utilized by the Contractor during the term of the Award.

20. AUTHORIZATION FOR PROVISION OF SERVICES

Authorization for purchase of services under this Contract shall be made only upon ADHS issuance of a Purchase Order that is signed by an authorized agent. The Purchase Order will indicate the Contract number and the dollar amount of funds authorized. The Contractor shall only be authorized to perform services up to the amount on the Purchase Order. ADHS shall not have any legal obligation to pay for services in excess of the amount indicated on the Purchase Order. No further obligation for payment shall exist on behalf of ADHS unless a) the Purchase Order is changed or modified with an official ADHS Procurement Change Order, and/or b) an additional Purchase Order is issued for purchase of services under this Contract.

2. OBJECTIVE

Develop plans along with the timetables and necessary activities to fully implement the Contractor's partnership role in response to the CDC capabilities and the programmatic methodology requirements of the Scope of Work

3. SCOPE OF WORK

- Maintain a timeline and a plan to identify personnel to be trained, to receive and distribute critical stockpile items and manage a mass distribution of vaccine and/or antibiotics on a twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week basis;

Background Information

The Public Safety Personnel Retirement System (PSPRS) Local Board consists of 5 members - 1 member is appointed by the Board of Supervisors (BOS) and is represented as the BOS Chairman; 2 citizens are appointed by the BOS; and 2 members are elected by secret ballot by those local members enrolled in the retirement plan.

At present there are two citizen vacancies. One term of office began on January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2019, and the other term of office began on January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2020.

There is also another vacancy for the term of office which began on January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2020. An election by secret ballot of those local members enrolled in the retirement plan must be held to fill this vacancy.

Evaluation

The Human Resources Department provided notification to the Clerk of the Board that Robert Solberg, a citizen, is willing to serve on this governing board for the term of office that will end on December 31, 2020. The BOS needs to appoint Mr. Solberg to the Local Board.

On December 13, 2016, an election was held by members of the PSPRS and who are employed by Gila County. On February 7, 2017, the election results were presented to the PSPRS Local Board and they were certified as being official. Johnny Holmes was re-elected to the Local Board for the 4-year term of office beginning January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2020. His term of office began on February 7, 2017. A copy of the meeting agenda and draft minutes are attached to this agenda item. Mr. Holmes' previous term of office expired on December 31, 2016; therefore, he is being elected to fill a vacancy that occurred prior to his being re-elected for the 4-year term of office that began on January 1, 2017.

Conclusion

Per statutory requirement and if approved by the members of the BOS, the BOS needs to appoint Mr. Solberg to the PSPRS Local Board. In order to have an accurate record of this Local Board on file, the Board should also "acknowledge" the election of Johnny Holmes to the Local Board.

Evaluation

Pleasant Valley Fire District governing board member Karol Clark tendered her resignation notice effective August 16, 2016. 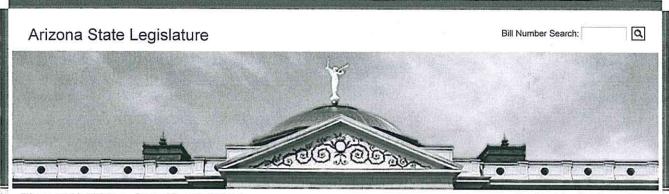

A. At the option of the board of supervisors after presentation of a petition requesting the establishment of a domestic waster improvement district or a domestic wastewater improvement district or a mimprovement district or a mimprovement district or a mimprovement district as prescribed by section 48-903, and subsequent to the approval of the county board of supervisors, the district shall be governed by an elected board of directors. The elected board shall consist of the number of members, not less than three, specified in the petition for establishment of supervisors at the time the district is established. Members of the board of supervisors at the time the district is established. Members of the board of directors shall be qualified electors of the district and, after the members first appointed by the board of supervisors, shall be elected by the qualified electors of the district. B. Immediately after the selection and qualification of the first directors of the board, the directors shall meet and divide themselves by lot into two classes as nearly equal in number as possible. Directors of the first class shall serve for a term of four years, and directors of the second class shall serve for a term of two years. Every director shall continue to discharge the duties of office until a successor is appointed and qualifies. Thereafter, at each regular election, one director for each expired term shall be elected and shall hold office for a term of four years, and until a successor is elected and qualifies. The dates of elections and of expiration of terms shall be specified in the petition for establishment of the district.

C. If a vacancy in the district board of directors of the district shall appoint a qualified elector of the district board of or a term of four years, and until a successor is elected and qualifies. The dates of elections and of propers

F. The board of supervisors shall make an order calling an election to decide whether F. The board of supervisors shall make an order calling an election to decide whether to reorganize a domestic water improvement district that has a board consisting of three members as a domestic water improvement district that has a board consisting of five members when a petition containing the signatures of twenty-five percent of the qualified electors residing within the district and requesting that the district be reorganized is filed with the board except the board of supervisors may not call for a reorganization election to expand the number of directors on the district board more frequently than once every two years. The election may be held on any consolidated election date as prescribed in section 16-204. The domestic water improvement district shall reimburse the county for the expenses of the district election. The board of supervisors shall give notice of the election by posting copies of the order of election in three public places within the district not less than twenty days before the date of the election and if a newspaper is published within the county having a general circulation within the district, the order shall be published in the newspaper not less than once a week during each of the three calendar weeks preceding the calendar week of the election. The ballot for the election shall state "shall the current three-member domestic water improvement district board be reorganized to a five-member board - yes or no". The ballot shall also allow each elector to indicate the elector's choice for two additional board members in the event of reorganization. Within twenty days after the election, the board of supervisors shall meet and canvass the returns, and if it is determined that a majority of the votes cast at the election were in favor of reorganizing the domestic water improvement district as a district with a five-member board, the board shall enter that fact on its minutes, declare the district duly reorganized and announce the names of those elected to the district board.

G. For the purposes of either a domestic water improvement district or a domestic wastewater improvement district that is organized pursuant to this article and that serves at the time of organization a population of ten thousand persons or less, in addition to any other qualified elector of the district, any natural person who is a qualified elector of this state and who is a real property owner within the district is eligible to vote in a district election without regard to that person's residency and shall be deemed a qualified elector of the district for purposes of service on the board of directors.

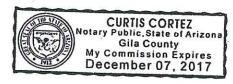

Item 1 - CALL TO ORDER - PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Martin called the regular session to order at 10:00 a.m. this date in the Board of Supervisors' hearing room. John Nelson led the Pledge of Allegiance and Pastor Rich Ritchey of the First Church of the Nazarene in Payson delivered the Invocation.

Item 2 - PRESENTATION:

A. Public recognition of four employees for March's "Spotlight on Employees" Program, as follows: Megan Miller, David Hornung, Brian Dirks and Dennis Newman.

Erica Garcia, Human Resources Assistant Senior, read aloud letters of nomination for the above listed employees. Ms. Miller has been employed with Gila County for 8 years as a Superior Court Clerk, and she was nominated by a member of the public. Sheriff Shepherd wrote 3 separate nomination letters for Sergeant Hornung, who has been employed at Gila County for 13 years; Deputy Dirks, who has been employed at Gila County for 3 years; and Sergeant Newman, who has been employed at Gila County for 14 years. All officers were recognized for their role in search and rescue efforts for a plane crash that occurred in northern Gila County on January 2, 2017. Deputy Dirks mentioned that Tonto Rim Search and Rescue also played a key role in locating the crash site and recovering the bodies, etc. Chairman Martin suggested presenting a certificate of appreciation to that group to which Deputy Dirks

agreed. Each Board member thanked Ms. Miller, Sergeant Hornung, Deputy Dirks and Sergeant Newman.

Item 3 - PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to adopt Ordinance No. 2017-01 amending the Zoning Map for Unincorporated Areas of Gila County for the rezoning of parcel numbers 205-07-020M, 205-07-020N and 205-07-020P from Commercial Three (C3) to Residence One with a D8 Density District (R1-D8) for the purpose of allowing a single family home on each parcel with certain conditions as outlined in the Ordinance.

Robert (Bob) Gould, a temporary Planner for Gila County, presented this agenda item. He advised that these 3 parcels of land are approximately onehalf acre in size. They are being sold for the purpose of allowing a single family home on each parcel. He advised that residential development is not allowed within commercial zoning under Gila County regulations; therefore, an application has been submitted to rezone the subject parcels to residential zoning. Mr. Gould further advised that 20-25 years ago, the Board of Supervisors changed the zoning on a strip of land (approximately 400 feet wide) which runs along the front portion of Highway 188 from residential to commercial zoning. The change in zoning at that time was most likely due to expected commercial development; however, at present, most of the properties in the subject area are used for residential purposes. Mr. Gould recommended that the Board adopt Ordinance No. 2017-01 to rezone the subject properties for residential use. Chairman Martin asked the Board members if they had any questions and Vice-Chairman Humphrey commented that he didn't have any questions other than to recognize that there is non-compatibility of parcels in this area due to mixed uses to which Mr. Gould affirmed. Chairman Martin opened the public hearing. There weren't any comments, so she closed the public hearing and asked for a motion. Upon motion by Supervisor Cline, seconded by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, the Board unanimously adopted Ordinance No. 2017-01. (A copy of the Ordinance is permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office.)

Item 3 - REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021317-1-Timber Region Chip Seal Project.

Steve Sanders, Public Works Division Director, advised that the County's half-cent transportation excise tax will be used to complete the project listed under this agenda item and the following agenda item. He stated that it was decided to advertise two separate invitation for bids for the Timber Region Chip Seal Project and the Copper Region Chip Seal Project (in the following agenda item) due to the cost of materials in each area. If approved, the County will advertise

to select a contractor to chip seal approximately 18 miles of road in the Timber Region, which is in northern Gila County. This project was identified in the County's transportation study. Upon motion Vice-Chairman Humphrey, seconded by Supervisor Cline, the Board unanimously authorized the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021317-1.

B. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021517-Copper Region Chip Seal Project.

Mr. Sanders advised that this project was also identified in the County's transportation study to chip seal approximately 2 miles of road in the Copper Region, which is in southern Gila County. This project will also be funded with the County's half-cent transportation excise tax. Upon motion by Supervisor Cline, seconded by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, the Board unanimously authorized the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021517.

C. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021617-Deer Creek Cul-de-Sac Improvements.

Mr. Sanders stated that this cul-de-sac is in dire need of repairs. Removing the old pavement and replacing it with new pavement and base material is being proposed for the cul-de-sac to provide a repair which will last for several years. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, seconded by Supervisor Cline, the Board unanimously approved the advertisement of Invitation for Bids No. 021617.

D. Information/Discussion/Action to approve the amendment of Policy No. BOS-HRS-006, Section II, Policy, County Manager, #4, and Policy No. BOS-FIN-002, Section II, Policy, Contract Approval, #1, #3, #5, and #6 to authorize the Assistant County Manager to sign Payroll Authorization Forms and contracts of \$50,000 or less per year to prevent an undue delay in the day-to-day business of the County.

John Nelson, County Manager, advised that when the previous County Manager retired from the County, there was confusion whether or not he delegated authority to someone else to sign payroll authorization forms and contracts totaling \$50,000 or less. As a result, policy numbers BOS-HRS-006 and BOS-FIN-002 were revised to allow the Assistant County Manager the authority to sign those related documents in addition to the County Manager. Jeff Dalton, Deputy County Attorney, Civil Bureau Chief, reviewed the revised policies and informed management that only the Board of Supervisors has the authority to change these County policies, which are being presented today for approval. Mr. Nelson asked for the Board's approval. Upon motion by Supervisor Cline, seconded by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, the Board unanimously approved revised policy numbers BOS-HRS-006 and BOS-FIN-002 as presented.

E. Information/Discussion/Action to consider a sealed bid for the purchase of Assessor's tax parcel number 206-21-045B.

Marian Sheppard, Clerk of the Board, advised that the subject property is located at 196 S. Glass Canyon in Miami. The property contains a house that is deteriorated and it has been vandalized. She advised that a sealed bid has been presented which contains a bid that is less than the lien amount of \$4,478. Ms. Sheppard added that the Board adopted a resolution several years ago which states that the Board may waive the requirement to sell the property for no less than the total lien amount if a condition warrants selling a parcel at a lesser price. Chairman Martin asked Ms. Sheppard to open the sealed bid at this time. Ms. Sheppard announced that Kim Marie Ogrin submitted a bid in the amount of \$3,205.60, and she proceeded to read a letter from Ms. Ogrin. Ms. Ogrin's letter states that she is a single mother with two sons and if the Board accepts her offer, she promises to clean up the property and fix the house for habitation by her and her sons. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, seconded by Supervisor Cline, the Board unanimously accepted a bid in the amount of \$3,205.60 from Ms. Ogrin for the purchase of Assessor's tax parcel number 206-21-045B.

F. Information/Discussion/Action regarding a proposed two-year Employment Contract between Gila County and John F. Nelson for the period March 1, 2017, through February 28, 2019.

Chairman Martin stated that this contract is necessary, not only for County Manager John Nelson, but also to attract a new County Manager at such time as Mr. Nelson departs the County and to establish a process for hiring a County Manager. She mentioned that all Arizona counties have executed a contract with the County Manager except for La Paz, Apache, Greenlee, Graham and Gila counties. She advised that other county contracts were reviewed in order to ensure that the proposed contract contains the appropriate language. Mr. Nelson added that the contract provides language that addresses termination for cause and without cause, and it includes a sixmonth severance package for a termination without cause. He pointed out that the proposed contract does not address a requirement for the County Manager to reside in Gila County; however, any new contract with a County Manager will contain that language. Mr. Nelson does live in Gila County.

Supervisor Cline commented that he was not comfortable entering into a contract with the County Manager as it would set a precedent and it is his understanding that previous Gila County Managers did not have a contract. He spoke with Mr. Nelson earlier this morning and has since learned that a contract is a beneficial tool in attracting candidates because it provides some security. He reiterated that he is not in favor of entering into a contract with the County Manager; however, he added that he is pleased with Mr. Nelson's

performance. His focus is more about hiring a future County Manager. Supervisor Cline stated that he wants to do what is best for Gila County. He agreed to consider the proposed contract, but added that he would prefer to have more time to review and discuss it prior to the Board taking a vote.

Vice-Chairman Humphrey advised that he is a general contractor; therefore, he believes that contracts are necessary in doing business as it puts "everyone on the same page." He added that if the contract needs to be changed in the future, it may be amended at any time. He also supports the inclusion of a clause in the contract that will require any future County Manager to reside in Gila County.

Chairman Martin supports entering into a contract with Mr. Nelson, so if it is discovered that revisions need to be made to the contract, they can be made before the next County Manager is hired. She expressed her belief that if the County had offered a contract at the time the County was previously going through the process to hire a County Manager, it would have received far more qualified applicants. She does want to establish a precedent that all County Managers must enter into a contract with the County.

Supervisor Cline added that possibly a contract should be implemented for other County positions. Supervisor Cline stated that even though he had a good conversation earlier this morning with Mr. Nelson, he does have some more questions as the County moves forward.

Chairman Martin advised that the County Manager's salary also needs further review before a new County Manager is hired.

Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, seconded by Supervisor Cline, the Board unanimously approved a two-year Employment Contract between Gila County and John F. Nelson for the period March 1, 2017, through February 28, 2019.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this day of the State of Arizona hereinafter designated the County, and Kino Floors & Interiors, LLC, of the City of Globe, State of Arizona, hereinafter designated the Contractor.

WITNESSETH: The Contractor, for and in consideration of the sum to be paid him by the County, in the manner and at the time hereinafter provided, and of the other covenants and agreement's herein contained, hereby agrees, for himself, his heirs, administrators, successors, and assigns as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – SCOPE OF SERVICES: The Contractor shall provide the services and products listed in the Scope of Work below and shall do so in a good, workmanlike and substantial manner and to the satisfaction of the County under the direction of the **Facilities Management** or designee.

All work performed by the Contractor shall be completed to local codes and regulation per Gila County and the State of Arizona and consistent with all Gila County guidelines.

Scope of Work: Refer to attached Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 020317** by mention made a binding part of this agreement as set forth herein.

Contractor Fee's: Refer to Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 020317** by mention made a binding part of this agreement as set forth herein. To the extent that the terms and conditions of this Service Agreement conflict with the Terms and Conditions of Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 020317**, the terms and conditions of this service agreement will prevail and govern the contractual relationship between the parties.

ARTICLE 2 – TERMINATION: The County reserves the right to terminate the Contract, in whole or in part at any time, when in the best interest of the County, without penalty or recourse. Upon receipt of the written notice, the Contractor shall stop all work as directed in the notice. If the contract is terminated, the County shall be liable only for the services rendered under this contract and accepted material received by the County before the effective date of termination.

ARTICLE 3 - INDEMNIFICATION: Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County of Gila and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee, be indemnified by Contractor from and against any and all claims. It is agreed that Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs where this indemnification is applicable. In consideration of the award of this contract, the Contractor agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers, officials, agents and employees for losses arising from the work performed by the Contractor for the County.

ARTICLE 4 – INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: Contractor and subcontractors shall procure and maintain until all of their obligations have been discharged, including any warranty periods under this Contract are satisfied, insurance against claims for injury to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

The insurance requirements herein are minimum requirements for this Contract and in no way limit the indemnity covenants contained in this Contract. The County in no way warrants that the minimum limits contained herein are sufficient to protect the Contractor from liabilities that might arise out of the performance of the work under this contract by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors and Contractor is free to purchase additional insurance as may be determined necessary.

- ADDITIONAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: The policies shall include, or be endorsed to include, B. the following provisions:
 - 1. On insurance policies where the County of Gila is named as an additional insured, the County of Gila shall be an additional insured to the full limits of liability purchased by the Contractor even if those limits of liability are in excess of those required by this Contract.
 - 2 The Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance and non-contributory with respect to all other available sources.
 - 3. Coverage provided by the Contractor shall not be limited to the liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract.
- C. **NOTICE OF CANCELLATION:** Each insurance policy required by the insurance provisions of this Contract shall provide the required coverage and shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or endorsed to lower limits except after thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the County. - D. **ACCEPTABILITY OF INSURERS:** Insurance is to be placed with insurers duly licensed in the State of Arizona or which hold approved non-admitted status on the Arizona Department of Insurance List of Qualified Unauthorized Insurers and with an "A.M. Best" rating of not less than B+ VI. The County in no way warrants that the above-required minimum insurer rating is sufficient to protect the Contractor from potential insurer insolvency.
- E. **VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE:** Contractor shall furnish the County with certificates of insurance (ACORD form or equivalent approved by the County) as required by this Contract. The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf.

All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. Each insurance policy required by this Contract must be in effect at or prior to commencement of work under this Contract and remain in effect for the duration of the project. Failure to maintain the insurance policies as required by this Contract or to provide evidence of renewal is a material breach of contract.

All certificates required by this Contract shall be sent directly to **Gila County Purchasing Department**, **1400** E. **Ash St.**, **Globe**, **AZ**, **85501** or email to bhurst@gilacountyaz.gov. The County project/contract number and project description shall be noted on the certificate of insurance. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all insurance policies required by this Contract at any time.

- F. <u>SUBCONTRACTORS:</u> Contractors' certificate(s) shall include all subcontractors as additional insured's under its policies **or** Contractor shall furnish to the County separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverage's for subcontractors shall be subject to the minimum requirements identified above.
- G. <u>APPROVAL:</u> Any modification or variation from the insurance requirements in this Contract shall be made by the County Attorney, whose decision shall be final. Such action will not require a formal Contract amendment, but may be made by administrative action.

ARTICLE 5 – LEGAL ARIZONA WORKERS ACT COMPLIANCE: Contractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this Contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Contractor's employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). Contractor shall further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work for Contractor under this contract likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws. County shall have the right at any time to inspect the books and records of Contractor and any subcontractor in order to verify such party's compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

Any breach of Contractor's or any subcontractor's warranty of compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws, or of any other provision of this section, shall be deemed to be a material breach of this Contract subjecting Contractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this Contract. If the breach is by a subcontractor, and the subcontract is suspended or terminated as a result, Contractor shall be required to take such steps as may be necessary to either self-perform the services that would have been provided under the subcontract or retain a replacement subcontractor as soon as possible so as not to delay project completion.

Contractor shall advise each subcontractor of County's rights, and the subcontractor's obligations, under this Article by including a provision in each subcontract substantially in the following form: "Subcontractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Subcontractor's employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A). Subcontractor further agrees that County may inspect the Subcontractor's books and records to insure that Subcontractor is in compliance with these requirements. Any breach of this paragraph by Subcontractor will be deemed to be a material breach of this contract subjecting Subcontractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this contract."

Any additional costs attributable directly or indirectly to remedial action under this Article shall be the responsibility of Contractor. In the event that remedial action under this Article results in delay to one or more tasks on the critical path of Contractor's approved construction or critical milestones schedule, such period of delay shall be deemed excusable delay for which Contractor shall be entitled to an extension of time, but not costs.

ARTICLE 1 – SCOPE OF SERVICES: The Contractor shall provide the services and products listed in the Scope of Work below and shall do so in a good, workmanlike and substantial manner and to the satisfaction of the County under the direction of the **Public Works Administration** or designee.

All work performed by the Contractor shall be completed to local codes and regulation per Gila County and the State of Arizona and consistent with all Gila County guidelines.

Scope of Work: Refer to attached Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 021317** by mention made a binding part of this agreement as set forth herein.

Contractor Fee's: Refer to Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 021317** by mention made a binding part of this agreement as set forth herein. To the extent that the terms and conditions of this Service Agreement conflict with the Terms and Conditions of Attachment "A" to **Service Agreement 021317**, the terms and conditions of this service agreement will prevail and govern the contractual relationship between the parties.

ARTICLE 2 – TERMINATION: The County reserves the right to terminate the Contract, in whole or in part at any time, when in the best interest of the County, without penalty or recourse. Upon receipt of the written notice, the Contractor shall stop all work as directed in the notice. Any additional costs attributable directly or indirectly to remedial action under this Article shall be the responsibility of Contractor. In the event that remedial action under this Article results in delay to one or more tasks on the critical path of Contractor's approved construction or critical milestones schedule, such period of delay shall be deemed excusable delay for which Contractor shall be entitled to an extension of time, but not costs.

ARTICLE 6 – ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION: Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not, for the duration of this agreement, engage in a boycott of Israel as defined by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by County up to and including termination of this agreement.

ARTICLE 7 - WARRANTY: Contractor expressly warrants that all goods or services furnished under this agreement shall conform to all specifications and appropriate standards, will be new, and will be free from defects in material or workmanship. Contractor warrants that all such goods or services will conform to any statements made on the containers or labels or advertisements for such goods, or services, and that any goods will be adequately contained, packaged, marked and labeled. Contractor warrants that all goods or services furnished hereunder will be merchantable, and will be safe and appropriate for the purpose for which goods or services of that kind are normally used. If Contractor knows or has reason to know the particular purpose for which County intends to use the goods or services, Contractor warrants that such goods or services will be fit for such particular purpose. Contractor warrants that goods or services furnished will conform in all respects to samples. Inspection, test, acceptance of use of the goods or services furnished hereunder shall not affect the Contractor's obligation under this warranty, and such warranties shall survive inspection, test, acceptance and use. Contractor's warranty shall run to County, its successors, and assigns. Contractor agrees to replace or correct, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, defects of any goods or services not conforming to the foregoing warranty, or improperly installed, as well as guarantee to the County and to the Owner, against liability, losses or damage to any or all parts of the work arising from said installation during a period of two (2) years from date of completion. All guarantees will inure to the benefit of the County and the Owner, their successors or assigns, including equipment warranties, ordinary wear and tear and unusual abuse or neglect excepted.

In the event of failure of Contractor to correct defects in or replace nonconforming goods or services promptly, County, after reasonable notice to Contractor, may make such corrections or replace such goods and services and charge Contractor for the cost incurred by the County in doing so. Contractor recognizes that County's requirements may require immediate repairs in reworking of defective goods, without notice to the Contractor. In such event, Contractor shall reimburse County for those costs, delays, or other damages which County has incurred.

ARTICLE 8 – LAWS AND ORDINANCES: This agreement shall be enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona. The County shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience, to circumvent the requirements of this contract, or to enable the County to contract with another Contractor for the same supplies or services covered under this Addendum.

PUBLIC WORKS

WITNESSETH: The Contractor, for and in consideration of the sum to be paid him by the County, in the manner and at the time hereinafter provided, and of the other covenants and agreement's herein contained, hereby agrees, for himself, his heirs, administrators, successors, and assigns as follows:

Contractor warrants that all goods or services furnished hereunder will be merchantable, and will be safe and appropriate for the purpose for which goods or services of that kind are normally used. If Contractor knows or has reason to know the particular purpose for which County intends to use the goods or services, Contractor warrants that such goods or services will be fit for such particular purpose. Contractor warrants that goods or services furnished will conform in all respects to samples. Inspection, test, acceptance of use of the goods or services furnished hereunder shall not affect the Contractor's obligation under this warranty, and such warranties shall survive inspection, test, acceptance and use. Contractor's warranty shall run to County, its successors, and assigns. Contractor agrees to replace or correct, at Contractor's sole cost and expense. defects of any goods or services not conforming to the foregoing warranty, or improperly installed, as well as guarantee to the County and to the Owner, against liability, losses or damage to any or all parts of the work arising from said installation during a period of two (2) years from date of completion. All guarantees will inure to the benefit of the County and the Owner, their successors or assigns, including equipment warranties, ordinary wear and tear and unusual abuse or neglect excepted.

In the event of failure of Contractor to correct defects in or replace nonconforming goods or services promptly, County, after reasonable notice to Contractor, may make such corrections or replace such goods and services and charge Contractor for the cost incurred by the County in doing so. Contractor recognizes that County's requirements may require immediate repairs in reworking of defective goods, without notice to the Contractor. In such event, Contractor shall reimburse County for those costs, delays, or other damages which County has incurred.

ARTICLE 8 – LAWS AND ORDINANCES: This agreement shall be enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona. Contractor shall maintain in current status all Federal, State and Local licenses and permits required for the operation of the business conducted by the Contractor. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and applicable federal regulations under the Act.

ARTICLE 9 – CANCELLATION: This agreement is subject to cancellation pursuant to A.R.S. §38-511. If the Agreement is terminated, the county shall be liable only for payment for services rendered and accepted material received by the County before the effective date of termination.

ARTICLE 10 – RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES: Contractor is an independent contractor of the County. Contractor represents that he has or will secure, at his own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this contract. Such personnel shall not be employees of or have any contractual relationship with the County. All personnel engaged in work under this contract shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under State and local law to perform such services. Contractor warrants that he has obtained or will obtain Worker's Compensation Insurance for his employees working on this contract and that any subcontractors will likewise obtain Worker's Compensation Insurance for of their employees working on this contract. It is further agreed by Contractor that he shall obey all state and federal statutes, rules, and regulations which are applicable to provisions of the services called for herein. Neither Contractor nor any employee of the Contractor shall be deemed an officer, employee, or agent of the County.

ARTICLE 11 – NON-APPROPRIATIONS CLAUSE: Contractor acknowledges that the County is a governmental entity, and the contract validity is based upon the availability of public funding under its authority. In the event that public funds are unavailable and not appropriated for the performance of County's obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically expire without penalty to County after written notice to Contractor of the unavailability and non-appropriation of public funds.

It is expressly agreed that the County shall only activate this non-appropriation provision as an emergency fiscal measure. The County shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience, to circumvent the requirements of this contract, or to enable the County to contract with another Contractor for the same supplies or services covered under this Addendum.

ARTICLE 12– ENTIRE CONTRACT CLAUSE: The Contractor and the County have read this Contract and agree to be bound by all of its terms, and further agree that it constitutes the entire contract between the two parties and may only be modified by a written mutual contract signed by the parties. No oral agreement or oral provision outside this Contract shall have any force or effect.

AGREEMENT FOR LABORATORY SERVICES

February 14, 2017

Agreement for Laboratory services between **Gila County Health Department**, located at 1515 S. Apache Ave, Suite 100, Globe, AZ 85501 and **Center for Disease Detection** (CDD) located at 11603 Crosswinds Way, Suite 100, San Antonio, TX 78233.

This agreement is effective from February 1, 2017 until January 31, 2018. The agreement may be renewed by mutual agreement of both parties for two (2) additional one (1) year terms.

CDD will provide the following:

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

All collection devices, shipping boxes, postage paid shipping envelopes, and testing are included in the per test price. All supplies will be tracked by our computer and automatically shipped to keep your inventory well stocked.

RESULTS

Your results summary report and hard copies will be reported out to you by 12:00 pm central time the same business day your specimens are received in our laboratory. Repeat testing, confirmations and additional testing not performed by CDD may take an additional day or so. Cultures, Cytopathology and Histopathology test results will be reported to your clinics in 3-5 business days.

When results become available, an e-mail message will be sent notifying you that you have results available. This e-mail message will direct you to a secured access web site where you can download, view and print your results. These will be the *official* results. As a courtesy we can also send electronic results in an HL7 format to be uploaded into an electronic medical record system. For compliance with CLIA, CAP and other accrediting organizations we will continue to send both sets of results until you provide us with validation screen shots that the hard copy results correlate with the HL7 results and instruct us to discontinue the hard copy results.

AFTIS

TRAINING

BILLING

CYTOLOGY/HISTOLOGY

Contractor understands that acceptance of the terms and conditions contained in this Addendum are a condition precedent to entering into a contractual relationship with Gila County.
- B. Contract Defined: As used in this Addendum, the term "Contract" shall refer to any written agreement between Gila County and a person, organization, corporation, company or other entity that provides supplies or services to Gila County regardless of the title or other name applied to that written agreement. The term includes by this reference all the terms and conditions of this Addendum.
- C. Contractor Defined: As used in this Addendum, the term "Contractor" shall refer to a person, provider, organization, corporation, company or other entity providing supplies or services to Gila County pursuant to a written agreement regardless of the title or other name applied to "Contractor" in that written agreement.
- D. Relationship of the Parties: Contractor is an independent contractor of the County. Contractor represents that he has or will secure, at his own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this contract. Such personnel shall not be employees of or have any contractual relationship with the County. All personnel engaged in work under this contract shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under State and local law to perform such services. Contractor warrants that he has obtained or will obtain Worker's Compensation Insurance for his employees working on this contract and that any subcontractors will likewise obtain Worker's Compensation Insurance for of their employees working on this contract. It is further agreed by Contractor that he shall obey all state and federal statutes, rules, and regulations which are applicable to provisions of the services called for herein. Neither Contractor nor any employee of the Contractor shall be deemed an officer, employee, or agent of the County.
- E. Non-Appropriations Clause: Contractor acknowledges that the County is a governmental entity, and the contract validity is based upon the availability of public funding under its authority. In the event that public funds are unavailable and not appropriated for the performance of County's obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically expire without penalty to County after written notice to Contractor of the unavailability and non-appropriation of public funds. The County shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience, to circumvent the requirements of this contract, or to enable the County to contract with another Contractor for the same supplies or services covered under this Addendum.
- F. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such Contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee, be indemnified by Contractor from and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs where this indemnification is applicable. In consideration of the award of this contract, the Contractor agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers, officials, agents and employees for losses arising from the work performed by the Contractor for the County.

- M. Legal Arizona Workers Act Compliance: Contractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this Contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Contractor's employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. §§ 41-4401 and 23-214(A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws").
