Background Information

Snow storms began in Gila County in February 2019, which had created an emergency situation where many citizens had been stranded in their homes denying them access to food and medical assistance. The snow storms endangered citizens' lives and well-being, and had the potential to damage homes and property.

On February 20, 2019, the Gila County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 19-02-01 issuing a Declaration of Emergency due to February 2019 snow storms in Gila County. The dangers which created the emergency, including post snow flooding, have now returned to normal. Post emergency meetings to review Gila County's response and possible reimbursement for emergency costs have been held, and Emergency Management is supportive of ending the Declaration.

Evaluation

A.R.S. §26-311 outlines the requirements for the Board of Supervisors to declare an emergency. Since there is no longer an emergency that exists in Gila County, the next step is to conclude the Declaration of Emergency that was issued on February 20, 2019, and repeal Resolution No. 19-02-01.

Conclusion

By the Board of Supervisors adopting Resolution No. 19-05-05, it will conclude the Declaration of Emergency that was issued by the Board on February 20, 2019, and repeal Resolution No. 19-02-01. This Board action will allow Gila County Emergency Management to close out the reporting and efforts from the recent snow storms and work towards completion of the after action report and any possible financial reimbursements related to the emergency.

Recommendation

It is the recommendation of the Gila County Health and Emergency Management Department Director that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No. 19-05-05.

Adoption of Resolution No. 19-05-02 regarding support of improvements on the Lions Springs portion of Highway 260

Background Information

Gila County staff was recently informed that the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) staff has once again recommended removing funding for improvements on Highway 260 in the area of Lion Springs in Gila County from its current Five-Year Program. Such recommendation would perpetuate a bottleneck (i.e., an undivided two lane roadway surrounded on both sides by a four lane divided highway) in the corridor between Phoenix and the top of the Mogollon Rim.

Evaluation

The Lion Springs portion of Highway 260 has been slated for construction and then postponed, and then removed, and then reinstated several times since 2001. In May 2016, the Board of Supervisors adopted a similar resolution in response to an earlier removal of this project from the 2016 Five-Year Plan. At that time, the ADOT governing board reinstated this project into their plan, and it has been included every year, although it has been continually pushed to future years. At the April 2019, ADOT Board meeting, Gila County staff spoke and delivered letters from the Gila County Sheriff's Office and the Tonto National Forest requesting that this project be reinstated to ADOT's Five-Year Plan, and that ADOT commit to actual completion of this portion of highway. Representatives from the Hellsgate Fire District, Town of Payson and Town of Star Valley, and a local resident also spoke on this issue.

Conclusion

If adopted, this resolution will be hand-delivered at the next ADOT Board hearing on May 17, 2019, in Phoenix, AZ. The Town of Payson is planning to submit a similar resolution, and County management has requested that Navajo and Apache Counties consider adoptiong resolutions on this matter.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors consider adopting Resolution No. 19-05-02.

RESOLUTION NO. 19-05-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF GILA COUNTY, ARIZONA, SUPPORTING COMPLETION OF THE IMPROVEMENTS TO HIGHWAY 260 IN THE AREA OF LION SPRINGS IN GILA COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) staff has recommended removing funding for improvements on Highway 260 in the area of Lion Springs in Gila County from its current Five-Year Program; and,

WHEREAS, such recommendation, if approved, would effectively perpetuate a bottleneck (i.e., an undivided two-lane roadway surrounded on both sides by a four-lane divided highway) in the corridor between Phoenix and the top of the Mogollon Rim; and,

WHEREAS, completing the four-lane divided highway in the area of Lion Springs, in addition to removing this last remaining bottleneck, would provide the following benefits:

- A. *Improved safety to motorists*. Because of the speeds involved and the narrowness of the roadway in the area of Lion Springs, frequent collisions have occurred resulting in serious injury and, at times, death.
- B. *Improved visitor access*. Highway 260, east of Payson and Star Valley, is the gateway to numerous high use recreation areas in the Tonto National Forest and the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest, as well as northeastern Arizona communities such as Heber, Snowflake, Show Low and Pinetop-Lakeside. Residents from all over Arizona and visitors from around the United States enjoy these recreation areas. During the summer months, and especially holiday weekends, this unfinished section of Highway 260 is more reminiscent of an urban freeway during rush hours (i.e., bumper to bumper traffic) than a highway through the beautiful pines of northern Arizona.
- C. *Improved environmental benefits*. During summer months and especially during holiday weekends, traffic in this area can come to a standstill. The exhaust from thousands of cars significantly impacts the pristine mountain air.
- D. *Improved quality of life*. The traffic backlogs caused by the bottleneck affect the main thoroughfares of both Payson and Star Valley creating traffic nightmares for the residents of these communities and resulting in decreased sales for the local businesses.

- E. *Protection of watershed and wildlife habitats*. The current two-lane roadway allows for almost unlimited egress from the roadway resulting in motor vehicle damage to the watershed and wildlife habitats. Improvements to this section of Highway 260 will have the positive impact of reducing the creation of unauthorized roads/trails into the forest protecting both the watershed and wildlife habitats.
- F. *Reduced erosion*. The improvements to Highway 260 and the plans for the Lion Springs segment incorporate modern erosion control features. Such improved erosion control features need to be completed in coordination with this remaining segment.
- G. Reduced wildlife, vehicular collisions. This area of Highway 260 has a high density of elk population and the combination of high elk density and a narrow two-lane roadway creates dangerous elk/vehicle collisions often resulting in the death of the elk and or motorist.
- H. *Protection against and increased ability to suppress forest fires.* This project would facilitate and improve the U.S. Forest Services' access to the forest, allowing for continued resource protection and fire protection/suppression as is necessary.
- I. Reduce unfunded local emergency service costs. As a result of the numerous vehicular collisions with injuries on this section of undivided roadway, the first responders to these collisions may be the volunteer fire departments in the vicinity, but often both the Payson Fire Department and the Hellsgate Fire District are dispatched. The costs associated with maintaining the extra personnel and equipment to respond to these accidents is borne by the local tax base, and the cost of responding to the incidents is often borne by the local residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1: The Gila County Board of Supervisors hereby supports the completion of the improvements to Highway 260 in the area of Lion Springs and strenuously objects to its removal from ADOT's current Five-Year Program; and

Section 2: The Gila County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes its appropriate officers and officials to take all further actions as may be necessary or appropriate to express its support for completing the improvements.

Background Information

This road is known and has been known as Verde Glen Road, Forest Road 1190, and Forest Service Road 199. The road accesses an area north of Payson known as Verde Glen. On April 3, 2018 the Board adopted Resolution No. 18-04-03. The resolution accepted a grant of roadway easement from the Caron and Buzan families and established the road as a Primitive Road. The Grantors now wish to quit claim the roadway easement to the County. County staff supports the request and a QCD has been prepared for the Board's consideration.

Evaluation

Accepting this QCD for roadway purposes will allow continued public access to this road. The road meets the requirements of a primitive road. It was opened prior to June 13, 1990 and was not constructed in accordance with county standards. The Primitive Road designation will remain.

Conclusion

Accepting a QCD for this road will ensure that it remains open to public travel.

Recommendation

The Gila County Public Works Director and the County Engineer recommend that the Board adopt Resolution No. 19-05-01 accepting a QCD for that roadway shown on Record of Survey Map No. 855 and confirming the road as a Primitive Road.





Once the easements are accepted by the County, providing maintenance as described in the Primitive Road Policy will consist of grading the road a few times a year. Providing maintenance on this road will not reduce the level of service to other roads in the Gila County Maintained Roadway System.

Recommendation

The Public Works Department Director recommends that the Board accept the citizens' petition to begin the process to establish a portion of Six Shooter Canyon Road from the south boundary line of HES #110 to the west boundary line of HES #158 as a Primitive Road.



Background Information

On November 20, 2018, the Board approved the new Procurement Policy (No. BOS-FIN-113)Section 8-Source Selection and Contract Formation Professional Services of the policy identifies the type of professional services; however, it did not address the process to solicit and procure the services. Staff has revised Section A of the policy identifying the statutory reference and Subsection F- professional service types; and the process by which the County will solicit and procure certain professional services. The remainder of the policy remains the same.

Evaluation

Deputy County Attorney Chuck Shire provided statutory information and support crafting the revision of Section 8, Subsections (A) and (F) of Policy No. BOS-FIN-113-*Procurement* and the policy review team has approved the changes.

Conclusion

Revised Policy No. BOS-FIN-113-*Procurement* reflects changes to Section 8-Source Selection and Contract Formation Professional Services, Subsections (A) and (F). The revisions to the policy provide statutory guidance, define professional services and provide the process in which to solicit and contract for professional services.

Recommendation

Staff recommends Board approval of the revisions made to Policy No. BOS-FIN-113-*Procurement*.

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1. LEGAL AUTHORITY

The Gila County Board of Supervisors (the "Board") in accordance with A.R.S. § 254.01 C adopts this Procurement Policy (the "Procurement Policy") in compliance with the uniform accounting system prescribed by the auditor general under A.R.S § 41-1279.21.

2. PURPOSE

- A. This Procurement Policy provides for a uniform system of control to enhance accountability and transparency and increase public confidence in Gila County (the "County") procurement. The Procurement Policy identifies procedures for the acquisition of supplies and services, including construction, research and development, architect-engineer and commercial items. This Procurement Policy applies to expenditure of public funds irrespective of funding source, including state and federal assistance monies. The County shall comply with terms and conditions of any grant, gift, bequest, cooperative agreement, or federal or state guideline. In those cases where this Procurement Policy does not address a procurement situation, the Arizona State Procurement Code found in Title 41, Chapter 23 of the Arizona Revised Statutes will be followed.
- B. This is a general guide to the supplier selection techniques and level of competition required for procurement by the County in compliance with the Arizona Revised Statues and are generally based upon the dollar value (threshold) of the estimated or projected dollar amount of the entire procurement.

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3. SUPPLEMENTARY GENERAL PRINCIPLES OF LAW APPLICABLE

A. Unless expressly provided otherwise by a particular provision of this Procurement Policy, the principles of law and equity, including the Uniform Commercial Code as adopted by the State of Arizona, the common law of contracts as applied in the state of Arizona and law relative to agency, fraud, misrepresentation, duress, coercion and mistake or other applicable laws supplement the provisions of this Procurement Policy.

4. REQUIREMENT OF GOOD FAITH

A. This Procurement Policy and the Uniform Commercial Code adopted by the State of Arizona requires all parties involved in the negotiation, performance, or administration of County contracts to act with utmost good faith.

5. PROCUREMENT ETHICS

A. It is the policy of the County to promote the County's reputation for courtesy, fairness, impartiality, integrity, service economy, and government by law. The responsibility for implementing this Procurement Policy rests with each individual who participates in the procurement process, including the using department, suppliers, and procurement staff.

1. Employee Ethics

- a. No County employee, having official responsibility for a procurement transaction, shall represent the County in that transaction when the employee is contemporaneously employed by a bidder, offeror or contractor involved in the procurement transaction.
- b. The employee, or any member of the employee's immediate family holds a position with a bidder, offeror or contractor such as an officer. director, trustee or partner, has a personal and substantial participation in the transaction, or owns or controls more than five (5%) of the firm.
- c. The employee, or any member of the employee's immediate family has a pecuniary interest arising from the transaction.
- d. The employee or any member of the employee's immediate family is negotiating, or has an arrangement concerning prospective employment with a bidder, offeror or contractor.
- e. No employee having official responsibility for a procurement transaction shall solicit, demand, accept, or agree to accept any payment, loan,

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subscription, advance deposit of money, services, entertainment, gift or anything of more than a nominal value from any bidder, offeror, contractor or subcontractor.

2. Vendor Ethics

- a. No bidder, offeror, contractor or subcontractor shall confer upon any public employee having official responsibility for a procurement transaction any payment, loan, subscription, advance deposit of money, services or anything of more than nominal value, present or promised.
- b. No bidder, offeror, contractor or subcontractor shall give, demand or receive from any supplier, subcontractor, or competitor any bribe, kickback, or anything of value in return for participation in a procurement transaction or agreeing not to compete in a transaction.
- c. Reporting of Anticompetitive Practices. If for any reason collusion or other anticompetitive practices are suspected among any bidders or offerors, a notice of the relevant facts shall be transmitted to the Procurement Officer and the County Attorney. This section does not require a law enforcement agency to investigate such practices to convey such notice to the Procurement Officer.

6. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- A. Confidential information shall be designated as follows:
 - 1. If a person or legal entity (the "Disclosing Party") asserts that a bid, proposal, offer, specification, or protest contains trade secret or other proprietary information (the" Confidential Information") should be held in confidence by the County, the Disclosing Party shall include a statement with the submission supporting the assertion and advising the Procurement Officer or his/her designee of this fact. In addition, the Disclosing Party shall clearly mark any Confidential Information disclosed as "Confidential" wherever it appears. In no event shall contract terms and conditions, pricing, and information generally available to the public be considered Confidential Information.
 - 2. The Confidential Information identified by the Disclosing Party as Confidential may not be disclosed until the Procurement Officer or designee makes a written determination.
 - 3. The Procurement Officer or designee shall review the statement and the Confidential Information and determine in writing whether the Confidential

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Information shall be retained by the County and treated as Confidential Information or returned to the Disclosing Party. In making the determination, the Procurement Officer or designee may consult with the County Attorney. In-either case, the Procurement Officer or designee shall inform the Disclosing Party in writing of such determination. Determinations are retained by the Procurement Group.

- 4. If the Confidential Information is retained by the County, the County shall use reasonable efforts to maintain the secrecy of the Confidential Information and disclose such Confidential Information only to County employees with a need to know for the purposes of evaluating the bid, proposal, offer, specification or protest of the Disclosing Party.
- 5. At the conclusion of the process (bid, protest or otherwise) for which the Confidential Information was disclosed the Confidential Information shall be returned to Disclosing Party or destroyed at the discretion of the Procurement Officer or designee.

7. AUTHORITY OF THE FINANCE DIRECTOR

- A. The Finance Director shall serve as the Procurement Officer for the County and shall be responsible for the following:
 - The purchase, renting, leasing or otherwise acquiring of all materials, services and construction, including all functions that pertain to the obtaining of any material, service or construction, including description of requirements, selection and solicitation of sources, preparation and award of contract, and all phases of contract administration.
 - 2. Establishment of policies and procedures for the management of all inventories of materials.
 - 3. The sale, trade, or disposal of surplus materials belonging to the County in in compliance with A.R.S. §11-251(9).
 - 4. Establish and maintain programs for the inspection, testing and acceptance of materials, services and construction.
 - 5. Supervise the County Procurement Group (the "Procurement Group") consisting of employees within the County that generally performs the following functions:

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- Research and request bid proposals and maintain vendor relationships to facilitate the preparation of all contractual agreements on behalf of the County;
- b. Work with and supports all elected offices and departments within the County;
- c. Operate as the point through which all County contracts will be processed to ensure proper administrative review prior to being submitted to the Procurement Officer, County Attorney's Office, County Manager or Board for approval.
- d, Maintenance of a central file for all County contracts under an indexing system that will provide positive identification of all documents and facilitate document retrieval.
- 6. Delegate procurement authority to designees within the Procurement Group or other County governmental departments as may be required at the discretion of the Procurement Officer, provided that the delegation or any modification of authority shall be in writing and shall specify:
 - a. The scope and type of authority delegated or modified;
 - b. Any limits or restrictions on the exercise of the delegated authority; and
 - c. The duration of the delegation.

8. SOURCE SELECTION & CONTRACT FORMATION

A. In accordance with A.R.S. § 11-254.01 A, except as otherwise provided hereafter in paragraph C. (Sole Source Procurement); paragraph D. (Emergency Procurements); paragraph E. (Other Non-Procurement Contracts); and paragraph F. (Professional Services), all purchases of supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services, except professional services, made by the County having an estimated cost of more than fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars per transaction shall be based on sealed, competitive bids.

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B. Competitive Sealed Bidding or Competitive Sealed Proposals

- Invitation for Bids or Proposals. An Invitation for Bids shall be issued and shall include specifications, any applicable evaluation criteria, and all contractual terms and conditions specifically applicable to the procurement. Standard contractual terms and conditions may be included within the solicitation document or incorporated by reference.
- 2. Public Notice. Adequate public notice of the Invitation for Bids shall be given not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date set forth therein for the opening of bids. A shorter time may be deemed necessary for a procurement as determined in writing by the Procurement Group. The public notice shall state the place, date, and time of bid opening. Notice of the Invitation for Bids shall be posted on the County website, and a copy of the invitation for bids shall be available for public inspection.
- 3. Late Bids. A bid is late if it is received at the location designated in the Invitation for Bids after the time and date set for bid opening. The Procurement Group shall designate the governing clock. A late bid shall be rejected. A late bid shall not be opened except for, if necessary, identification purposes. Such bids shall be returned to the bidder. Bidders submitting bids that are rejected as late shall be so notified.
- 4. Bid Opening. Bids shall be opened publicly in the presence of one or more witnesses at the time and place designated in the Invitation for Bids. The amount of each bid and such other relevant information as the Procurement Officer deems appropriate, together with the name of each bidder, shall be recorded. In the event no attendees are present for bid opening, the sealed bids shall be opened by the Procurement Group and a "bid" or "no bid" may be recorded on the tabulation sheet. The bid may then be given to the appropriate person for recording. The attendance sheets shall indicate that there were no attendees present. Bids shall not be open for public inspection until after a contract is awarded. After contract award, the bids shall be available for public inspection, except to the extent that the withholding of information is permitted or required by law.
- 5. Bid Acceptance and Bid Evaluation. Bids shall be unconditionally accepted without alteration or correction, except as authorized in this Procurement Policy. Bids shall be evaluated based on the requirements set forth in the Invitations for Bids, which may include criteria to determine acceptability such as inspection, testing, quality, workmanship, delivery and suitability for a particular purpose. The Invitation for Bids shall set forth the evaluation

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criteria to be used. No criteria may be used in bid evaluation that is not set forth in the Invitation for Bids.

- 6. Discussion with Offerors. Discussions may be conducted with responsible offerors.
- 7. Negotiations with Responsible Offerors and Revisions to Proposals. Negotiations may be conducted with responsible offerors. Offerors shall be accorded fair and equal treatment in conducting negotiations and there shall be no disclosure of any information derived from proposals submitted by competing offerors.
 - a. Concurrent Negotiations. Negotiations may be conducted concurrently with responsible offerors for the purpose of determining source selection and/or contract award.
- 8. Exclusive Negotiations. Exclusive negotiations may be conducted with the responsible offeror whose proposal is determined in the selection process to be most advantageous to the County. Exclusive negotiations may be conducted subsequent to concurrent negotiations or may be conducted without requiring previous concurrent negotiations. Exclusive negotiations shall not constitute a contract award, nor shall it confer any property rights to the successful offeror. If exclusive negotiations are conducted and an agreement is not reached, the County may enter exclusive negotiations with the next highest ranked offeror without the need to repeat the formal solicitation process.
- 9. Evaluation of Proposals
 - a. Selection Committee. The Procurement Officer or designee shall appoint a selection committee to evaluate the proposals and make a recommendation based on the criteria set forth in the request for proposals. No other factors or criteria may be used in the evaluation.
- 10. Correction or Withdrawal of Bids; Cancellation of Awards. Correction or withdrawal of inadvertently erroneous bids before or after bid opening, or cancellation of awards or contracts based on such bid mistakes, may be permitted where appropriate. Mistakes discovered before bid opening may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received in the Procurement Group prior to the time set for bid opening. After bid opening, corrections in bids shall be permitted only to the extent that the bidder can show by clear and convincing evidence that a mistake of a nonjudgmental character was made, the nature of the mistake, and the bid price actually intended.

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After bid opening, no changes in bid prices or other provisions of bids prejudicial to the interests of the County or fair competition shall be permitted. In lieu of bid correction, a low bidder alleging a material mistake of fact may be permitted to withdraw its bid if:

- a. The mistake is clearly evident on the face of the bid document, but the intended correct bid is not similarly evident; or
- b. The bidder submits evidence that clearly and convincingly demonstrates that a mistake was made. All decisions to permit the correction or withdrawal of bids, or to cancel awards or contracts based on bid mistakes, shall be supported by a written determination made by the Procurement Officer.

11. Contract Awards

- a. Contract awards shall be made by the County Manager or designee for those contracts under \$50,000.00, or if above \$50,000.00 by the Board, to the responsible offeror whose proposal is determined in writing to be the most advantageous to the County taking into consideration price and the other evaluation criteria set forth in the request for proposals.
- b. The contract file shall contain the basis on which the award is made.
- c. Contracts that are awarded with Federal grant funding shall require a search for debarment prior to contract award. The search shall be conducted on the System for Award Management, https://sam.gov/portal/SAM/#1#1.
- d. General. The contract shall be awarded by appropriate notice to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder whose bid conforms in all material respects to the requirements and criteria set forth in the Invitation for Bids.
- e. Contract Award Based on Best Value. The contract may be awarded on best value analysis provided that the criteria for analysis were included in the Invitation for Bids. The contract shall be awarded by appropriate written notice to the response bidder determined to be the best value to the County and whose bid conforms in all material respects to requirements and criteria set forth in the Invitation for Bids.

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- f. Exceeding Available Funds. In the event the low responsive and responsible bid for a construction project exceeds available funds and such bid does not exceed such funds by more than five (5%) percent, the Procurement Officer or designee is authorized, when time or economic considerations preclude re-solicitation of work of a reduced scope, to negotiate an adjustment of the bid price with the low responsive and responsible bidder, in order to bring the bid within the amount of available funds.
- g. Public Record. After the County approves a contract execution, the bids shall be available for public inspection.
- h. Low Tie Bids. If there are two or more low responsive bids from responsible bidders that are identical in price and that meet all of the requirements and criteria set forth in the Invitation for Bids, award may be made by random selection in a manner prescribed by the Procurement Officer.
- Each month a report will be compiled by the Finance Department for contracts signed by the County Manager under \$50,000.00 and presented to the Board on the consent agenda in the following month regularly scheduled Board meeting.
- C. Sole Source Procurement. A contract may be awarded without competition when the Procurement Officer determines in writing, after conducting a good faith review of available sources, that there is only one source for the required material, service or construction item. The requesting department shall provide written evidence to support a sole source determination. The Procurement Officer may require that negotiations are conducted as to price, delivery and terms. The Procurement Officer may require the submission of cost or pricing data in connection with an award under this section. Sole source procurement shall be avoided, except when no reasonable alternative sources exist.
- D. Emergency Procurements. The Procurement Officer may make or authorize others to make emergency procurements of materials, services or construction items when there exists a threat to public health, welfare, property or safety or if a situation exists which makes compliance contrary to the public interest; provided that such emergency procurements shall be made with such competition as is practicable under the circumstances. An emergency procurement shall be limited to those materials, services or construction necessary to satisfy the emergency need. A written determination of the basis for the emergency and for the selection of the particular contractor shall be included in the contract file.

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- E. Other Non-Procurement Contracts. The County may enter into other types of contractual arrangements which do not involve the acquisition of materials, services, equipment or construction. The County Manager or designee may approve these contracts if they do not obligate the County for more than two (2) years or involve expenditures to the other party of more than \$50,000.00. Examples of contractual arrangements include but are not limited to:
 - 1. Acquisition and leasing of interests in real property
 - 2. Subordination agreements
 - Lien Releases
 - 4. Franchises
 - 5. Licenses
 - 6. Software license agreements
 - 7. Use permits
 - 8. Revenue agreements
 - 9. Excise tax certification
- F. Professional Services. Professional services are those services rendered by a person/firm engaging in a recognized discipline that necessarily requires advanced training and specialized knowledge to perform. Such services typically result from the predominant use in intellectual skills rather than physical skills. Professional services for the purposes of this Procurement Policy include but are not limited to:
 - 1. Attorneys
 - 2. Contractual services used by counties when issuing bonds, including consultants, underwriters, and bond servicing companies
 - Architects
 - 4. Court reporters
 - 5. Physicians, nurse practitioners, physical therapists
 - 6. Mental health therapists and psychiatrists
 - 7. Engineers
 - 8. Land surveyors
 - 9. Geologists
 - 10. Hydrologists
 - 11. Real estate appraisers

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- 12. Financial advising services
- 13. Auditors, except for the State Auditor General

As authorized by A.R.S. § 41-2581 and in accordance with A.R.S. § 11-254.01 D, the contract for professional services may be awarded without competitive bids pursuant to the following policies:

- a. The Procurement Officer shall encourage persons or firms engaged in the lawful practice of the professional services listed above desiring to provide the services to the County submit annually a statement of qualifications and experience on a prescribed form which shall include, but not be limited to the following information:
 - Technical education and training;
 - General or special experience, certifications, licenses, and memberships in professional associations, societies, or boards; and;
 - Any other relevant information requested by the purchasing agency.
- b. Persons or firms who have submitted statement of qualifications may submit additional information or change information that was previously submitted at any time.
- c. A County department requiring professional services will prepare a scope of work and purchase requisition and forward it to the Procurement Officer for processing. Based on the scope of work and the professional services required, the Procurement Officer shall provide a notice of the need for such professional services to persons or firms who have submitted statement of qualifications for those professional services. The Procurement Officer or designee of such officer may conduct discussions with any offerors who submit a proposal to provide the professional services to determine the offeror's qualifications for further consideration. Discussions shall not disclose any information derived from proposals submitted by other offerors.
- d. The contract award shall be made to the offeror determined in writing by the Procurement Officer to be best qualified based on the evaluation factors set forth in the request for qualifications and after

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a written determination that the compensation is fair and reasonable. Selection may be made pursuant to the provisions of this section without requiring pricing proposals, but if price is included in proposals submitted, no contract may be awarded solely on the basis of price.

G. Cancellation of Solicitations

1. Cancellation of Solicitation. An invitation for bids, a request for proposals, a request for qualifications or other solicitation may be cancelled, or any or all bids, proposals or statement of qualifications may be rejected in whole or in part as may be specified in the solicitation, when it is in the best interests of the County. Each solicitation issued by the County shall state that the solicitation may be cancelled and that any bid, proposal or statement of qualification may be rejected in whole or in part when in the best interests of the County.

2. Prior to Opening

- a. As used in this Section, "opening" means the date and time set for opening of bids, receipt of statements of qualifications or receipt of proposals in competitive sealed proposals.
- b. Prior to opening, a solicitation may be cancelled in whole or in part when the Procurement Group determines in writing that such action is in the County's best interest for reasons including but not limited to:
 - 1) The County no longer requires the materials, services, or construction;
 - 2) The County no longer can reasonably expect to fund the procurement; or
 - 3) Proposed amendments to the solicitation would be of such magnitude that a new solicitation is desirable.
- c. When a solicitation is cancelled prior to opening, notice of cancellation shall be sent to all persons solicited.
- d. The notice of cancellation shall:
 - 1) Identify the solicitation;

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- 2) Briefly explain the reason for cancellation; and
- 3) Where appropriate, explain that an opportunity will be given to compete on any re-solicitation or any future procurements of similar materials, services or construction.

3. After Opening

- a. After opening but prior to award, all bids, proposals or requests for qualifications may be rejected in whole or in part when the Procurement Officer or designee determines in writing that such action is in the County's best interest for reasons including but not limited to:
 - 1) The materials, services, or construction being procured are no longer required;
 - 2) Ambiguous or otherwise inadequate specifications or scopes of work were part of the solicitation;
 - 3) The solicitation did not provide for consideration of all factors of significance to the County;
 - 4) Prices exceed available funds and it would not be appropriate to adjust quantities to come within available funds;
 - 5) All otherwise acceptable bids, statements of qualifications or proposals received are at clearly unreasonable prices; or
 - i. There is reason to believe that the bids, statements of qualifications or proposals may not have been independently arrived at in open competition, may have been collusive, or may have been submitted in bad faith. A notice of rejection shall be sent to all persons that submitted bids, statements of qualifications or proposals.
 - ii. If all bids, proposals, or request for qualifications are rejected, all bids, proposals or statements received shall remain, to the extent possible, confidential.
- 4. Documentation. The reasons for cancellation or rejection shall be made a part of the procurement file and shall be available for public inspection.

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- H. Rejection of Individual Bids, Proposals or Statements of Qualifications
 - 1. A bid or proposal may be rejected if:
 - a. The bidder is determined to be non-responsible;
 - b. The bid is nonresponsive;
 - c. The proposed price, unless prohibited, is unreasonable; or
 - d. It is otherwise not advantageous to the County.
 - Reasons for rejection shall be provided to the unsuccessful bidders or offerors.
- I. Responsibility of Bidders and Offerors
 - 1. Factors to be considered in determining if a prospective bidder or offeror is responsible include:
 - a. The proposed bidder or offeror 's financial, physical, personnel or other resources, including subcontracts;
 - b. The proposed bidder or offeror's record of performance and integrity;
 - c. Whether the proposed bidder or offeror is qualified legally to contract with the County; and
 - d. Whether the proposed bidder or offeror supplied all necessary information concerning its responsibility;
 - e. Whether the proposed bidder or offeror is currently on a debarment list.
 - 2. The Procurement Officer or designee may establish specific responsibility criteria for a particular procurement. Any specific responsibility criteria shall be set forth in the solicitation.
 - 3. Determination of Non-responsibility. If a bidder or offeror who otherwise would have been awarded a contract is found non-responsible, a written finding of non-responsibility, setting forth the basis of the finding, shall be prepared by the Procurement Officer. The unreasonable failure of a bidder or offeror to promptly supply information in connection with an inquiry with respect to responsibility may be grounds for a finding of non-responsibility

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with respect to such bidder or offeror. The final determination shall be made part of the contract file and be made a public record.

- J. Bid and Contract Security, Material or Service Contracts
 - 1. The Procurement Officer or designee may require the submission of security to guarantee faithful bid and contract performance. In determining the amount and type of security required for each contract, the Procurement Officer or designee shall consider the nature of the performance and the need for future protection to the County. The requirement for security must be included in the invitation for bids or request for proposals. Failure to submit security in the amount and type of security required may result in the rejection of the bid, statement of qualifications or proposal.

K. Contract Term

- Subject to the following guidelines, unless otherwise provided by law, a contract for materials or services may be entered into for any period of time deemed to be in the best interest of the County, if the term of the contract and conditions of renewal or extension, if any, are included in the solicitation and monies are available for the first fiscal period at the time of contracting. Payment and performance obligations for succeeding fiscal periods are subject to the availability and appropriation of monies.
 - a. Contracts for materials and services shall have a specific term (date of commencement and expiration date).
 - b. A contract that does not exceed one (1) year may be approved by the County Manager or designee, if it is also for a contract amount less than \$50,000.
 - c. A contract that exceeds one (1) year in duration shall be approved by the Board and should not obligate the County for more than four (4) years.
 - d. Contracts between the County and a state or federal agency using a contract form that was developed by that agency and that the agency uses in its ordinary course of business may be for longer than four (4) years and will not require separate Board approval.

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e. With Board approval, other contracts may exceed four (4) years. Examples of such contracts include real-property lease agreements, rights-of-way agreements for utility companies, and contracts that allow the County to use limited financial resources in the most effective and efficient manner. Contracts may have a provision that allows for renewal if the County has the option not to renew.

- 2. Prior to use of a multi-term contract, it shall be determined that:
 - a. Estimated requirements cover the period of the contract and are reasonably firm and continuing;
 - b. The contract will serve the best interests of the County by encouraging effective competition or otherwise promoting economies in County procurement.
- 3. When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal year, the contract may be cancelled by the County and the contractor may be reimbursed for the reasonable value of any nonrecurring costs incurred but not amortized in the price of the supplies or services delivered under the contract.
- L. Right to Inspect. The County may, at reasonable times, inspect the part of the plant or place of business of a contractor, consultant or any subcontractor or subconsultant that is related to the performance of any contract awarded or to be awarded by the County.

M. Right to Audit Records

- The County may, at reasonable times and places, audit the books and records of any person who submits cost or pricing data to the extent that the books and records relate to the awarded contract. Any person who receives a contract, change order or contract modification for which cost or pricing data is required shall maintain the books and records that relate to the cost or pricing data for three years from the date of final payment under the contract, unless a shorter period is otherwise authorized in writing by the Procurement Officer.
- 2. The County is entitled to audit the books and records of a contractor, consultant or any subcontractor or sub-consultant under any contract or subcontract to the extent that the books and records relate to the performance of the contract or subcontract. The books and records shall be maintained by the contractor for a period of five (5) years from the date

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of final payment under the prime contractor or consultant, and by the subcontractor or sub-consultant for a period of five (5) years from the date of final payment under the subcontract, unless a shorter period is otherwise authorized in writing by the Procurement Officer.

N. Prospective Vendors Lists

- The Procurement Group shall maintain a prospective vendors list. Inclusion
 of the name of a person shall not indicate whether the person is responsible
 concerning a particular procurement or otherwise capable of successfully
 performing a County contract.
- 2. Persons desiring to be included on the prospective vendors list may notify the Procurement Group or may register with the Procurement Group inperson. The Procurement Group may remove a person from the prospective vendors list if it is determined that inclusion is not advantageous to the County.
- 3. It shall be the vendor's sole responsibility to ensure that vendor registration information is current and active.
- O. Contract Form and Execution. All contracts and amendments, regardless of value shall be approved by the appropriate authority in the County prior to authorization to proceed. All contracts entered into under this Procurement Policy shall be executed in the name of the County by the County Manager or designee for contracts under \$50,000.00 or if above \$50,000.00 by the Board. The County Manager or designee may execute an amendment to any contract initially approved by the Board as long as the amendment does not alter the scope of the contract or the monetary commitment of the original Board award.
 - 1. Grant Contracts. Grant Contracts due to the various complexities and time requirements, often necessitate immediate approval to take advantage of available funds. Based on the requirements/restrictions imposed by the grantor it may not always possible to follow the approved Procurement Policy. As such, grant contracts may be expedited by requesting that, with the approval of the Procurement Officer and County Manager, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors execute the contract to be subsequently ratified by the Board, regardless of value. Grant applications submitted and approved by the County Manager which automatically become contracts must be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for ratification.
- P. Assignment of Rights and Duties The rights and duties of a County contract are not transferable or otherwise assignable without the written consent of the Procurement Officer.

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9. SPECIFICATIONS

A. Maximum Practicable Competition

- All specifications shall seek to promote overall economy for the purposes intended and encourage competition in satisfying the County's needs and shall not be unduly restrictive.
 - a. To the extent practicable and unless otherwise permitted by this Procurement Policy, all specifications shall describe the County's requirements in a manner that does not unnecessarily exclude a material, service or construction item.
 - b. Proprietary specifications shall not be used unless the Procurement Officer determines in writing that such specifications are required by demonstrable technological justification and that it is not practicable or advantageous to use a less restrictive specification. Past success in the material's performance, traditional purchasing practices or inconvenience of drawing specifications do not justify the use of proprietary specifications.
- 2. When practicable, the County shall use accepted commercial specifications and shall procure standard commercial materials.

Brand Name

- A brand name or equal specification may be used when the Procurement staff determines that use of brand name or equal specifications is advantageous to the County.
- b. A brand name specification may be prepared and utilized only if the Procurement staff makes a written determination that only the identified brand name item will satisfy the County's needs.

10. PROCUREMENT OF CONSTRUCTION

A. All contracts entered into under this section 13.10 shall be executed in the name of the County by the County Manager for contracts under \$50,000.00 or if above \$50,000.00 by the Board in accordance with the requirements of A.R.S. §Title 34 and this Procurement Policy.

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- B. Procurement of Construction. Contracts for construction shall be solicited through a competitive sealed bid process for the procurement of Construction Services, Small Purchases, Sole Source Procurement, Emergency Procurements and Special Procurements in accordance with the requirements of A.R.S. §Title 34 and this Procurement Policy.
- C. Procurement of Professional Design Services. Contracts for professional design services with an estimated contract amount not to exceed (\$250,000) shall be solicited through a request for qualifications Small Purchases, Sole Source Procurement, Emergency Procurements, Special Procurements, and Direct Selection of Pre-Qualified Technical Registrants
- D. Procurement of Construction Services. Contracts for construction services shall be solicited through a build, design- build, and construction-manager-at-risk or joborder-contracting selection process utilizing a request for qualifications Small Purchases, Sole Source Procurement, Emergency Procurement and Special Procurements process.
- E. Construction by County Employees. A building, structure, addition or alteration of a public facility may be constructed by the County internal labor force if the cost does not exceed the amount established and adjusted each year in accordance with A.R.S. §34-201.
- F. Direct Selection of Pre-Qualified Technical Registrants
 - 1. If the procurement is by direct selection, a written determination by the County Engineer citing the basis of award and for the selection of the particular technical registrant shall be included in the contract file. The best interests of the County shall be considered in each instance.
 - 2. The Procurement Group shall maintain a list of technical registrants who are properly licensed with the State of Arizona Board of Technical Registration, that have expressed an interest in performing work for the County and have provided evidence of their professional qualifications for such work. The list may be categorized to reflect the person or firm's primary field of expertise. Persons or firms desiring to be included on the pre-qualified list may notify the Procurement Group or may register with the Procurement Group in-person.
 - 3. The Procurement Officer will notify each person or firm listed on the register annually of their status. An invitation published in the local publication inviting the updating of their professional qualifications.

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- 4. Firms who have failed to provide satisfactory evidence of qualifications or have performed unsatisfactorily during the past twelve (12) months may be removed from the pre-qualified vendor list.
- F. Non-substantial Failure to Comply. The Procurement Officer may determine that noncompliance with any provision of this section is non-substantial and may allow for correction or may waive minor informalities or irregularities.

11. CONTRACT CLAUSES

- A. Contract Clauses. All County contracts for supplies, services and construction shall include provisions necessary to define the responsibilities and rights of the parties to the contract. The Procurement Group, after consultation with the County Attorney, may issue clauses appropriate for material, service or construction contracts, addressing among others the following subjects:
 - 1. The unilateral right of the County to order in-writing changes in the work within the scope of the contract;
 - 2. The unilateral right of the County to order in writing temporary stopping of the work or delaying performance that does not alter the scope of the contract;
 - 3. Variations occurring between estimated quantities of work in contract and actual quantities;
 - 4. Defective pricing;
 - 5. Liquidated damages;
 - 6. Specified excuses for delay or nonperformance;
 - 7. Termination of the contract for default;
 - 8. Termination of the contract in whole or in part for the convenience of the County;
 - 9. Suspension of work on a construction project ordered by the County;
 - 10. Site conditions differing from those indicated in the contract, or ordinarily encountered, except that a differing site conditions clause need not be included in a contract;

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- 11. When the contract is negotiated;
- 12. When the contractor provides the site or design; or
- 13. When the parties have otherwise agreed with respect to the risk of differing site conditions.

B. Price Adjustments.

Adjustments in price resulting from the use of contract clauses shall be computed in one or more of the following ways:

- 1. The agreement on a fixed price adjustment before commencement of the pertinent performance or as soon as practicable;
- 2. The modification to the unit prices specified in the contract;
- 3. The costs attributable to the events or situations under the clauses:
- 4. In other manner as the contracting parties may mutually agree;
- 5. In the absence of agreement by the parties, by a unilateral determination by the County of the costs attributable to the events or situations under such clauses with adjustment of profit or fee as computed by the County.

12. COST PRINCIPLES

The Procurement Officer or designee may establish cost principles that will be used to determine the allowable incurred costs for the purpose of reimbursing costs pursuant to written contract provisions that provide for the reimbursement of costs.

A. Price Adjusting

- 1. A contractor may be required to submit cost or pricing data if any adjustment in contract price is requested to the provisions.
- 2. Written adjustment of pricing may contain any of the following:
 - a. The contract price is based on adequate price competition.
 - b. The contract price is based on established catalogue prices or market prices.

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c. Contract prices are set by law or regulation.

13. LEGAL AND CONTRACTUAL REMEDIES

- A. Right to Protest Solicitations and Contract Awards. Any actual or prospective bidder, respondent, offeror or contractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract may file a protest with the Procurement Officer and appeal the protest decision of the Procurement Officer to the County Manager.
- B. Resolution of Protests. The Procurement Officer shall have authority to resolve protests.
- C. Appeals from the decisions of the Procurement Officer may be made to the County Manager.

D. Filing of a Protest

- 1. Content of Protest: The protest shall be in writing and shall include the following information:
 - a. The name, address and telephone number of the protestant;
 - b. The signature of the protestant or its representative:
 - c. Identification of the solicitation or contract number;
 - d. A detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds of the protest including copies of relevant documents; and
 - e. The form of relief requested.

E. Time for Filing Protests

- 1. Protests Concerning Improprieties in a Solicitation.
 - a. Protests based upon alleged improprieties in a solicitation that are apparent before the solicitation due date shall be filed not less than five (5) working days before the solicitation due date.
- 2. Protests shall be filed within ten (10) days after issuance of notification of award or issuance of notice of intent to award.

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- The Procurement Officer, without waiving the County's right to dismiss the protest for lack of timeliness, may consider any protest that is not filed timely.
- 4. The Procurement Officer shall give notice of the protest to the successful contractor if award has been made or, if no award has been made, to all interested parties. Interested parties have the right to intervene.
- 5. Stay of Procurements during the Protest. In the event of a timely protest, the County may proceed further with the solicitation or with the award of the contract unless the Procurement Officer makes a written determination that there is a reasonable probability that the protest will be sustained or that the stay of procurement is not contrary to the substantial interests of the County.

6. Confidential Information

- a. Material submitted by a protestant shall not be withheld from any interested party except to the extent that the withholding of information is permitted or required by law.
- b. If the protestant believes that the protest contains Confidential Information, the provisions of Section 3.6 shall apply.

7. Decision by the Procurement Officer

- a. The Procurement Officer shall issue a written decision within fourteen (14) days after a protest has been filed. The decision shall contain an explanation of the basis of the decision. The time for the Procurement Officer's response may be extended for good cause up to thirty (30) calendar days. The Procurement Officer shall notify the protestant in writing that the time for the issuance of a decision has been extended, and the date by which a decision will be issued.
- b. The Procurement Officer shall furnish a copy of the decision to the protestant, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method including facsimile or electronically, that provides evidence of receipt.
- c. If the Procurement Officer fails to issue a decision within the time limits, the protestant may proceed as if the Procurement Officer had issued an adverse decision.

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8. Protest Remedies

- a. If the Procurement Officer sustains the protest in whole or part and determines that a solicitation, evaluation process, proposed contract award or contract award does not comply with this Procurement Policy, the Procurement Officer shall implement an appropriate remedy.
- b. In determining an appropriate remedy, the Procurement Officer shall consider all the circumstances surrounding the procurement or proposed procurement including, but not limited to, the seriousness of the procurement deficiency, the degree of prejudice to other interested parties or to the integrity of the procurement system, the good faith of the parties, the extent of performance, costs to the County, the urgency of the procurement and the impact of the relief on the using agency's mission.
- c. An appropriate remedy may include one or more of the following:
 - 1) Decline to exercise an option to renew under the contract;
 - 2) Reject all bids, responses or proposals;
 - 3) Terminate the contract;
 - 4) Reissue the solicitation;
 - 5) Issue a new solicitation;
 - 6) Award a contract consistent with the procurement code; or
 - 7) Such other relief as is determined necessary to ensure compliance with this Procurement Policy.
- 9. Appeals to the County Manager
 - a. An appeal from a decision entered or deemed to be entered by the Procurement Officer shall be filed with the County Manager within seven (7) days from the date the decision is issued. The appellant shall also file a copy of the appeal with the Procurement Officer.
 - b. Content of Appeal. The appeal shall contain:

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- 1) Content of the protest;
- 2) A copy of the decision of the Procurement Officer; and
- 3) The precise factual or legal error in the decision of the Procurement Officer from which an appeal is taken.

10. Notice of Appeal

- a. The Procurement Director shall give notice of the appeal to the successful contractor if award has been made or, if no award has been made, to interested parties. Such interested parties shall have the right to request copies of the appeal and to intervene in the proceedings.
- b. The Procurement Officer shall, upon request, furnish copies of the appeal to those interested parties.
- 11. Stay of Procurement during Appeal. If an appeal is filed during the procurement and before an award of a contract and the procurement or award of the contract was stayed by the Procurement Officer, the filing of an appeal shall automatically continue the stay unless the Procurement Officer makes a written determination that the procurement or award of the contract without delay is necessary to protect substantial interests of the County.
- 12. Procurement Officer Report. The Procurement Officer shall file a report on the appeal with the County Manager within seven (7) days from the date the appeal is filed. At the same time, the Procurement Officer shall furnish a copy of the report to the appellant by certified mail, return receipt requested, and to any interested parties. The report shall contain copies of:
 - a. The appeal;
 - b. Any other documents that are relevant to the protest; and
 - A statement by the Procurement Officer setting forth findings, actions, recommendations and any additional evidence or information necessary to determine the validity of the appeal.

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13. Comments on Report

a. The appellant shall file comments on the Procurement Officer's report with the County Manager within seven (7) days after receipt of the report. Copies of the comments shall be provided by the appellant to the Procurement Director and all other interested parties. The comments must contain a statement or confirmation as to the appellant's requested form of relief.

14. County Manager's Decision on Appeal

a. After review of the Procurement Officer's report and the appellant's comments, the County Manager shall make a decision on the appeal and notify the appellant in writing of such decision within seven (7) days after the decision. The decision of the County Manager shall provide an explanation of the decision and a response to appellant's requested form of relief. The decision of the County Manager shall be final.

15. Filing of Contract Claims and Controversies

- a. Content of Claim: The claim shall be in writing and shall include the following information:
 - 1) The name, address and telephone number of the claimant;
 - 2) The signature of the claimant or its representative;
 - 3) Identification of the solicitation or contract number;
 - 4) A detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds of the claim including copies of relevant documents; and
 - 5) The form of relief requested.
- 16. Resolution of Contract Claims and Controversies. The Procurement Officer or designee administering a contract in consultation with the County Manager and County Attorney shall have the authority to settle and resolve any contract claims and controversies. If a contract claim or controversy cannot be resolved by mutual agreement of the parties, the County or the contractor may pursue any legal remedy set forth in the contract or authorized by law.

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14. DEBARMENT

- A. Authority to Debar or Suspend. The Procurement Officer in consultation with the County Manager and County Attorney shall have the authority to debar or suspend a person from participating in County procurements.
- B. Initiation of Debarment. Upon receipt of information concerning a possible cause for debarment the Procurement Officer may investigate the possible cause and make a determination. If after investigation, the Procurement Officer has a reasonable basis to believe that a cause for debarment exists, the Procurement Officer may debar a person in accordance with this Procurement Policy.
- C. Debarment or suspension causes shall be limited to:
 - Conviction of any person or any affiliate of any person for commission of a criminal offense arising out of obtaining or attempting to obtain a public or private contract or subcontract, or in the performance of such contract or subcontract.
 - 2. Conviction of any person or any affiliate of any person under any statute of the federal government, this state or any other state for embezzlement, theft, fraudulent schemes and artifices, fraudulent schemes and practices, bid rigging, perjury, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, or receiving stolen property; or any other offense indicating a lack of business integrity or business honesty that currently seriously and directly affects responsibility as a County contractor and which conviction arises out of or obtaining or attempting to obtain a public or private contract or subcontract, or in the performance of such contract or subcontract.
 - 3. Conviction or civil judgment finding a violation by any person or affiliate of any person under state or federal antitrust statutes arising out of the response to a solicitation.
 - 4. Violations of contract provisions within three (3) years of current debarment action, as set forth below, of a character that is reasonably deemed to be so serious as to justify debarment action:
 - a. Abandonment of a contract without good cause;
 - b. Knowingly fails without good cause to perform in accordance with the specifications or within the time limit provided in the contract; or
 - c. Failure to perform or unsatisfactory performance in accordance with the terms of one or more contracts, except that failure to perform or

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unsatisfactory performance caused by acts beyond the control of the contractor shall not be considered to be a basis for debarment.

- d. Additionally, any other cause that the Procurement Officer reasonably determines to be so serious and compelling as to affect responsibility as a County contractor, including suspension or debarment of such person or any affiliate of such person by another governmental entity for any cause listed in this section.
- D. Matters Not Proper for Debarment or Suspension any conviction or judgment dated more than three (3) years prior to the notice of suspension or notice of debarment shall not be a basis for any debarment or suspension of a person or an affiliate of a person.

E. Period of Debarment

- 1. The period of time for a debarment shall not exceed three (3) years from the date of the debarment determination.
- 2. If debarment is based solely upon debarment by another governmental agency, the period of debarment may run concurrently with the period established by that other debarring agency.
- F. Notice. The Procurement Officer shall notify the person in writing within seven (7) days by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the debarment action. The person may submit a request in writing to the Procurement Officer for reconsideration of the debarment action hearing within fourteen (14) days of issuance of the debarment action.

G. Notice to Affiliates

- 1. If the Procurement Officer proposes to debar an affiliate, the affiliate shall have a right to provide the Procurement Officer with mitigating circumstances.
- 2. The affiliate shall advise the Procurement Officer in writing within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notice of a hearing of its intention to appear. Failure to provide written notice of appearance within the thirty (30) day period shall be a waiver of the right to appear in the hearing.

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H. Imputed Knowledge

- Improper conduct by a person may be imputed to an affiliate for purposes
 of debarment where the impropriety occurred in connection with the
 affiliate's duties for or on behalf of, or with the knowledge or approval of, the
 contractor.
- 2. The improper conduct of a person or its affiliate having a contract with a contractor may be imputed to the contractor for purposes of debarment where the impropriety occurred in connection with the person's duties for or on behalf of, or with the knowledge, or approval of the contractor.

I. Reinstatement

- The Procurement Officer may at any time after a final decision on debarment reinstate a debarred person or rescind the debarment upon a determination that the cause upon which the debarment is based no longer exists.
- 2. Any debarred person may request reinstatement by submitting a petition to the County Manager supported by documentary evidence showing that the cause for debarment no longer exists or has been substantially mitigated.
- 3. The decision on reinstatement shall be in writing and specify the factors on which it is based.
- J. Limited Participation. The Procurement Officer may allow a debarred person to participate in County contracts on a limited basis during the debarment period upon a written determination that participation is advantageous to the County. The determination shall specify the factors on which it is based and define the extent of the limits imposed.
- K. Suspension. The Procurement Officer may suspend a person from receiving any award in order to protect the County's interests.
- L. Period and Scope of Suspension. The period of suspension shall not be more than sixty (60) days unless the Procurement Officer is informed of compelling reasons to extend the period of suspension.

M. Suspension Notice

1. The Procurement Officer shall notify the person suspended by certified mail, return receipt requested.

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- 2. The notice of suspension shall state:
 - a. The basis for suspension;
 - b. The period, including dates, of the suspension; and
 - c. That bids or proposals shall not be solicited or accepted from the person and, if received, will not be considered.
- N. Master List for Suspension and Debarment.
 - 1. The Procurement Officer or designee shall maintain a Master List of debarments and suspensions.
 - 2. The Master List shall show at a minimum the following information:
 - a. The names and vendor number of those persons whom the County has debarred or suspended.
 - b. The basis of authority for the action.
 - c. The period of debarment or suspension, including the expiration date.
 - d. The name of the debarring or suspending agency, if the County's debarment or suspension is based on debarment or suspension by another governmental agency.
 - 3. The Master List shall include a separate section listing persons voluntarily excluded from participation in County contracts.
- O. Judicial Review of Protests, Claims or Controversies, Debarments or Suspensions. Any final decision of the Procurement Officer of a protest, claim or controversy, debarment or suspension under this Procurement Policy is subject to judicial review by any party to the proceeding. Exhaustion of the procedures set forth in this Procurement Policy shall be a condition precedent to seeking judicial review and the complaint seeking review shall be filed within thirty (30) days of the final decision. by the Board
- P. Exclusive Remedy. With exception to a law to the contrary, this Procurement Policy shall provide the exclusive procedure for asserting a claim or cause of action against the County arising in relation to any procurement conducted under this Procurement Policy.

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15. COOPERATIVE PROCUREMENT

- A. The Procurement Officer shall have the authority to participate in, sponsor, conduct or administer a cooperative purchasing agreement for the procurement of any materials, services, or construction with one or more eligible procurement units in accordance with an agreement entered into between the participants when it is in the best interest of the County.

reimbursement for the reasonable and necessary costs of providing such services.

Gila River Indian Community electronic grant application approval for Hellsgate Fire District.

Background Information

Hellsgate Fire District (HFD) is a small rural district covering several small residential areas within northern Gila County and has limited resources to fund purchase of cardiac heart monitors. HFD is made up of several adult (55+) RV parks and retirement communities. HFD also covers an area 15 miles east of Highway 260. Both demographic areas attribute a higher number of patients that require monitoring and stabilization. 80% of HFD calls are medical-related where the equipment is used for basic monitoring of vitals to shock therapy if necessary. The deadline to submit the FY2019 Grant Application to the Gila River Indian Community was March 29, 2019, at 5:00 pm. The grant application that was electronically submitted on March 29, 2019, is requesting \$115,000 for the replacement of 3 cardiac heart monitors that are old, outdated and not able to be updated with new protocols, and out of service. Under the tribal gaming compacts, tribes with casinos contribute 1 to 8% of their gaming revenue each year to the state, cities, towns, and counties. The contribution is determined on a sliding scale based on the amount of gaming revenue. 12% is distributed by the tribe to cities, towns, and counties of their choosing for community services and public safety programs for local government.

Evaluation

If the Gila River Indian Community Gaming Grant is awarded in whole or in part, HFD will purchase new first responder field monitoring equipment needed to treat a wide range of cardiac emergencies in the pre-hospital setting.

Conclusion

HFD is requesting assistance from the Gila River Indian Community in the amount of \$115,000 to purchase new first responder field monitoring equipment. The electronic submission deadline for the grant application was March 29, 2019, at 5:00 pm. If a grant is awarded, HFD will be responsible for the procurement of the equipment and all grant reporting to the Gila River Indian Community. Gila County will act as the pass-through entity to receive the grant funds.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board of Supervisors approval the electronic submission of a Grant Application to the Gila River Indian Community on March 29, 2019, in the amount of \$115,000 and, if awarded, it will be used by HFD to purchase new first responder field monitoring equipment.

 - Hellsgate Fire Department (HFD) was formed in February of 2008 from the merger of Diamond Star Fire Department and Tonto Village Fire Department. Our district encompasses the Town of Star Valley and 11 unincorporated communities located in Northern Gila County. It is the mission of our department to create a safer environment and to provide for an increase in quality of life for all those to enjoy. We pride ourselves in providing a wide rage of programs and services designed to protect the lives and property of the community from adverse effects of fire, medical emergencies or exposure to dangerous conditions created by either man or nature. It is the utmost goal of the department to do this effectively and efficiently by providing quality trained personnel with the tools to do their job to the best of their ability.
- 2. 3. Describe the proposed project and your plan to implement.

HFD, as many other fire districts throughout Arizona, has yet to recover from the downturn in the economy. Not only are we a small district but we also cover several small residential areas sprinkled around Northern Gila County. There is little commercial property within our district and new legislation prevents us from gaining what was lost when the economy dipped. HFD's mission is to secure funding for our full time and reserve firefighters until the tax base exceeds this cost. We have been fortunate to have outside funding assist with this mission however, that leaves no funds for replacing worn, outdated or new equipment needs that are now arising. Our grant proposal is to replace the 3 cardiac heart monitors that are on our front line engines. The current monitors HFD has are 1 over 20 years old that is out of service and 2 that are between 11-13 years old and are using outdated technology. The 2 units that are being used are not functioning at full capacity and can not be updated with the new protocols. HFD is only able to purchase this equipment if we



secure outside funding as our current tax levy is maxed out and must be supplemented with outside funds for operating costs.

4. Describe how the proposed project satisfies one or more of the priority funding areas identified by the Gila River Indian Community.

HFD's population is made up of several adult (55+) RV parks and retirement communities. This leads to a high aging population that require more medical care than a younger demographic. We also cover 15 miles of East Highway 260. Both of these attributes lead to a high number of patients that require monitoring and stabilization. 80% of HFD's calls are medical related where this equipment is used from the basic monitoring of vitals to shock therapy if necessary. Although we have other ways to determine a patients blood pressure or oxygen rates, the monitors are the only technology that can assist us with determining any invasive patient treatment. The cardiac monitors that we are requesting do everything from allowing a paramedic to determine the types of drugs needed for their condition by analyzing the heart. The monitors will also be able to pace the heart if it isn't working properly or deliver life saving shock therapy during a cardiac arrest. They can further monitor the patient if the need to be intubated by monitoring depth and quality of respiratory functions. They also monitor important vital signs to allow appropriate treatment and transfer of patients to the appropriate facility. These cardiac monitors not only provide our staff with effective treatment capabilities they save patients lives.

5. Identify the needs/problems to be addressed, target population and number of people to be served by the project.

The need/problem HFD faces is that we are in desperate need of new cardiac monitors to continue to provide quality care and have no additional funding to replace old equipment. Our target population would be anyone that calls for a medical emergency. This equipment is used in 95% of our medical calls to do something as basic as vital signs to delivering shocks should their heart stop functioning properly. Our district is a total of 38 square miles of rural Arizona. There are approximately 4,600 permanent residents that we serve on a 1st served basis with another 1,400 seasonal residents. HFD has automatic aid agreements with Payson Fire and Christopher-Khol's Fire Department. The Town of Payson has approximately 15,000 residents alone. All the communities in the surrounding area swell during the summer months and can sometimes reach triple the number of full time residents. This trend is increasing as more people drive to the mountains to escape the high temperatures of Southern parts of Arizona. All surrounding areas rely on our personnel to



assist with all fire assignments and run EMS services during peak times. All of these residents could potentially benefit from these monitors as we respond to all areas.

- 6. List three proposed outcomes for this project to be accomplished during the grant term.
 - 1. Early identification of life threatening cardiac symptoms.
 - 2. Early treatment and/or correction of life threatening cardiac symptoms.
 - 3. Early interventions to improve patient outcomes.
- 7. Define the project as a new or continuing program. Has GRIC previously funded this project?

This would be considered a new project even though we currently use old equipment to fill this gap. Neither GRIC or any other agency has ever funded this project for HFD.

8. Provide a brief timeline including start and finish dates. Indicate if the timeline is flexible.

Timeline is very quick, HFD has already identified the units they will purchase along with the added equipment needed. From the time the project is funded until finished will be 2 months.

9. Identify other organizations, partners or funders participating in the project and their roles.

There would be no outside assistance aside from a contract that is enabling us to purchase the equipment at a discounted rate.

- 10. Would you be able to implement the proposed plan if your organization received partial funding for this project?
 - Although HFD has an immediate need to replace all three monitors we could consider a funding option that extendeds out a lease purchase for three years. Or to purchase a monitor each year for the next three years. If GRIC would rather fund a three year project.
- 11. Describe your plan for project financial sustainability beyond the grant period. If this is a program/project previously funded by the Gila River Indian Community describe efforts made towards the previously described sustainability plan.

HFD has committed to provide annual testing, calibration and recertification services on all monitors. We are also dedicating funds each year to our capital equipment to start a replacement program of monitors to take place no more than every 8 years.



12. Describe your plan to document progress and results.

HFD intends to procure the new cardiac monitors. We would then train all personnel to use the new monitors. Training would be provided by the vendor of the units we purchase. Finally we would deploy the new equipment on the 3 front line engines allowing each of our community trucks to have the same capabilities no matter the location of the emergency. It will be easy to purchase the equipment if funds are received, tracking the results will be done each time we encounter a medical emergency. We expect a higher success rate in life saving measurers as delays and missing/broken equipment will be replaced with new cutting edge technology.

HFD has only been awarded a tribe grant from Gila River Indian Community which was last year.



Intergovernmental Agreement regarding the Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth.

Background Information

The Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth (Coalition), a non-profit corporation, is made up of five counties in Arizona: Apache, Cochise, Gila, Graham, and Greenlee; ten counties in New Mexico: Catron, Chaves, Eddy, Harding, Hidalgo, Lincoln, McKinley, Sierra, Rio Arriba, and Roosevelt; and has representation from the timber, livestock, mining, small business, farming, sportsman, trapping and outfitter industries. Representation currently exceeds 425,167 in population. The objectives of the Coalition are: (1) to address erosion of private property ownership and rights; and (2) to reduce the loss of multiple use lands to single use management. Through these objectives, the members of the Coalition can protect their citizens and their economic base. The Coalition has given countless training sessions on land use planning, the NEPA, ESA, Forest and BLM land use planning. In addition, the Coalition provides regular assistance to member counties, when requested, for ordinance drafting, land planning, federal and state agency actions and lobbying efforts.

Gila County joined the Coalition in 1994 and began paying membership dues each year up through 2019. From 1994 through 2016, Gila County was a voting member on the Coalition. In 2016, Gila County stopped being a voting member because the Intergovernmental Agreement was not signed by Gila County.

On July 1, 2016, four counties in Arizona and eight counties in New Mexico entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement entitled "Intergovernmental Agreement Regarding the Exercise of Joint Powers for the Operation of the Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth" (IGA) in order to coordinate mutual efforts to preserve and protect the viability of local economies and to take legal or other steps

necessary to protect local economies in rural counties of Arizona and New Mexico. At that time, Gila County, Sierra County and Rio Arriba County did not execute the IGA; however, Sierra County and Rio Arriba County are in the process of getting the IGA signed. The term of the IGA began on April 1, 2016, and expires on December 31, 2025.

Each year, members of the Board of Supervisors are provided the opportunity to serve on other boards, committees and organizations by virtue of their membership on the Board of Supervisors. They are elected/appointed by their peers to represent the interests of Gila County, including representation on the Coalition.

On April 16, 2019, this agenda item was presented to the Board of Supervisors to approve the IGA. At that time, County Manager James Menlove mentioned that he placed the item on the meeting agenda late in the process, so the County Attorney's Office has not had sufficient time to thoroughly review the IGA and staff report to give an opinion for approval or disapproval. He suggested that the Board may want to table this item to the May 7th Board meeting to allow the attorneys ample time to review the IGA. The Board unanimously voted to table approval of the IGA to the May 7th Regular Meeting.

Evaluation

For many years and on an annual basis, the Board of Supervisors has appointed a member of its Board to be represented on the Coalition. Of current members of the Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Martin represented Gila County on the Coalition for many years and Supervisor Cline has represented the County in 2018 and at present for 2019. The IGA was not executed by Gila County in 2016; therefore, the County has not been allowed to be a voting member of the Coalition. It is important for the Board to be a voting member of the Coalition. The County pays membership dues to the Coalition each year.

Conclusion

The Board needs to decide whether or not to execute the IGA which went into effect April 1, 2016, and expires on December 31, 2025, in order to once again become a voting member of the Coalition.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board's approval of the IGA.

Intergovernmental Agreement regarding the Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth.

The Gila County Attorney does not approve this IGA because there is no statutory authority for it.

The county must have express or implied statutory authority before it can spend public funds on something. For example, the IGA proposes to give the Coalition money to lobby regarding wildlife resource management—but the county doesn't have authority to do that.

The IGA language grants to the Coalition power to "review state and federal regulatory actions potentially impacting land and wildlife resource management, as well as the potential preparation, funding and direction of litigation and related activities pertaining to land use and resource management." Page 2, paragraph 1. The bylaws allow: "Commenting and lobbying when deemed necessary and advisable on proposed federal or state regulations impacting land use or wildlife management within the Member Counties...." Section 2.11(E).

In addition, the county is required to maintain supervision and control over the Coalition's actions and under the IGA, it does not. Under *Indus. Commn. Of Ariz.* 167 P.2d 113, the delegation of police power is ineffective unless the board maintains supervision or control over the agent's actions. Here, each county delegates to the Coalition authority to control management of the purposes of the coalition, including the conduct of litigation. It is true that counties would have to contribute sufficient money before litigation would be commenced and a county could withdraw if it was aggrieved, but this doesn't answer the question of unauthorized delegation of police power in the first place.

It is therefore apparent that the duty of caring for the indigent sick is a *governmental* function and is an exercise of the *police power*, and such powers and duties are vested in the board of supervisors. It is a fundamental principle of constitutional law that the police power is *inalienable* and cannot be surrendered or delegated, by affirmative action, by inaction, by contract, or otherwise. 11 Am.Jur., Const. Law, § 254; 37 Am.Jur., Municipal Corporations, § 276; 44 C.J. 73, § 2129. This jurisdiction vested in the board of supervisors is alienable, and the board may not delegate it to any person other than a duly constituted deputy, agent, contractor, employee, workman, or operative, over whom it must as a *matter of law* retain supervision or control within the meaning of Sections 56–928 and 56–929.

Indus. Comm'n v. Navajo Cty., 64 Ariz. 172, 179-80, 167 P.2d 113, 117 (1946)

There are several times in the IGA where Arizona law is made subservient to the Laws of New Mexico. The board does not have authority to do that.

Background Information

On May 9, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract No. 100616 with Westwood Pharmacy, whereby Westwood Pharmacy provides prescription and over-the-counter medications.

On July 10, 2018, the Board of Supervisors approved Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. 100616 with Westwood Pharmacy extending the term of the contract for one additional year, from May 9, 2018, to May 8, 2019.

The Gila County Sheriff's Office medical unit provides medical services for those individuals incarcerated in Gila County at the Globe and Payson jail facilities. The medical units are comprised of a Physician, Physician's Assistant, two (2) Registered Nurses and three (3) Medical Assistants. When needed, and at the direction of the licensed Physician, the medical staff is required to provide prescription and over-the-counter medication.

Evaluation

Amendment No. 2 to Contract No. 100616 will serve to exercise the option to renew the contract for one additional year from May 9, 2019, to May 8, 2020 for a contract total of \$75,000; and to remove from the contract the language "ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION: Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not, for the

duration of this agreement, engage in a boycott of Israel as required by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by County up to and including termination of this agreement."

Conclusion

The Gila County Sheriff's Office is pleased with the services provided by Westwood Pharmacy to provide prescription and over-the-counter medications and would like to extend the contract for another year.

Recommendation

It is the recommendation of the Chief Administrative Officer and Finance Department Director that the Board rrenew the contract with Westwood Pharmacy for one additional year, so that Westwood Pharmacy may continue providing prescription and over-the-counter medications to those individuals incarcerated in Gila County at the Globe and Payson jail facilities.

INTENT:

The purpose of this request is to establish a contract with a pharmacy to provide prescription and over-the-counter medications; and to streamline the process for purchasing and ordering medication.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The Contractor shall:

- Contractor must provide service for essential medications 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This includes weekends, holidays and after hours.
- Contractor must have an emergency notification system, must be available after hours, and must return
 calls within one hour to either the Jail or the local hospital Emergency Department for medication orders
 for jail inmates.

- 2. During the contract period, no adjustments will be allowed in prescription fees.
- Monthly adjustments in prescription prices may be allowed based on increases and decreases in the
 cost of drugs to the supplier. Provisions for price adjustment up or down from supplier pricing as of
 January 1, 2017, during the contract period, must be supplied in a bidder statement, accompanying
 the bid.
- 4. Adjustments must be based on price changes to supplier, be clearly documented, and be easily auditable by the County

- Bidder will be willing and able to submit, wither electronically or via hard copy, medication claims for those inmates processing private insurance, or state/federal medical assistance. These claims will be submitted directly to the carrier.
- 10. The bidder will work with the Jail Health Program medical billing clerk to determine eligible offenders, and will bill the County only that portion of the medication cost not covered by the insurance or medical assistance carrier.
- 11. Invoices will be required to be itemized by name of patient and prescription number, and must show for each item the drug name, potency, unit quantity, and unit cost. Invoice must be able to be sorted by type of medication.
- 12. The County will require that the contractor be able to sort and print out a monthly invoice/report containing only those medications prescribed for mental health disorders.
- 13. Payments will be processed in accordance with Gila County's established policies and procedures. Invoices received prior to the first day of the month will be paid by the end of the month.
- 14. Credit will be given to the County for any unused medications still in unbroken bubbles in a blister pack.
- 15. During the contract period, if the supplier cannot supply services or products due to problems beyond their control, Gila County reserves the right to purchase elsewhere.
- 16. The term of the bid will be from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, and may be renewed for up to two (2) one-year terms, for a total of three (3) years, by mutual agreement of the parties.
- 17. Either party may withdraw from the agreement with or without cause by providing the other party with 90 days written notice.

- 19. The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Gila County Sheriff's Office and it's agents, servants or employees from all claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities arising out of an intentional tort committed as a result of providing medication to the Gila County Jail. Conversely, the Gila County Sheriff's Office shall indemnify and hold harmless the Contractor and it's agents, servants, employees, from all claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities arising out of the operation and maintenance of the Gila County Jail, including maintaining security, as well as acts performed by the contractor don in the course of providing medical care for Gila County.
- 20. Standing orders, rules, and regulations of the contractor relating to medical services are generally to established and implemented solely by the contractor. In areas that impact upon the security and general administration of the Gila County Jail, the Policies and Procedures of the contractor are subject to review and approval of the Gila County Sheriff's Office.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Award of Contract

- 1. The Gila County Board of Supervisors reserves the right to award any Proposal by individual line item, by group of line items or as total, or any part thereof, whichever is deemed to be in the best interest, most advantageous of the County of Gila.
 - a. Notwithstanding any or other provisions of the IFB, the County reserves the right to:
 - 1. Waive any immaterial defects or informalities; or
 - 2. Reject any or all Proposals; or portions thereof; or
 - 3. Reissue a Request for Proposal.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the Gila County Board of Supervisors to let the County contracts to the lowest responsive and responsible Contractor(s). To ensure that all Contractors are experienced, reasonably equipped and adequately financed to meet their contractual obligations, a determination of responsibility shall be made by the Gila County Board of Supervisors prior to contract award.

This exhibit shall serve as an example of the contract agreement to any Contractor, their agents, subcontractors and/or representatives, awarded this or any portion of this contract by the County, by submitting Proposals to this or any other solicitation requiring sealed Proposals, does hereby agree to the following provisions. Proof of acceptance of these provisions will be the Contractor's signature(s) appearing on all forms contained on pages 24 through 32.

Overcharges by Antitrust Violations

The County maintains that, in actual practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are borne by the purchaser. Therefore, to the extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby assigns to the County any and all claims for such overcharges as to the goods or services used to fulfill the contract.

Authority to Contract

This contract shall be based upon the Request for Proposal issued by the County and the offer submitted by the Contractor in response to the IFB. The offer shall substantially conform to the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements set forth within the text of the IFB. The County reserves the right to clarify any contractual terms with the concurrence of the Contractor; however, any substantial non-conformity in the offer, as determined by the County Attorney, shall be deemed non-responsive and the offer rejected. The contract shall contain the entire agreement between Gila County and the Contractor relating to these requirements and shall prevail over any and all previous agreements, contracts, proposals, negotiations, purchase orders, or master agreement in any form. The contract activity is issued under the authority of the Board of Supervisors. No alteration of any portion of the contract, any items or services awarded, or any other agreement that is based upon this contract may be made without express written approval of Gila County in the form of an official contract amendment. Any attempt to alter any documents on the part of the Contractor or any agency is a violation of the County Procurement Code. Any such action is subject to the legal and contractual remedies available to the County inclusive, but not limited to, contract cancellation, suspension and/or debarment of the Contractor.

Contract Amendments

The contract shall be modified only by a written contract amendment signed by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and persons duly authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Contractor.

Contract Award Agreement continued...

Contract Default

- A. The County, by written notice of default to the Contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this contract in any one of the following circumstances:
 - 1. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the supplies or to perform the services within the times specified; or
 - 2. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract; and fails to remedy the situation within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice.
- B. In the event the County terminates this contract in whole or part, the County may procure supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the County for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services.

Right to Assurance

Whenever one party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, the other party may demand that the other party give a written assurance of this intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made and no written assurance is given within five (5) days, the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this contract.

Co-op Use of Contract - Intergovernmental Purchasing

Gila County has entered into an active purchasing agreement with other political subdivisions, cities, and towns of the State of Arizona in order to conserve resources, reduce procurement costs and improve timely acquisition and cost of supplies, equipment and services. The Contractor to whom this contract is awarded may be requested by other parties of said interactive purchasing agreements to extend to those parties the right to purchase supplies, equipment and services provided by the Contractor under this contract, pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any such usage by other entities must be in accord with the rules and regulations of the respective entity and the approval of the Contractor.

Cancellation of County Contracts

This contract is subject to the cancellation provisions of A.R.S. §38-511.

Termination of Contract

The County, with or without cause, may terminate this contract at any time by mutual written consent, or by giving thirty (30) days written notice to you. The County at its convenience, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part. If this contract is terminated, the County shall be liable only for payment under the payment provisions of this contract for the services rendered and accepted material received by the County before the effective date of termination.

Contract Award Agreement continued...

The County reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of this contract due to failure of the Contractor to carry out any term, promise, or condition of the contract. The County will issue a written ten (10) day notice of default to Contractor for acting or failing to act as in any of the following:

- 1. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor fails to perform adequately the stipulations, conditions or services/specifications required in the contract.
- 2. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor attempts to impose on the County material products, or workmanship, which is of unacceptable quality.
- Contractor fails to furnish the required service and/or product within the time stipulated in the contract.
- 4. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the requirements of the contract and/or give the County a positive indication that Contractor will not or cannot perform to the requirements of the contract.

Each payment obligation of the County created hereby is conditioned upon the availability of County, State and Federal funds, which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation.

If funds are not allocated by the County and available for the continuance of service herein contemplated, the contract period for the service may be terminated by the County at the end of the period for which funds are available. The County shall notify the Contractor at the earliest possible time which service may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the County in the event this provision is exercised, and the County shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this paragraph.

Indemnification Clause

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County of Gila and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such Contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee, be indemnified by Contractor from and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs.

Israel Boycott Certification Clause

Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not, for the duration of this agreement, engage in, a boycott of Israel as defined by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by County up to and including termination of this Agreement.

General

After receipt of all proposals, each submittal shall be screened to determine if any shall be deemed non-responsive. Unsigned proposals, unacknowledged Addenda, incomplete proposals, non-conformance with mandatory requirements, etc., may result in the determination of non-responsive.

Subsequent to the initial review, all remaining proposals shall be reviewed by the Gila County Finance Department to evaluate the information submitted, perform tests when necessary and make comparisons in order to approve or reject the Request. If rejected, the purchasing department shall give written notice to the Bidder submitting this request.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: Contractor and subcontractors shall procure and maintain until all of their obligations have been discharged, including any warranty periods under this Contract are satisfied, insurance against claims for injury to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

SECTION 2.0

Drug Price List

- 2.1 This list is based upon the Preferred Drug Formulary used by the Gila County Jail and represents medications commonly prescribed for Gila County Jail inmates. There is an average of 55 prescriptions filled per month.
- 2.2 The quantities and types of medications listed in the bid represent Gila County's estimated requirements. Gila County will be neither obligated by, nor restricted to, the quantity and types of medications listed. The list is provided for bidding purposes only. Gila County reserves the right to update the formulary as medical needs dictate.

Amendment No. 1 to Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) No. 121117 with Town of Winkelman regarding building and zoning review and inspection services.

Background Information

On March 13, 2018, the Board of Supervisors approved Intergovernmental Agreement No. 121117 with Town of Winkelman for building and zoning review and inspection services.

The Town does not have building or zoning inspectors on staff. In order to comply with state statutes and the Town's ordinances, in regard to fire, health, and life safety, the Town requires technical assistance in the areas of inspections and code compliance. The Gila County Community Development Department shall provide field inspections and reports to ensure compliance with state statutes and the Town's ordinances. The Town shall compensate the County for services provided at the rate of \$50 per inspection or \$50 per hour for services rendered.

Evaluation

Amendment No. 1 extends the term of the IGA for one additional year, from March 12, 2019 to March 11, 2020; and removes the language "ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION: Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not, for the duration of this agreement, engage in a boycott of Israel as required by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by County up to and including termination of this agreement."

The Gila County Community Development Department has trained personnel with inspection and code compliance experience whereas the Town does not. The Town is very interested in pursuing code compliance violations and with the assistance of the County, a determination can be

made if there is actually a violation. The Town will then pursue enforcement of the confirmed violations.

Conclusion

Approval of Amendment No. 1 will be a benefit to the Town of Winkelman since the County has the resources and expertise in inspections and code compliance that the Town does not. The added workload to the staff of Community Development is expected to be minimal. Staff recommends approval of this IGA.

Background Information

Any establishment that has been issued a liquor license must submit an Application for Extension of Premises/Patio Permit to the local governing body of the city, town or county where the establishment is located. The application can be submitted to temporarily or permanently extend the premises/patio where serving liquor is permitted by the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses and Control (DLLC). The local governing body usually has established internal procedures for review and approval of the application. The DLLC has final approval of all recommendations submitted by the local governing body.

Tamara Morken of THAT Brewery & Pub (Rimside Grill) submitted an application to temporarily extend the premises/patio where liquor is permitted to be sold during weekends from May 24, 2019, through May 27, 2019, and May 31, 2019, through June 2, 2019.

Evaluation

The application have been reviewed by the Clerk of the Board and by the Building Official of the Community Development Division regarding the proposed extended area for liquor to be served. The application clearly indicates that the extended area will be to include the patio and the staff of THAT Brewery & Pub (Rimside Grill) will be provided the required training.

Dalton, Deputy Gila County Attorney, Civil Bureau Chief; Charles Shire, Deputy Gila County Attorney Senior-Civil (via ITV); Marian Sheppard, Clerk of the Board; and Melissa Henderson, Deputy Clerk of the Board.

Item 1 - CALL TO ORDER - PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - INVOCATION

Chairman Humphrey called the regular session to order at 10:00 a.m. this date in the Board of Supervisors' hearing room. J. Adam Shepherd led the Pledge of Allegiance and Joe Hittle from the Calvary Chapel in Payon delivered the invocation.

Item 2 - PRESENTATIONS:

A. Presentation of a request for County financial assistance in the amount of \$25,000 to aide in the marketing campaigns of the Globe-Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce, Rim Country Chamber of Commerce, and Tonto Basin Chamber of Commerce for FY 2019-2020.

James Menlove, County Manager, stated that chamber representatives were present to provide a presentation to the Board. Maia Crespin, Executive Director of the Rim Country Chamber of Commerce, presented information on the Chamber to include advertising, number of visitors annually, events calendar, revenue sources, and a new project entitled Think Small – Small Meetings/Small Conferences that will be implemented to attract more businesses to conduct meetings in the Payson area. Ms. Crespin thanked the Board for past financial support and advised that the Chamber's FY 2019-2010 budget is estimated at \$9,600. The Board thanked Ms. Crespin for the presentation. Ellen Kretsch, Director of the Globe-Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce, also reviewed the various activities of the Chamber to include

advertising, visitors and events, and she reviewed the budget. Ms. Kretsch stated that in the past, the County has provided \$30,000 to the 3 chambers as follows: \$10,800-Rim Country Chamber of Commerce, \$10,800-Globe-Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce, and \$8,400-Tonto Basin Chamber of Commerce. She thanked the Board for past financial contributions and she requested approval of the Chamber's financial request for FY 2018-2019, and FY 2019-2020. The Board thanked Ms. Kretsch for the information.

Item 3 - PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to adopt Resolution No. 19-04-03 to name a previously unnamed section of road in the Jake's Corner area as N. Gun Creek Road.

Steve Sanders, Public Works Department Director, advised that the subject road has enough residents that the road requires a road name. The Tonto Basin Fire Department contacted the Rural Addressing Department with address concerns in an area located near Jake's Corner. There were ten Arizona Highway 188 addresses that were not directly off the highway making it difficult for the Fire Department to locate. County resident Justen Williams contacted the Rural Addressing Department in December 2018 to obtain a road naming petition to name a section of road located in the same Jake's Corner outside of Payson. Mr. Williams swiftly returned the completed petition with 78% of property owners' signatures. A copy of the signed petition is attached to this agenda item. The Rural Addressing Department proposed a second section of road in the area to be named E. Hardt Creek Road based on existing easements and GIS imaging. After the first public notice was sent out, three of the property owners submitted written objections with the E. Hardt Creek Road street naming. After conducting a site check of the area and speaking with property owners, N. Gun Creek Road was extended, and E. Hardt Creek Road was removed. A second public notice was sent out with a map of the extended N. Gun Creek Road and the new discrepancies deadline. As of March 27th, no new road name objections were submitted. Chairman Humphrey opened the public hearing. There were no comments; therefore, he closed the public hearing and asked for a Board motion. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, the Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 19-04-03 to name a previously unnamed section of road in the Jake's Corner area as N. Gun Creek Road. (A copy of the Resolution is attached to these minutes and permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office.)

Item 4 - REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the Sheriff's Office electronic submission of a FFY 2020 DUI/Impaired Driving Enforcement

Overtime Grant Application in the amount of \$54,623 submitted to the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety.

Mike Johnson, Undersheriff, advised that there was a short deadline to submit this grant application and the two grant applications listed in the following agenda items; therefore, there was insufficient time to obtain Board of Supervisors' approval prior to submitting the applications. This grant application was electronically submitted on March 13, 2019. If this grant is awarded, the funds will be used to pay overtime related to DUI/impaired driving enforcement details. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously authorized the submission of the FFY 2020 DUI/Impaired Driving Enforcement Overtime Grant Application as stated in the agenda item.

B. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the Sheriff's Office electronic submission of an FFY 2020 Speed Enforcement Vehicle Grant Application in the amount of \$32,488 submitted to the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety.

Undersheriff Johnson advised that this grant application was electronically submitted on March 13, 2019. If this grant is awarded, the funds will be utilized to purchase a Dodge Charger SXT Plus RWD or equivalent vehicle in the amount of \$32,488 to enhance speed and DUI/impaired driving enforcement detail. Vice-Chairman Cline inquired if the Sheriff's Office (S.O.) currently utilized a specific vehicle for speed enforcement to which Undersheriff Johnson replied that the S.O. did not have such a vehicle. Chairman Humphrey inquired if a bid had been obtained for this vehicle to which Undersheriff Johnson replied that a bid has been obtained from Horne Motors in Globe. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously authorized the Sheriff's Office electronic submission of an FFY 2020 Speed Enforcement Vehicle Grant Application as stated in the agenda item.

C. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the Sheriff's Office electronic submission of an FFY 2020 Speed Enforcement Overtime Grant Application in the amount of \$27,312 submitted to the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety; adopt Resolution No. 19-04-02; and authorize the Chairman's signature on the Resolution Certification of which the Resolution and Resolution Certification are a component of the Grant Application.

Undersheriff Johnson advised that this grant application was electronically submitted on March 13, 2019. If this grant is awarded, the funds will be utilized for overtime funding related to speed enforcement details throughout Gila County. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously authorized the submission of the FFY 2020

Speed Enforcement Overtime Grant Application in the amount of \$27,312 submitted to the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety; adopted Resolution No. 19-04-02; and authorized the Chairman's signature on the Resolution Certification of which the Resolution and Resolution Certification are a component of the Grant Application. (A copy of the Resolution is attached to these minutes and permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office.)

D. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the publication of a Notice of Public Auction for Miscellaneous Surplus Material in the Arizona Silver Belt newspaper on May 8, 2019.

Amber Warden, Accounting Manager, advised that the County has miscellaneous surplus vehicles and equipment that are no longer needed, so they should be sold at auction. The auction is scheduled to take place on June 8, 2019. She stated that a list of the vehicles and equipment to be sold are contained in the staff report for this agenda item. Chairman Humphrey inquired if the newspaper publication was the only advertisement of the auction to which Ms. Warden replied that the County intends to use other avenues to advertise the auction. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously authorized the publication of the Notice of Auction as stated in this agenda item.

E. Information/Discussion/Action to approve Intergovernmental Agreement No. C-78-19-011-3-00 between Gila County and Maricopa County for the relocation of equipment from the Gila County communications tower located on Mt. Ord to the adjacent Maricopa County communications tower for a period of 10 years, renewable for up to 3 terms of 5 years each.

Kelly Riggs, Information Technology Director, advised that the County's communications tower is old and structurally no longer able to support the weight of the equipment it supports. There are two available options: purchase a new tower at an approximate cost of \$510,000 or relocate the County's equipment to a communications tower owned by Maricopa County of which the approximate cost is \$290,000. Mr. Riggs advised that it would be beneficial to take advantage of the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Maricopa County as it will allow time for the County to prepare for the eventual construction of a new communications tower on Mt. Ord. He added that the County is not committing any money to Maricopa County with this proposed IGA. Mr. Riggs stated that Maricopa County prefers that Gila County use its vendor to relocate the equipment and demolish the existing tower. That contract will be presented to the Board for approval later. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously approved IGA No. C-78-19-011-3-00.

F. Information/Discussion/Action to adopt Resolution No. 19-04-01 authorizing the execution of Amendment No. Two to Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA/JPA 16-0005916-I) between Gila County and the State of Arizona, Department of Transportation, which is related to the bridge replacement project on Colcord Road east of Payson.

Mr. Sanders explained that the bridge replacement project on Colcord Road is over Gordon Canyon and it is in a "very tough area." Due to the complexity of the design of the detour, an additional \$65,000 is needed. The amount is being moved from the construction phase of the project into the scoping and design. This transfer requires 5.7% matching funds from the County bringing the County's match for scoping and design to \$16,036 of which Gila County has paid \$12,331 leaving a balance of \$3,705. Mr. Sanders advised that Central Arizona Governments (CAG) has some funding in its transportation implementation program and are willing to supplement this project in the amount of \$50,000. Mr. Sanders advised that that he will bring an agenda item to the Board later to receive accept CAG's money. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Humphrey, the Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 19-04-01. (A copy of the Resolution is attached to these minutes and permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office.)

G. Information/Discussion/Action to cancel Contract No. 111518-2 with Tate's Auto Center due to bankruptcy filing; approve revised Notice of Invitation for Bid No. 11158-2 which contains the related contract to reflect that the contract award is being given to McSpadden Ford (the second lowest, qualified bidder) in the amount of \$49,767.30 for the purchase one new Ford F-150 full size, 1/2 ton, 4x4, crew cab pickup with installed equipment as outlined in McSpadden Ford's proposal; and authorize the Chairman's signature on the contract.

Mr. Sanders provided some history on this contract. On February 19, 2019, the Board of Supervisors awarded Contract No. 111518-2 to Tate's Auto Center-Holbrook. On March 28, 2019, Tate's Auto Center-Holbrook informed Fleet Management that they had filed Chapter 11 (bankruptcy), and because of this they would not be able to honor the terms of Invitation for Bids (IFB) No. 111518-2. On April 2, 2019, the Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to disapprove Amendment 1 to Contract No. 111518-2 with Tate's Auto Center-Holbrook due to their filing of Chapter 11. Mr. Sanders stated that McSpadden Ford was the second lowest, qualified bidder and he recommended that the Board award a contract to McSpadden Ford for the vehicle purchase as outlined in the IFB. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously cancelled Contract No. 111518-2 with Tate's Auto Center; approved revised Notice of Invitation for Bid No. 11158-2; awarded a contract to McSpadden Ford in the amount of \$49,767.30; and authorized the Chairman's signature on the contract.

Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously adjourned as the Gila County Board of Supervisors and convened as the Gila County Library District Board of Directors to address agenda items 4H and 4J.

H. (Motion to adjourn as the Gila County Board of Supervisors and convene as the Gila County Library District Board of Directors.) Information/Discussion/Action to approve submission of Grantee Agreement No. GRA-RC004-19-0919-01-Y2 between the Gila Regional Partnership Council, Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board (First Things First) and the Gila County Library District in the amount of \$60,000 for fiscal year July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020.

Jacque Sanders, Deputy County Manager, District Librarian, advised that this program has been in effect for many years in Gila County. The program provides a monthly book, free of charge, to children from birth through age 5 that are enrolled in the program. Vice-Chairman Cline asked if research has been conducted to determine the effectiveness of this program. Ms. Sanders replied that she found research for the same program, although not in Arizona, that proves that the program is very effective. Each Board member complimented the program. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously approved the submission of Grantee Agreement No. GRA-RC004-19-0919-01-Y2.

I. Information/Discussion/Action to approve submission of renewal for Grantee Agreement No. GRA-RC029-19-0935-01-Y2 between the San Carlos Apache Regional Partnership Council, Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board (First Things First) and the Gila County Library District in the amount of \$70,000 for fiscal year July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020. (Motion to adjourn as the Gila County Library District Board of Directors and reconvene as the Gila County Board of Supervisors.)

Ms. Sanders clarified that the First Things First program has been in effect in Gila County since 2011. In 2013, the County added the San Carlos region so that all children (birth to age 5) in Gila County have the option to participate in the program. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously approved the submission of Grantee Agreement No. GRA-RC029-19-0935-01-Y2.

Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Cline, seconded by Supervisor Martin, the Board unanimously adjourned as the Gila County Library District Board of Directors and reconvened as the Gila County Board of Supervisors.

J. Information/Discussion/Action to approve the list of fiscal year 2019-20 capital projects for planning purposes including site development and engineering and architectural design services.

Mr. Menlove explained that the County has several significant existing and new facility needs. A list of the capital improvement projects was initially presented by Mr. Menlove to the Board of Supervisors two weeks ago. This discussion is to authorize staff to begin the planning process for planning the capital projects including site development and engineering, and architectural designs. This approval is for only the planning process of these projects. Individual projects will be brought before the Board in accordance with County policies. Mr. Menlove proceeded to review the proposed capital improvement projects. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously approved the list of FY 2019-2020 capital projects as presented and attached to this agenda item.

K. Information/Discussion/Action to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement Regarding the Exercise of Power for the Operation of Arizona and New Mexico Counties (Coalition) for Stable Economic Growth that expires December 31, 2025, to once again become a voting member of the Coalition.

Mr. Menlove advised that he submitted this agenda item late in the agenda submittal process, so the County Attorney's Office has not had enough time to review the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) and offer an opinion for approval or disapproval. Mr. Menlove suggested that the Board may want to table this item to the next regular Board meeting, which is May 7, 2019.

Supervisor Martin and Vice-Chairman Cline commented on their involvement in the Coalition. Vice-Chairman Cline has been representing Gila County on the Coalition for the past two years. The history of Gila County's involvement in the Coalition is as follows: Gila County joined the Coalition in 1994 and began paying membership dues each year up through 2019. Beginning 1994 through 2016, Gila County was a voting member on the Coalition. In 2016, Gila County stopped being a voting member because the IGA was not signed by Gila County. On July 1, 2016, four counties in Arizona and eight counties in New Mexico entered into the IGA to coordinate mutual efforts to preserve and protect the viability of local economies and to take legal or other steps necessary to protect local economies in rural counties of Arizona and New Mexico. At that time, Gila County, Sierra County and Rio Arriba County did not execute the IGA; however, Sierra County and Rio Arriba County are in the process of getting the IGA signed. The term of the IGA began on April 1, 2016, and expires on December 31, 2025.

Vice-Chairman Cline and Supervisor Martin each commented that it is important for Gila County to once again become a voting member of the Coalition; therefore, they recommended executing this IGA. Chairman Humphrey expressed a concern that an opinion has not yet been offered by the County Attorney's (C.A.'s) Office and he is reluctant to approve this IGA until the C.A.'s opinion is presented to the Board. Upon motion by Supervisor Martin, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cline, the Board unanimously tabled this agenda item to its May 7th Regular Meeting.

L. Information/Discussion/Action to authorize the Chairman's signature on letters of support to Arizona House of Representatives District 8 members David Cook and T.J. Shope, Arizona Senate District 8-member Frank Pratt for Elected Officials Retirement Plan debt relief and for increased investment in transportation infrastructure.

Mr. Menlove stated that he submitted this agenda item late in the agenda process, so there was insufficient time for the County Attorney's Office to review the letters of support and issue an opinion for approval or disapproval. Mr. Menlove cited the reasons for issuing the letters of support. Supervisor Martin suggested that each Board member send their own letter of support to each House Representative and Senator instead of one letter from the Board of Supervisors. Without receiving an opinion from the County Attorney's Office, Vice-Chairman Cline and Chairman Humphrey were hesitant to approve the letters. Jefferson Dalton, Chief Deputy County Attorney, Civil Bureau Chief, commented that the County Attorney's Office statutory responsibility is to advise the Board of Supervisors if the Board asks for an opinion. With regard to this agenda item, Mr. Dalton stated that the County Attorney's Office has not had enough time to review the letters and offer an opinion of approval or disapproval to the Board. Mr. Menlove commented that the letters were timesensitive. Given that fact, each Board member commented that it would be best to send individual letters of support. No action was taken on this agenda item.

Adam Shepherd stated that every year during the second week of April, Sheriff's Office (S.O.) telecommunications personnel are honored, so he wanted to bring attention to those working in the S.O. Dispatch Center. He invited the Board and the public to take a tour of the Dispatch Center.

Item 7 - At any time during this meeting pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.02(K), members of the Board of Supervisors and the County Manager may present a brief summary of current events. No action may be taken on information presented.

Supervisor Martin advised that she did not have any current events to present. Supervisors Humphrey and Cline, and the County Manager presented a summary of current events.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Supervisors, Chairman Humphrey adjourned the meeting at 12:18 p.m.
