For example, the Fossil Creek recreational area alone has exploded in popularity with nearly 38,000 visitors last year. The upper portions of the Creek are in Gila County. Three forest service roads to areas of visitor activity have deteriorated to the point that two are accessible only by a UTV. The Sheriff's Office does not have a UTV for the northern part of the county. Currently, access is obtained by a deputy on foot, or by horseback, and requires 2 hours of travel time. The third road is often questionable for full sized patrol vehicles, and when it cannot be traveled by a patrol vehicle, deputies must drive highway 260 to reach the water fall trail head from the Camp Verde side. It's a 40-mile, 2 hour drive time. Losing valuable life saving time in the process.

The requested UTV will be an essential piece of equipment that will substantially improve the Sheriff's Office ability to effectively patrol forest roads and trails in Gila County and will greatly reduce response times. It will provide a critical communications component with the installation of a 40 watt radio that can transmit out of the canyons where portable radios cannot.

In my role as State Senator for Legislative District 6 and as a member of the Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee, I am aware of the large volume of visitors – more than 20,000 in 2019 - to Fossil Creek and its surrounding recreational area. Since Fossil Creek is also located within my legislative district, Gila County Sheriff Adam Shepherd advises me that this number of visitors creates a substantial additional workload on his patrol deputies.

I have been advised that there are three roads which have, in the past, allowed convenient access by patrol vehicles to the Fossil Creek area. Unfortunately, these roads have deteriorated to the point that a UTV is now required for deputies to patrol and respond to emergencies in the Fossil Creek area. If one of these access roads is closed to a full-sized patrol vehicle, deputies must then drive a 40-mile, 2-hour-plus drive on Highway 260 to reach the trailhead from the Camp Verde side.

The Gila County Sheriff's office is also responsible for all rescue operations in Gila County and needs the ability to respond with a UTV to support those life-saving operations in certain areas.

The Superior Court is requesting the Board of Supervisors' approval on its Fiscal Year 2021 Field Trainer Grant Application.

Background Information

The Field Trainer program is a cooperative endeavor between the Administrative Office of the Courts ("AOC") and County trial courts. A Field Trainer is a full time, a co-funded position designed to provide field support and training to various courts. The Field Trainer acts as a liaison with the AOC and delivers specific pertinent information to court managers and staff about forthcoming automation initiatives and projects.

Evaluation

The Gila County courts, at all levels, continue to experience the introduction of important and intensive automation projects. The AOC recently launched "AZPOINT", a new platform for the filing of protective orders. Additionally, the "eFiling" system has been expanded out to additional case types greatly increasing the capacity for digital document filings. The corresponding component, "eBench" has similarly been expanded. The Superior Court believes that a Field Trainer will greatly assist with diffusing the necessary knowledge and conducting the appropriate training to ensure the successful implementation of these items. Additionally, the Field Trainer serves as the County (Courts') Training Coordinator and is responsible for presenting training opportunities for all staff to comply with the continuing judicial education mandate, "COJET". Lastly, the Filed Trainer also serves as a conduit to provide feedback and requests for assistance to the State-level.

The AOC provides \$25,000 of funding for salary and ERE of the position and the position has been incorporated into the Courts' Coordinated Budget since FY2018. Due to the retirement of the incumbent Field Trainer, and the hiring of a new Field Trainer, the County's contribution will be approximately \$4,000 less than in previous years.

<u>Conclusion</u>

Given the ongoing automation demands of the courts, the Superior Court would like to continue the position of Field Trainer to coordinate training and support.

Recommendation

The Superior Court recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the fiscal year 2021 Field Trainer Grant Application that will be submitted to the Court Services Division, AOC.

Background Information

Turner Hill Road begins at SR 288 and at the west boundary of parcel 305-26-002D as a primitive road. The road is in the community of Young.

Evaluation

Turner Hill Road meets the requirements of Public Works Policy No. PWS-001 "Guidelines to Primitive Roads" which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on Oct. 3, 2003, revised on December 1, 2004, and revised again on February 19, 2019.

Conclusion

Easements from property owners will need to be granted to Gila County. Once the easements are accepted by the County, providing maintenance as described in the Primitive Road Policy will consist of grading the road a few times a year. Providing maintenance on this road will not reduce the level of service to other roads in the Gila County Maintained Roadway System.

Recommendation

The Gila County Public Works Director recommends that the Board adopt Resolution No. 20-06-01 accepting the grants of roadway deeds for Turner Hill Road.





Background Information

Currently, the funeral homes are used to transport deceased persons from their location to the location where the autopsy will be performed. There are no current contracts in place identifying pricing and availability. In order to secure the service when needed, it is the desire of the County to enter into service contracts that provide specific costs and are deemed in the best interest of the County. Proposals were publicly opened on May 13, 2020, and 2 responsive and responsible proposals were received from ATOZEN, LLC DBA Sanders Transport and Lamont Mortuary of Globe.

Evaluation

The transport service is necessary and required to transport deceased persons when an autopsy is necessary as determined by the County Attorney. Negotiated contracts need to be in place to secure pricing for a specified period. Of the proposals evaluated the following proposals were deemed the best overall value for Gila County based on pricing and geographical location to provide services. Award contract to ATOZEN, LLC DBA Sanders Transport for the following areas: Gisela, Globe, Hayden, Miami, Payson, Pine-Strawberry, Punkin Center, Rye, Star Valley, Winkelman, and other locations within Gila County. Award contract to Lamont Mortuary of Globe for the following areas: Roosevelt, San Carlos, Tonto Basin, Young.

Conclusion

It is in the best interest of the County to award contracts to provide autopsy transport services as required.

<u>Recommendation</u> Staff recommends approval.

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<u>INTENT</u>

INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR: Transport for Autopsy Services

INTENT:

Gila County has entered into a contract with the Pinal County Medical Examiner's Office for autopsy services. The purpose of this request for bids is to establish pricing for transportation of deceased persons when an autopsy is determined to be necessary by the County Attorney.

For the purposes of this Request for Proposal, "Contractor" is defined as an individual or an entity who submits a bid.

SCOPE OF WORK:

Transport for Autopsy Services

Contractor Responsibility:

Contractor must adhere to the following:

A. After the deceased has been classified as a Medical Examiner's case, the Contractor will pick up and transport the deceased person(s) from the public way, private residences, businesses, hospitals, and other such locations as required.

Note: The Respondent must not subcontract the transport of deceased persons. Respondent's proposal will be deemed non-responsive and rejected if proposal shows that Respondent has subcontracted the transport of any deceased person.

B. Entry on or into a death scene location must be approved only after clearance by law enforcement personnel in charge of the investigation. The Contractor must exercise extreme caution in its attempts to avoid disturbing such scenes and will remain on such locations as briefly as possible.

C. Once a transport has begun, Contractor will be prohibited from stopping at any other location, except for purposes of having a decedent pronounced dead, while enroute to the Medical Examiner's Office at Pinal County ME, 570 West Adamsville Road, Florence, Arizona 85132.

D. Extreme caution must be used when transporting deceased persons to minimize post-mortem trauma to the body.

E. While transporting the deceased, the Contractor will be prohibited from using filming or taping devices of any kind including, but not limited to, cameras, video cameras, audio recorders, or the like.

F. Deceased persons must be transported one at a time. In certain circumstances, a maximum of two (2) bodies can be transported from the same incident/scene with the approval of the Medical Examiner and the investigating officer on the scene, and only if ample room in the transport vehicle exists. Under no circumstances will one body be stacked atop another. At no time will a deceased person from different incidents/scenes be transported together.

G. When a situation occurs in which the maximum of two (2) deceased persons from the same incident/scene are transported together, a tagging system must be used to keep identification of the decedents correct.

H. Contractor will be required to witness an inventory of any evidence or personal effects, including but not limited to any and all medications which may be brought in with the body. Both the Medical Examiner and the Contractor must sign the inventory sheet, certifying the contents.

I. Contractor, or any director, stockholder, officer of, partner to, principal employee of, or any member of any of their immediate families must never refer, "steer, or lead" any persons to their own or any other funeral homes, attorneys, or florist shops.

J. Vehicles must be suitable for the task of transporting deceased persons (panel vans, hearse-type vehicles).

K. Vehicles must be properly insured and equipped with working theft-prevention devices. All vehicles and equipment required to perform under this contract must meet Federal, State, and City requirements (including all OSHA regulations) at a minimum prior to commencement of operations and during the term of the contract.

L. Any vehicle to be used by the Contractor must have a valid Arizona State license plate.

M. All Contractors' employees transporting deceased persons must have valid state driver's licenses. Proof of issuance must be provided at time of award of the contract and at any time during the contract, upon request by the County.

N. Contractor must submit their training protocol for employees that transport deceased persons.

O. The Contractor and their employees are prohibited from conveying any information in any way to the family of the deceased, the media, attorneys or their agents, or medical personnel in relation to or about their services for the County and Medical Examiner's cases. Contractor must not distribute, leave, or supply information about their services at any scene, residence, or hospital where they are called to transport deceased persons for the County or the Medical Examiner.

P. The Contractor must have a contact person able to understand and communicate in spoken and written English available, twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week three hundred sixty five (365) days a year. Contact person must know the geography of the County, and the standard operating requirements of the Sheriff's Office, Police Departments and Medical Examiner's Office.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Qualifying experience includes: Ability to respond to requests for services 24/7, 365 days per week with appropriate trained personnel and equipment to transport deceased individuals for autopsy services.

Laws and Ordinances

This agreement shall be governed and enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona and Gila County. Contractor shall maintain in current status all federal, state and local licenses and permits required for the operation of the business conducted by the Contractor. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and applicable federal regulations under the act.

EXHIBIT "B" CONTRACT AWARD AGREEMENT

This exhibit shall serve as an example of the contract agreement to any Contractor, its agents, subcontractors, or representatives, awarded this or any portion of this contract by the county, i.e. by submitting proposals to this solicitation requiring sealed proposals, it does hereby agree to the following provisions. Proof of acceptance of these provisions will be the Contractor's signature(s) appearing on all forms contained on pages 21 through 30.

Overcharges by Antitrust Violations

The county maintains that, in actual practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are borne by the purchaser. Therefore, to the extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby assigns to the county any and all claims for such overcharges as to the goods or services used to fulfill the contract.

Authority to Contract

This contract shall be based upon the request for proposal issued by the county and the offer submitted by the Contractor in response to the IFB. The offer shall substantially conform to the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements set forth within the text of the IFB. The county reserves the right to clarify any contractual terms with the concurrence of the Contractor; however, any substantial non-conformity in the offer, as determined by the County Attorney, shall be deemed non-responsive and the offer rejected. The contract shall contain the entire agreement between Gila County and the Contractor relating to these requirements and shall prevail over any and all previous agreements, contracts, proposals, negotiations, purchase orders, or master agreement in any form. The contract activity is issued under the authority of the Gila County Board of Supervisors. No alteration of any portion of the contract, any items or services awarded, or any other agreement that is based upon this contract may be made without express written approval of Gila County in the form of an official contract amendment. Any attempt to alter any documents on the part of the Contractor or any agency is a violation of the county procurement code. Any such action is subject to the legal and contractual remedies available to the county inclusive, but not limited to, contract cancellation, suspension and debarment of the Contractor.

Contract Amendments

The contract shall be modified only by a written contract amendment signed by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and persons duly authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Contractor.

Contract Default

- A. The county, by written notice of default to the Contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this contract in any one of the following circumstances:
 - 1. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the supplies or deliverables, or to perform the services within the times specified; or
 - 2. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract; and fails to remedy the situation within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice.
- B. In the event the county terminates this contract in whole or part, the county may procure supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the county for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services.

Right to Assurance

Whenever one party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, the other party may demand that the other party give a written assurance of this intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made, and no written assurance is given within five (5) days, the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this contract.

Co-op Use of Contract – Intergovernmental Purchasing

Gila County has entered into an active purchasing agreement with other political subdivisions, cities, and towns of the State of Arizona in order to conserve resources, reduce procurement costs and improve timely acquisition and cost of supplies, equipment and services. The Contractor to whom this contract is awarded may be requested by other parties of said active purchasing agreements to extend to those parties the right to purchase supplies, equipment, and services provided by the Contractor under this contract, pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any such usage by other entities must be in accord with the rules and regulations of the respective entity and the approval of the Contractor.

Cancellation of County Contracts

This contract is subject to the cancellation provisions of A.R.S. §38-511.

Termination of Contract

The county, with or without cause, may terminate this contract at any time by mutual written consent, or by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor. The county at its convenience, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part. If this contract is terminated, the county shall be liable only for payment under the payment provisions of this contract for the services rendered and accepted material received by the county before the effective date of termination.

The county reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of this contract due to failure of the Contractor to carry out any term, promise, or condition of the contract. The county will issue a written ten (10) day notice of default to Contractor for acting or failing to act as in any of the following:

- 1. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to perform adequately the stipulations, conditions or services and specifications required in the contract.
- 2. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor attempts to impose on the county material products, or workmanship, for services which are of unacceptable quality.
- 3. Contractor fails to furnish the required service or product within the time stipulated in the contract.
- 4. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the requirements of the contract or give the county a positive indication that Contractor will perform to the requirements of the contract.

Each payment obligation of the county created hereby is conditioned upon the availability of county, state and federal funds, which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation.

Contract Award Agreement continued...

If funds are not allocated by the county and available for the continuance of service herein contemplated, the contract period for the service may be terminated by the county at the end of the period for which funds are available. The county shall notify the Contractor at the earliest possible time which service may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the county in the event this provision is exercised, and the county shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this paragraph.

Indemnification Clause

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County of Gila and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such Contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee be indemnified by Contractor from and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs.

General

After receipt of all proposals, each submittal shall be screened to determine if any shall be deemed non-responsive. Unsigned proposals, unacknowledged addenda, incomplete proposals, non-conformance with mandatory requirements, etc., may result in the determination of non-responsive.

Subsequent to the initial review, all remaining proposals shall be reviewed by the Gila County Finance Department to evaluate the information submitted, perform tests when necessary and make comparisons in order to approve or reject the request. If rejected, the purchasing department shall give written notice to the bidder submitting this request.

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INTENT

INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR: Transport for Autopsy Services

INTENT:

Gila County has entered into a contract with the Pinal County Medical Examiner's Office for autopsy services. The purpose of this request for bids is to establish pricing for transportation of deceased persons when an autopsy is determined to be necessary by the County Attorney.

For the purposes of this Request for Proposal, "Contractor" is defined as an individual or an entity who submits a bid.

SCOPE OF WORK:

Transport for Autopsy Services

Contractor Responsibility:

Contractor must adhere to the following:

A. After the deceased has been classified as a Medical Examiner's case, the Contractor will pick up and transport the deceased person(s) from the public way, private residences, businesses, hospitals, and other such locations as required.

Note: The Respondent must not subcontract the transport of deceased persons. Respondent's proposal will be deemed non-responsive and rejected if proposal shows that Respondent has subcontracted the transport of any deceased person.

B. Entry on or into a death scene location must be approved only after clearance by law enforcement personnel in charge of the investigation. The Contractor must exercise extreme caution in its attempts to avoid disturbing such scenes and will remain on such locations as briefly as possible.

C. Once a transport has begun, Contractor will be prohibited from stopping at any other location, except for purposes of having a decedent pronounced dead, while enroute to the Medical Examiner's Office at Pinal County ME, 570 West Adamsville Road, Florence, Arizona 85132.

D. Extreme caution must be used when transporting deceased persons to minimize post-mortem trauma to the body.

E. While transporting the deceased, the Contractor will be prohibited from using filming or taping devices of any kind including, but not limited to, cameras, video cameras, audio recorders, or the like.

F. Deceased persons must be transported one at a time. In certain circumstances, a maximum of two (2) bodies can be transported from the same incident/scene with the approval of the Medical Examiner and the investigating officer on the scene, and only if ample room in the transport vehicle exists. Under no circumstances will one body be stacked atop another. At no time will a deceased person from different incidents/scenes be transported together.

G. When a situation occurs in which the maximum of two (2) deceased persons from the same incident/scene are transported together, a tagging system must be used to keep identification of the decedents correct.

H. Contractor will be required to witness an inventory of any evidence or personal effects, including but not limited to any and all medications which may be brought in with the body. Both the Medical Examiner and the Contractor must sign the inventory sheet, certifying the contents.

I. Contractor, or any director, stockholder, officer of, partner to, principal employee of, or any member of any of their immediate families must never refer, "steer, or lead" any persons to their own or any other funeral homes, attorneys, or florist shops.

J. Vehicles must be suitable for the task of transporting deceased persons (panel vans, hearse-type vehicles).

K. Vehicles must be properly insured and equipped with working theft-prevention devices. All vehicles and equipment required to perform under this contract must meet Federal, State, and City requirements (including all OSHA regulations) at a minimum prior to commencement of operations and during the term of the contract.

L. Any vehicle to be used by the Contractor must have a valid Arizona State license plate.

M. All Contractors' employees transporting deceased persons must have valid state driver's licenses. Proof of issuance must be provided at time of award of the contract and at any time during the contract, upon request by the County.

N. Contractor must submit their training protocol for employees that transport deceased persons.

O. The Contractor and their employees are prohibited from conveying any information in any way to the family of the deceased, the media, attorneys or their agents, or medical personnel in relation to or about their services for the County and Medical Examiner's cases. Contractor must not distribute, leave, or supply information about their services at any scene, residence, or hospital where they are called to transport deceased persons for the County or the Medical Examiner.

P. The Contractor must have a contact person able to understand and communicate in spoken and written English available, twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week three hundred sixty five (365) days a year. Contact person must know the geography of the County, and the standard operating requirements of the Sheriff's Office, Police Departments and Medical Examiner's Office.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Qualifying experience includes: Ability to respond to requests for services 24/7, 365 days per week with appropriate trained personnel and equipment to transport deceased individuals for autopsy services.

 - a. Notwithstanding any other provisions of the IFB, the county reserves the right to:
 - 1. Waive any immaterial defects or informalities; or
 - 2. Reject any or all proposals; or portions thereof; or
 - 3. Reissue a request for proposal.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the Gila County Board of Supervisors to let the county contracts to the lowest responsive and responsible Contractor(s). To ensure that all Contractors are experienced, reasonably equipped and adequately financed to meet their contractual obligations, a determination of responsibility shall be made by the Gila County Board of Supervisors prior to contract award.

Laws and Ordinances

This agreement shall be governed and enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona and Gila County. Contractor shall maintain in current status all federal, state and local licenses and permits required for the operation of the business conducted by the Contractor. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and applicable federal regulations under the act.

EXHIBIT "B" CONTRACT AWARD AGREEMENT

This exhibit shall serve as an example of the contract agreement to any Contractor, its agents, subcontractors, or representatives, awarded this or any portion of this contract by the county, i.e. by submitting proposals to this solicitation requiring sealed proposals, it does hereby agree to the following provisions. Proof of acceptance of these provisions will be the Contractor's signature(s) appearing on all forms contained on pages 21 through 30.

Overcharges by Antitrust Violations

The county maintains that, in actual practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are borne by the purchaser. Therefore, to the extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby assigns to the county any and all claims for such overcharges as to the goods or services used to fulfill the contract.

Authority to Contract

This contract shall be based upon the request for proposal issued by the county and the offer submitted by the Contractor in response to the IFB. The offer shall substantially conform to the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements set forth within the text of the IFB. The county reserves the right to clarify any contractual terms with the concurrence of the Contractor; however, any substantial non-conformity in the offer, as determined by the County Attorney, shall be deemed non-responsive and the offer rejected. The contract shall contain the entire agreement between Gila County and the Contractor relating to these requirements and shall prevail over any and all previous agreements, contracts, proposals, negotiations, purchase orders, or master agreement in any form. The contract activity is issued under the authority of the Gila County Board of Supervisors. No alteration of any portion of the contract, any items or services awarded, or any other agreement that is based upon this contract may be made without express written approval of Gila County in the form of an official contract amendment. Any attempt to alter any documents on the part of the Contractor or any agency is a violation of the county procurement code. Any such action is subject to the legal and contractual remedies available to the county inclusive, but not limited to, contract cancellation, suspension and debarment of the Contractor.

Contract Amendments

The contract shall be modified only by a written contract amendment signed by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and persons duly authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Contractor.

Contract Default

- A. The county, by written notice of default to the Contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this contract in any one of the following circumstances:
 - 1. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the supplies or deliverables, or to perform the services within the times specified; or
 - 2. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract; and fails to remedy the situation within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice.
- B. In the event the county terminates this contract in whole or part, the county may procure supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the county for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services.

Right to Assurance

Whenever one party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, the other party may demand that the other party give a written assurance of this intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made, and no written assurance is given within five (5) days, the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this contract.

Co-op Use of Contract – Intergovernmental Purchasing

Gila County has entered into an active purchasing agreement with other political subdivisions, cities, and towns of the State of Arizona in order to conserve resources, reduce procurement costs and improve timely acquisition and cost of supplies, equipment and services. The Contractor to whom this contract is awarded may be requested by other parties of said active purchasing agreements to extend to those parties the right to purchase supplies, equipment, and services provided by the Contractor under this contract, pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any such usage by other entities must be in accord with the rules and regulations of the respective entity and the approval of the Contractor.

Cancellation of County Contracts

This contract is subject to the cancellation provisions of A.R.S. §38-511.

Termination of Contract

The county, with or without cause, may terminate this contract at any time by mutual written consent, or by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor. The county at its convenience, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part. If this contract is terminated, the county shall be liable only for payment under the payment provisions of this contract for the services rendered and accepted material received by the county before the effective date of termination.

The county reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of this contract due to failure of the Contractor to carry out any term, promise, or condition of the contract. The county will issue a written ten (10) day notice of default to Contractor for acting or failing to act as in any of the following:

- 1. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to perform adequately the stipulations, conditions or services and specifications required in the contract.
- 2. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor attempts to impose on the county material products, or workmanship, for services which are of unacceptable quality.
- 3. Contractor fails to furnish the required service or product within the time stipulated in the contract.
- 4. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the requirements of the contract or give the county a positive indication that Contractor will perform to the requirements of the contract.

Each payment obligation of the county created hereby is conditioned upon the availability of county, state and federal funds, which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation.

Contract Award Agreement continued...

If funds are not allocated by the county and available for the continuance of service herein contemplated, the contract period for the service may be terminated by the county at the end of the period for which funds are available. The county shall notify the Contractor at the earliest possible time which service may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the county in the event this provision is exercised, and the county shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this paragraph.

Indemnification Clause

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County of Gila and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such Contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs.

General

After receipt of all proposals, each submittal shall be screened to determine if any shall be deemed non-responsive. Unsigned proposals, unacknowledged addenda, incomplete proposals, non-conformance with mandatory requirements, etc., may result in the determination of non-responsive.

Subsequent to the initial review, all remaining proposals shall be reviewed by the Gila County Finance Department to evaluate the information submitted, perform tests when necessary and make comparisons in order to approve or reject the request. If rejected, the purchasing department shall give written notice to the bidder submitting this request.

The county does not warrant that the minimum limits contained herein are sufficient to protect the Contractor from liabilities that might arise out of the performance of the work under this contract by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors and Contractor may purchase additional insurance as may be determined necessary.

 - 2 The Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance and non-contributory with respect to all other available sources.

INTENT:

Gila County has entered into a contract with the Pinal County Medical Examiner's Office for autopsy services. The purpose of this request for bids is to establish pricing for transportation of deceased persons when an autopsy is determined to be necessary by the County Attorney.

For the purposes of this Request for Proposal, "Contractor" is defined as an individual or an entity who submits a bid.

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SCOPE OF WORK:

Transport for Autopsy Services

Contractor Responsibility:

Contractor must adhere to the following:

A. After the deceased has been classified as a Medical Examiner's case, the Contractor will pick up and transport the deceased person(s) from the public way, private residences, businesses, hospitals, and other such locations as required.

Note: The Respondent must not subcontract the transport of deceased persons. Respondent's proposal will be deemed non-responsive and rejected if proposal shows that Respondent has subcontracted the transport of any deceased person.

B. Entry on or into a death scene location must be approved only after clearance by law enforcement personnel in charge of the investigation. The Contractor must exercise extreme caution in its attempts to avoid disturbing such scenes and will remain on such locations as briefly as possible.

C. Once a transport has begun, Contractor will be prohibited from stopping at any other location, except for purposes of having a decedent pronounced dead, while enroute to the Medical Examiner's Office at Pinal County ME, 570 West Adamsville Road, Florence, Arizona 85132.

D. Extreme caution must be used when transporting deceased persons to minimize post-mortem trauma to the body.

E. While transporting the deceased, the Contractor will be prohibited from using filming or taping devices of any kind including, but not limited to, cameras, video cameras, audio recorders, or the like.

F. Deceased persons must be transported one at a time. In certain circumstances, a maximum of two (2) bodies can be transported from the same incident/scene with the approval of the Medical Examiner and the investigating officer on the scene, and only if ample room in the transport vehicle exists. Under no circumstances will one body be stacked atop another. At no time will a deceased person from different incidents/scenes be transported together.

G. When a situation occurs in which the maximum of two (2) deceased persons from the same incident/scene are transported together, a tagging system must be used to keep identification of the decedents correct.

H. Contractor will be required to witness an inventory of any evidence or personal effects, including but not limited to any and all medications which may be brought in with the body. Both the Medical Examiner and the Contractor must sign the inventory sheet, certifying the contents.

I. Contractor, or any director, stockholder, officer of, partner to, principal employee of, or any member of any of their immediate families must never refer, "steer, or lead" any persons to their own or any other funeral homes, attorneys, or florist shops.

J. Vehicles must be suitable for the task of transporting deceased persons (panel vans, hearse-type vehicles).

K. Vehicles must be properly insured and equipped with working theft-prevention devices. All vehicles and equipment required to perform under this contract must meet Federal, State, and City requirements (including all OSHA regulations) at a minimum prior to commencement of operations and during the term of the contract.

L. Any vehicle to be used by the Contractor must have a valid Arizona State license plate.

M. All Contractors' employees transporting deceased persons must have valid state driver's licenses. Proof of issuance must be provided at time of award of the contract and at any time during the contract, upon request by the County.

O. The Contractor and their employees are prohibited from conveying any information in any way to the family of the deceased, the media, attorneys or their agents, or medical personnel in relation to or about their services for the County and Medical Examiner's cases. Contractor must not distribute, leave, or supply information about their services at any scene, residence, or hospital where they are called to transport deceased persons for the County or the Medical Examiner.

P. Laws and Ordinances

This agreement shall be governed and enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona and Gila County. Contractor shall maintain in current status all federal, state and local licenses and permits required for the operation of the business conducted by the Contractor. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and applicable federal regulations under the act.

EXHIBIT "B" CONTRACT AWARD AGREEMENT

This exhibit shall serve as an example of the contract agreement to any Contractor, its agents, subcontractors, or representatives, awarded this or any portion of this contract by the county, i.e. by submitting proposals to this solicitation requiring sealed proposals, it does hereby agree to the following provisions. Proof of acceptance of these provisions will be the Contractor's signature(s) appearing on all forms contained on pages 21 through 30.

Overcharges by Antitrust Violations

The county maintains that, in actual practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are borne by the purchaser. Therefore, to the extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby assigns to the county any and all claims for such overcharges as to the goods or services used to fulfill the contract.

Authority to Contract

This contract shall be based upon the request for proposal issued by the county and the offer submitted by the Contractor in response to the IFB. The offer shall substantially conform to the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements set forth within the text of the IFB. The county reserves the right to clarify any contractual terms with the concurrence of the Contractor; however, any substantial non-conformity in the offer, as determined by the County Attorney, shall be deemed non-responsive and the offer rejected. The contract shall contain the entire agreement between Gila County and the Contractor relating to these requirements and shall prevail over any and all previous agreements, contracts, proposals, negotiations, purchase orders, or master agreement in any form. The contract activity is issued under the authority of the Gila County Board of Supervisors. No alteration of any portion of the contract, any items or services awarded, or any other agreement that is based upon this contract may be made without express written approval of Gila County in the form of an official contract amendment. Any attempt to alter any documents on the part of the Contractor or any agency is a violation of the county procurement code. Any such action is subject to the legal and contractual remedies available to the county inclusive, but not limited to, contract cancellation, suspension and debarment of the Contractor.

Contract Amendments

The contract shall be modified only by a written contract amendment signed by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and persons duly authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Contractor.

Contract Default

- A. The county, by written notice of default to the Contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this contract in any one of the following circumstances:
 - 1. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the supplies or deliverables, or to perform the services within the times specified; or
 - 2. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract; and fails to remedy the situation within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice.
- B. In the event the county terminates this contract in whole or part, the county may procure supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the county for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services.

Right to Assurance

Whenever one party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, the other party may demand that the other party give a written assurance of this intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made, and no written assurance is given within five (5) days, the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this contract.

Co-op Use of Contract – Intergovernmental Purchasing

Gila County has entered into an active purchasing agreement with other political subdivisions, cities, and towns of the State of Arizona in order to conserve resources, reduce procurement costs and improve timely acquisition and cost of supplies, equipment and services. The Contractor to whom this contract is awarded may be requested by other parties of said active purchasing agreements to extend to those parties the right to purchase supplies, equipment, and services provided by the Contractor under this contract, pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any such usage by other entities must be in accord with the rules and regulations of the respective entity and the approval of the Contractor.

Cancellation of County Contracts

This contract is subject to the cancellation provisions of A.R.S. §38-511.

Termination of Contract

The county, with or without cause, may terminate this contract at any time by mutual written consent, or by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor. The county at its convenience, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part. If this contract is terminated, the county shall be liable only for payment under the payment provisions of this contract for the services rendered and accepted material received by the county before the effective date of termination.

The county reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of this contract due to failure of the Contractor to carry out any term, promise, or condition of the contract. The county will issue a written ten (10) day notice of default to Contractor for acting or failing to act as in any of the following:

- 1. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to perform adequately the stipulations, conditions or services and specifications required in the contract.
- 2. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor attempts to impose on the county material products, or workmanship, for services which are of unacceptable quality.
- 3. Contractor fails to furnish the required service or product within the time stipulated in the contract.
- 4. In the opinion of the county, the Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the requirements of the contract or give the county a positive indication that Contractor will perform to the requirements of the contract.

Each payment obligation of the county created hereby is conditioned upon the availability of county, state and federal funds, which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation.

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Contract Award Agreement continued...

If funds are not allocated by the county and available for the continuance of service herein contemplated, the contract period for the service may be terminated by the county at the end of the period for which funds are available. The county shall notify the Contractor at the earliest possible time which service may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the county in the event this provision is exercised, and the county shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this paragraph.

Indemnification Clause

It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee, be indemnified by Contractor from and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs.

General

After receipt of all proposals, each submittal shall be screened to determine if any shall be deemed non-responsive. Unsigned proposals, unacknowledged addenda, incomplete proposals, non-conformance with mandatory requirements, etc., may result in the determination of non-responsive.

Subsequent to the initial review, all remaining proposals shall be reviewed by the Gila County Finance Department to evaluate the information submitted, perform tests when necessary and make comparisons in order to approve or reject the request. If rejected, the purchasing department shall give written notice to the bidder submitting this request.

Proposal Pricing & Term

INTENT:

The purpose of this request is to establish a contract with a pharmacy to provide prescription and overthe-counter medications; and to streamline the process for purchasing and ordering medication.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The Contractor shall:

- Contractor must provide service for essential medications 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This includes weekends, holidays and after hours.
- Contractor must have an emergency notification system, must be available after hours, and must return
 calls within one hour to either the Jail or the local hospital Emergency Department for medication orders
 for jail inmates.
- Orders placed by phone/fax/internet must be ready for delivery and available within a minimum of four hours from the time the order is placed if medically indicated. Contractor will deliver, or arrange delivery of, all medications to Gila County Jail.
- An occasional emergency response time of 1 hour from order may be required.
- Orders for medications where the next administered dose is to occur the next day may be delivered the following morning.
- Contractor will label all medications in accordance with Arizona State labeling laws, and in such a manner as to make clear to any persons exactly the method and manner in which the medication is to be administered. This may necessitate including both generic and brand names on medication labels.
- Contractor will use a unit dose system compatible with the Jail medication carts, without any
 modification of the carts or the medication packs. All prescriptions must be in unit dosage form,
 excepting those medications whose construction makes this impossible, or in those instances where

 versions may be requested if they are available.
- Contractor will be required to either pick up or pay for return shipping, for any unused medications that are unit dose packaged. Contractor must provide the Jail health system with a credit for those medications still in their unbroken unit dose bubbles.
- Contractor will perform a quarterly pharmaceutical inspection at the Gila County Jail, either directly or via a contracted pharmacist, contracted by the bidder, and complete a written inspection review form. The areas of inspection shall include a minimum; appropriate storage of medications, including controlled medications and supplies, appropriate records to insure adequate control and accountability for medications, the presence or absence of outdated, discontinued or recalled medication, periodic reviews or stop dates of DEA-controlled or abusable drugs, review and appropriate use of a formulary, and the existence of appropriate policies and procedures for medications which are adequately followed. The inspection review form will be forwarded to, and retained by, the Jail Health Program Supervisor.
- Contractor will submit periodic reports to the Jail Administration, summarizing medication use by the Agency. The frequency and details included in the report will be by mutual agreement.

- 16. The term of the bid will be from when it is signed by the Board of Supervisors and remains in effect for a period of one year from that date, and may be renewed for up to three (3) one-year terms, for a total of four (4) years, by mutual agreement of the parties.
- 17. Either party may withdraw from the agreement with or without cause by providing the other party with 90 days written notice.
- 18. The medical delivery system, including the medication delivery system, must conform to County standards for medical services provided in the Gila County code as set by state law, and with Arizona State law. The system must conform to the most recent edition of the *Standards for Medical Services in Jails*, developed by the National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC).

General Conditions continued...

- 19. The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Gila County Sheriff's Office and it's agents, servants or employees from all claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities arising out of an intentional tort committed as a result of providing medication to the Gila County Jail. Conversely, the Gila County Sheriff's Office shall indemnify and hold harmless the Contractor and it's agents, servants, employees, from all claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments or liabilities arising out of the operation and maintenance of the Gila County Jail, including maintaining security, as well as acts performed by the contractor done in the course of providing medical care for Gila County.
- 20. Standing orders, rules, and regulations of the contractor relating to medical services are generally to established and implemented solely by the contractor. In areas that impact upon the security and general administration of the Gila County Jail, the Policies and Procedures of the contractor are subject to review and approval of the Gila County Sheriff's Office.

It is the intent of Gila County to award a contract to a qualified Contractor for the Pharmacy Services for Gila County Detention Medical.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Award of Contract

- 1. The Gila County Board of Supervisors reserves the right to award any Proposal by individual line item, by group of line items or as total, or any part thereof, whichever is deemed to be in the best interest, most advantageous of the County of Gila.
 - a. Notwithstanding any or other provisions of the RFP, the County reserves the right to:
 - 1. Waive any immaterial defects or informalities; or
 - 2. Reject any or all Proposals; or portions thereof; or
 - 3. Reissue a Request for Proposal.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the Gila County Board of Supervisors to let the County contracts to the lowest responsive and responsible Contractor(s). To ensure that all Contractors are experienced, reasonably equipped and adequately financed to meet their contractual obligations, a determination of responsibility shall be made by the Gila County Board of Supervisors prior to contract award.
- 3. Further, the County reserves the right to reject the Proposal of any Contractor(s) who has previously failed to perform adequately after having once been awarded a prior Proposal for furnishing and installing materials similar in nature.
- 4. All submitted forms provided in this Request for Proposal will be reviewed by the Gila County attorney and Gila County Board of Supervisors.
- 5. Those Contractor(s) who, in the opinion of the Gila County Board of Supervisors, are best qualified and whose Proposals are most advantageous of the County <u>may</u> be invited to appear before the Board for an oral review.
- 6. The apparent successful Contractor shall sign and file with the County, within ten (10) days after Notice of Intent to Award, all documents necessary to successfully execute the contract.

Protests

Only other Contractors who have submitted a bid proposal have the right to protest. A protest of an award must be filed within ten (10) days after the award by the Board of Supervisors. A protest must be in writing and must include the following:

- A. Name, address and telephone number of the protester.
- B. Signature of the protester or its representative, and evidence of authority to sign.
- C. Identification of the contract and the solicitation or contract number.
- D. Detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds of protest including copies of relevant documents.
- E. The form of relief requested.

All protests shall be sent to the attention of the Gila County Board of Supervisors, 1400 East Ash Street, Globe, Arizona 85501.

General Terms & Conditions continued...

Laws and Ordinances

This agreement shall be enforced under the laws of the State of Arizona and Gila County. Contractor shall maintain in current status all Federal, State and Local licenses and permits required for the operation of the business conducted by the Contractor. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and applicable federal regulations under the act.

EXHIBIT "B" CONTRACT AWARD AGREEMENT

This exhibit shall serve as an example of the contract agreement to any Contractor, their agents, subcontractors or representatives, awarded this or any portion of this contract by the County, by submitting Proposals to this or any other solicitation requiring sealed Proposals, does hereby agree to the following provisions. Proof of acceptance of these provisions will be the Contractor's signature(s) appearing on all forms contained on pages 24 through 33.

Overcharges by Antitrust Violations

The County maintains that, in actual practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are borne by the purchaser. Therefore, to the extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby assigns to the County any and all claims for such overcharges as to the goods or services used to fulfill the contract.

Authority to Contract

This contract shall be based upon the Request for Proposal issued by the County and the offer submitted by the Contractor in response to the RFP. The offer shall substantially conform to the terms, conditions, specifications and other requirements set forth within the text of the RFP. The County reserves the right to clarify any contractual terms with the concurrence of the Contractor; however, any substantial non-conformity in the offer, as determined by the County Attorney, shall be deemed non-responsive and the offer rejected. The contract shall contain the entire agreement between Gila County and the Contractor relating to these requirements and shall prevail over any and all previous agreements, contracts, proposals, negotiations, purchase orders, or master agreement in any form. The contract activity is issued under the authority of the Board of Supervisors. No alteration of any portion of the contract, any items or services awarded, or any other agreement that is based upon this contract may be made without express written approval of Gila County in the form of an official contract amendment. Any attempt to alter any documents on the part of the Contractor or any agency is a violation of the County Procurement Code. Any such action is subject to the legal and contractual remedies available to the County inclusive, but not limited to, contract cancellation, suspension and, or debarment of the Contractor.

Contract Amendments

The contract shall be modified only by a written contract amendment signed by the Gila County Board of Supervisors and persons duly authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the Contractor.

Contract Default

- A. The County, by written notice of default to the Contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this contract in any one of the following circumstances:
 - 1. If the Contractor fails to make delivery of the supplies or to perform the services within the times specified; or
 - 2. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract; and fails to remedy the situation within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice.
- B. In the event the County terminates this contract in whole or part, the County may procure supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the County for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services.

Right to Assurance

Whenever one party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, the other party may demand that the other party give a written assurance of this intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made and no written assurance is given within five (5) days, the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this contract.

Co-op Use of Contract – Intergovernmental Purchasing

Gila County has entered into an active purchasing agreement with other political subdivisions, cities, and towns of the State of Arizona in order to conserve resources, reduce procurement costs and improve timely acquisition and cost of supplies, equipment and services. The Contractor to whom this contract is awarded may be requested by other parties of said interactive purchasing agreements to extend to those parties the right to purchase supplies, equipment and services provided by the Contractor under this contract, pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any such usage by other entities must be in accord with the rules and regulations of the respective entity and the approval of the Contractor.

Cancellation of County Contracts

This contract is subject to the cancellation provisions of A.R.S. §38-511.

Termination of Contract

The County, with or without cause, may terminate this contract at any time by mutual written consent, or by giving thirty (30) days written notice to you. The County at its convenience, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part. If this contract is terminated, the County shall be liable only for payment under the payment provisions of this contract for the services rendered and accepted material received by the County before the effective date of termination.

The County reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of this contract due to failure of the Contractor to carry out any term, promise, or condition of the contract. The County will issue a written ten (10) day notice of default to Contractor for acting or failing to act as in any of the following:

- 1. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor fails to perform adequately the stipulations, conditions or services and specifications required in the contract.
- 2. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor attempts to impose on the County material products, or workmanship, which is of unacceptable quality.
- 3. Contractor fails to furnish the required service or product within the time stipulated in the contract.
- 4. In the opinion of the County, the Contractor fails to make progress in the performance of the requirements of the contract or give the County a positive indication that Contractor will not or cannot perform to the requirements of the contract.

Each payment obligation of the County created hereby is conditioned upon the availability of County, State and Federal funds, which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation.

If funds are not allocated by the County and available for the continuance of service herein contemplated, the contract period for the service may be terminated by the County at the end of the period for which funds are available. The County shall notify the Contractor at the earliest possible time which service may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the County in the event this provision is exercised, and the County shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this paragraph.

Indemnification Clause

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the County of Gila and its officers, officials, agents, and employees (hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, damages, losses, or expenses (including court costs, attorneys' fees, and costs of claim processing, investigation and litigation) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") for bodily injury or personal injury (including death), or loss or damage to tangible or intangible property caused, or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor or any of its owners, officers, directors, agents, employees or subcontractors. This indemnity includes any claim or amount arising out of or recovered under the Workers' Compensation Law or arising out of the failure of such Contractor to conform to any federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, rule, regulation or court decree. It is the specific intention of the parties that the Indemnitee shall, in all instances, except for Claims arising solely from the negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Indemnitee and against any and all claims. It is agreed that the Contractor will be responsible for primary loss investigation, defense and judgment costs.

Israel Boycott Certification Clause

Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in and will not, for the duration of this agreement, engage in, a boycott of Israel as defined by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by County up to and including termination of this Agreement.

General

After receipt of all proposals, each submittal shall be screened to determine if any shall be deemed non-responsive. Unsigned proposals, unacknowledged Addenda, incomplete proposals, non-conformance with mandatory requirements, etc., may result in the determination of non-responsive.

Subsequent to the initial review, all remaining proposals shall be reviewed by the Gila County Finance Department to evaluate the information submitted, perform tests when necessary and make comparisons in order to approve or reject the Request. If rejected, the purchasing department shall give written notice to the Bidder submitting this request.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: Contractor and subcontractors shall procure and maintain until all of their obligations have been discharged, including any warranty periods under this Contract are satisfied, insurance against claims for injury to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

The insurance requirements herein are minimum requirements for this Contract and in no way limit the indemnity covenants contained in this Contract. The County in no way warrants that the minimum limits contained herein are sufficient to protect the Contractor from liabilities that might arise out of the performance of the work under this contract by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors and Contractor is free to purchase additional insurance as may be determined necessary.

- A. <u>MINIMUM SCOPE AND LIMITS OF INSURANCE</u>: Contractor shall provide coverage with limits of liability not less than those stated below.

- B. <u>ADDITIONAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>: The policies shall include, or be endorsed to include, the following provisions:
 - 1. On insurance policies where the County of Gila is named as an additional insured, the County of Gila shall be an additional insured to the full limits of liability purchased by the Contractor even if those limits of liability are in excess of those required by this Contract.

 - 3. Coverage provided by the Contractor shall not be limited to the liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract.

Such notice shall be sent directly to Gila County Purchasing Department, 1400 E. Ash St., Globe, AZ, 85501 or and shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- D. <u>ACCEPTABILITY OF INSURERS:</u> Insurance is to be placed with insurers duly licensed or approved unlicensed companies in the state of Arizona and with an "A.M. Best" rating of not less than B+ VI. The County in no way warrants that the above-required minimum insurer rating is sufficient to protect the Contractor from potential insurer insolvency.

E. <u>VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE</u>: Contractor shall furnish the County with certificates of insurance (ACORD form or equivalent approved by the County) as required by this Contract. The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf.

All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. Each insurance policy required by this Contract must be in effect at or prior to commencement of work under this Contract and remain in effect for the duration of the project. Failure to maintain the insurance policies as required by this Contract or to provide evidence of renewal is a material breach of contract.

- F. <u>SUBCONTRACTORS</u>: Contractors' certificate(s) shall include all subcontractors as additional insured's under its policies or Contractor shall furnish to the County separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverage's for subcontractors shall be subject to the minimum requirements identified above.
- G. <u>APPROVAL</u>: Any modification or variation from the insurance requirements in this Contract shall be made by the County Attorney, whose decision shall be final. Such action will not require a formal Contract amendment, but may be made by administrative action.

SECTION 2.0

Drug Price List

- 2.1 This list is based upon the Preferred Drug Formulary used by the Gila County Jail and represents medications commonly prescribed for Gila County Jail inmates. There is an average of 55 prescriptions filled per month.
- 2.2 The quantities and types of medications listed in the bid represent Gila County's estimated requirements. Gila County will be neither obligated by, nor restricted to, the quantity and types of medications listed. The list is provided for bidding purposes only. Gila County reserves the right to update the formulary as medical needs dictate.
- 2.3 All drugs provided shall meet or exceed standard pharmaceutical quality specifications for prescription drugs and medications. Any brands specified in this bid are solely for the purpose of indicating the standard of quality and performance for the intended use.
- 2.4 The County desires the generic form of any drug ordered whenever possible, even when the order is by brand. However, generic brands supplied must be recognized within the industry as standard.
- 2.5 Bidders are requested to provide pricing for this list, based on their pricing as of January 1, 2020. Pricing is to include the pharmacy's cost, the prescription fee, and the total proposed cost to the County for each drug listed. The prescription quoted for each drug is to include all charges to the County over and above the cost of the drug or medication to the supplier. This fee shall be full compensation for the service provided, including all labor, packaging, delivery, tax (except as noted below), overhead, profit margin, and all other costs whatsoever in any way related to the providing of this service to the County.
- 2.6 The Pharmacy Prescription fees quoted will remain unchanged through December 31, 2020. The price of each prescription to the county is to be comprised of cost, plus fees, plus applicable taxes. Upon receipt of a valid invoice, Gila County will pay State Sales Tax as required. For bidding purposes, however, do not include Arizona State Sales Tax in price quoted.

Background Information

On April 15, 2020, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service opened the comment period regarding the preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement Supplement in conjunction with a proposed rule to revise the existing non-essential experimental population designation of the Mexican Wolf under section 10 (j) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 as amended. The comment period closes on June 15, 2020.

Evaluation

The Mexican Wolf issue continues to be a serious concern to Gila County citizens. The revised Rule and Environmental Impact Statement Supplement are being developed by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in response to a court-ordered remand by the District Court of Arizona of the 2015 final rule to revise the nonessential experimental population designation and management of Mexican Wolves in the Mexican Wolf Experimental Population Area in Arizona and New Mexico.

Conclusion

It is important for the Gila County Board of Supervisors to comment on the four topic areas outlined in the Federal Register 50 CFR Part 17 published on April 15, 2020.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Gila County Board of Supervisors approve the prepared comment letter to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.

Dear Sirs and Madams:

General Scoping Comments

The scope of analysis should include:

- 1. Analysis of the economic, physical and mental impacts on ranching families;
- 2. Analysis of the economic impacts on the hunting and guiding and other recreational activities;
- 3. Analysis of the impacts on the game populations in the areas of wolf release and dispersal;
- 4. Analysis of the impacts on allotment owners preexisting surface rights on federal lands.

Issue 2: Cascading from the above impacts to ranching, hunting and guiding and recreational activities has been reductions in direct and indirect tax revenues to the states, tribal and local governments.

The scope of this analysis should include:

- 1. Analysis of the reduction in state and local government tax revenues in New Mexico from the reduction of livestock head taxes;
- 2. Analysis of the reduction state and local government tax revenues from circulating dollars through the loss of ranching operations forced out of business to include feed sales, cattle hauling to market, sales rings, fuel sales, restaurants, and other local businesses;

- 3. Analysis of the reduction state and local government tax revenues from circulating dollars through the reduction of hunting and guiding and recreation opportunities due to impacts on game populations affecting fuel sales, motel revenues, restaurants;
- 4. Analysis of the reduction state and local government tax revenues from circulating dollars through the reduction of recreation opportunities due to forest BLM land closures of developed and dispersal camping affecting restaurants, motels, food and equipment and fuel sales.

Specific Comments Requests on the Narrow Range of Topics

"(1) The benefits or potential impacts to the Mexican wolf or the public and our partners of an "essential" versus "nonessential" designation."

Factors that must be considered by the Secretary in making the finding that the designation will "further the conservation of [the] species" include:

(1) Any possible adverse effects on extant populations of a species as a result of removal of individuals, eggs, or propagules for introduction elsewhere;

(2) The likelihood that any such experimental population will become established and survive in the foreseeable future;

(3) The relative effects that establishment of an experimental population will have on the recovery of the species; and

(4) The extent to which the introduced population may be affected by existing or anticipated Federal or State actions or private activities within or adjacent to the experimental population area.

"Essential" means the experimental population's loss "would be likely to appreciably reduce the likelihood of the survival of the species in the wild." 50 C.F.R. § 17.80(b). All other populations are to be classified as "nonessential." *Id.*

In the 2015 rule FWS reasoned that because the purpose of the 2015 rule is to revise management protocols for an existing population, reconsideration of the population's nonessential status was "outside the scope" of the rulemaking. Gila County concurs with that rationale. We felt that due to the expanded numbers of the captive population there was no likelihood the entire subspecies would be placed in jeopardy of extinction. This would be true even if all of the Mexican wolves in the wild failed to reproduce and had a total population collapse. This of course has not occurred and the population in the wild has continued to increase in numbers and dispersal throughout the recovery area.

- The nonessential designation needs to be retained. The Court erred by relying on a statement in the record "a group of scientists informed FWS, through submission of a formal public comment, that FWS misstated and misinterpreted the scientists' findings." The scientist's findings were based on modeling that has now been discredited by the onthe ground evidence of the success of cross-fostering and successful releases into the wild from captive populations. This error leads to the false reasoning that the essential designation is required to support a successful recovery of the Mexican wolf;
- 2. The scientist's significant misrepresentation in their evaluation fails to take into account the extremely low number of foundation members. Gila County has long held that due to the low numbers of founding members that the genetic viability of the captive and wild populations has always been in jeopardy;
- 3. The statutory definition of essential is plain on its face. The loss of the experimental

population in the wild due to a lack of genetic variability is not occurring. The captive population is being managed to maintain what little genetic variability that has ever existed;

- 4. Our conclusion is that maintenance of the nonessential status would not be likely to appreciably reduce the likelihood of the survival of the species in the wild.
- 5. From the Judge's decision, "Whether a population is designated "essential" or "nonessential" affects whether federal agencies have a duty to consult with FWS on certain federal actions under ESA Section 7(a)(2). Where a population is designated "nonessential," federal agencies are not required to formally consult with FWS on actions likely to jeopardize the continued existence of the species. 16 U.S.C. § 1536(a)(2). Instead, federal agencies must engage in a conferral process that results in conservation recommendations that are not binding upon the agency. *Id.* § 1536(a)(4). Additionally, the Secretary may not designate critical habitat for an experimental population designated as nonessential. *Id.* § 1539(j)(2)(C)(ii). To date, the "essential" designation has never been applied to an experimental population of any species." The potential impacts from essential classification that require analysis are:
 - a. Increase of Service and other federal agencies personnel to do the formal consultations;
 - b. Delays of permit application processing;
 - c. Effects need to be analyzed on grazing allotment pre-existing rights and other activities on federal lands due to making the essential designation.

(2) Aligning the population objective and release recommendations in the new revised rule with the recovery criteria in the revised recovery plan for the MWEPA to ensure the new revised rule supports the long-term conservation and recovery of the Mexican wolf.

- 1. Further analysis and statements need to delve into the fact that Mexican wolves were rarely detected above Interstate 10 in the southern U.S. portion of their historic range. The historic range in the U.S. is only 10% of this historic range with the historic range being 90% in Mexico. Canis lupus mogollonensis did occupy what is now being used for the reintroduction of the Mexican wolf;
- 2. The Court concluded that, "the population size and effective migration rate, which do not further the conservation of the species, are arbitrary and capricious." Analysis should take into account the above historic range. There should be extensive discussion in the analysis of what is being proposed for Mexican wolf numbers in the southwestern far exceeds their historic range occupation;
- 3. Analysis should focus on recovery of the Mexican wolf in its historic range of Mexico. This would be more in line with long range conservation and recovery of the Mexican wolf in its historic range;
- 4. Analysis should take into account that with the increase of numbers of wolves in the current allowed release areas there has been a corresponding increase in livestock depredations. There has been no increase in wolf management personnel at the local, state or federal level. The analysis should include a determination of:
 - a. How many Service, local government, state government and other federal agency personnel need to be increased in order to properly manage the increased numbers;
 - b. Whether or not wolves have already saturated the habitat within BRWRA, MWEPA and occupied dispersal areas and therefore further releases in these locations do

not further the conservation or recovery of the species;

- c. Analysis needs to provide disclosure of how the Service intends to secure increases in funding to provide reasonable compensation for livestock depredations;
- d. Analysis needs to disclose how many increased Service, USDA Wildlife Services and state and local government personnel will have to be brought on to properly investigate and make determinations for livestock depredations;

(3) Management provisions to facilitate the ability to achieve the genetic recovery criterion for the MWEPA which serves the long-term conservation and recovery plan target.

- 1. As stated above in Item (1), 2. the genetic problem stems from the small number of founding members. Even with the releases over the last four decades and the institution of cross-fostering Mexican wolves in the wild continue their downward spiral as stated in the recovery plan. It is understood from conservation biologists and environmental activist discussions that the desire is to expand Mexican wolves occupied territory northward to meet up with Northern timer wolf populations. The objective as stated is to improve the genetic vigor necessary to halt the downward spiral. What is not discussed in this objective is that the resulting cross breeding will dilute and eventually swamp Mexican wolf genetic distinction. We hold this would be a violation of the Endangered Species Act. Analysis of this issue should include:
 - a. An explanation why after four decades of breeding genetic viability does not exist in the wild population in combination with the captive population;
 - Determination of the effect on the Mexican wolf species if they are released or they are allowed to disperse above Interstate 40 and intermingle with timber wolves migrating from the north;
 - c. An examination of a "release [of] a sufficient number of captive Mexican wolves to result in 22 released Mexican wolves surviving to breeding age in the MWEPA."
 This needs to take a hard look at how the Service intends to monitor these releases and proposed benefit to genetic vigor;
 - d. A detailed statement why releases and recovery effort is not concentrated in Mexico. Until the 90% of the historic range is occupied by a self-sustaining population it is absurd to envision a successful recovery of the species. Supporting this contention is the statement quoted in the Judge's opinion, "FWS has also recognized that the future success of the Mexican wolf "is likely to depend on the establishment of a metapopulation or several semi-disjunct populations spanning a significant portion of its <u>historic</u> range in the region." (2015 10(j) Rule at FR000175.)" (Emphasis added)
- 2. The County disagrees with the Judge's finding that the expanded take provisions lack protections for the loss of genetic diversity. The following are our comments on the three issues identified for further analysis:
 - a. Take on non-Federal lands in conjunction with a removal action as described in the 2015 rule. If a livestock owner is experiencing depredation or a family or community has wolves endangering residents, then this take provision needs to remain in effect. Endangerment of persons and property needs to have an appropriate response. This provision needs to be in alignment with the ESA provision that allows a take when a person or their property is in eminent threat. This provision also needs to be in alignment with the fourth and fifth amendment

to the Constitution. Removal of offending and obviously habituated wolves is an option to lethal takes. Genetic diversity is not an excuse to permit serious impacts to persons or property. Allowing wolves to remain and continue unacceptable behavior on non-federal lands merely encourages bad behavior and transmitting that behavior to the offending pack. For these reasons there needs to be a return to the three strikes rule with an inclusion that prevents livestock depredating wolves from being relocated into occupied livestock grazing allotments.

- b. Takes on Federal land should continue as the 2015 rule directs when wolf behavior described above occurs. In addition, the three strikes rule and prohibition of translocation of depredating wolves to occupied livestock grazing allotments.
- c. The 2015 rule should continue for takes resulting to impacts to a wild ungulate herd. Gila County is concerned that eliminating this provision could have serious impacts on the ecosystems and species dependent on those ecosystems. It is hard to imagine that Congress desired placing additional species in jeopardy of extinction through experimentally introduced species. This is particularly troubling when introducing a species into habitats they historically never occupied and where even their rare presence has been removed through extirpation for many decades. With all wolf subspecies having been extirpated in the southwest, particularly in the Cochise, Coconino, Gila and Apache-Sitgreaves Forests those ecosystems have evolved and adapted without their presence. This is particularly true since humans and their survival activities are now occupying these habitats. If we continue on the current trends of increased wild ungulate depredations wolves will increase pressure on livestock. This will continue the downward spiral of ranching operations. With decreased grazing on allotments there will be a decrease in construction and maintenance of livestock water developments. The decrease in water availability will compound the impacts on the wild ungulate populations. Analysis must include an examination of these ecosystem impacts. Analysis also needs to include impacts on game department revenues from hunting licenses, state and local government tax revenue loss from reduced hunting and outfitter and guide activities.

(4) Comments on proposals to update data, information, and analyses pertinent to any of the revisions under consideration in the new revised rule.

- 1. Modification of the Purpose and Need of the 2014 EIS only as necessary to explain the role of the MWEPA in the recovery of the Mexican wolf, based on the revised recovery plan. The following are our comments and identified issues on modification of the Purpose and Need:
 - a. Gila County commends the Service in a better explanation of the role of the MWEPA. However, we are concerned about total reliance on the recovery plan for possible changes. The recovery plan team was made up of primarily wolf introduction advocates. We believe that recovery direction should be directed by a more rigorous scientific inquiry. An examination team should be a multi-discipline effort rather than exclusively wolf biologists. This effort should also be subjected to a rigorous multi-discipline peer review.
- 2. The following are our comments and identified issues on proposed changes for Alternative One (Proposed Action and Preferred Alternative), revision of the population objectives and release recommendations:

- a. It is difficult to provide responsible comments without some kind of range of population numbers the Service is contemplating. We do note in the Judge's ruling the citation of (2015 10(j) Rule at FR000138–39A). "[i]n the more immediate future, FWS may conduct <u>additional</u> releases in excess of 1–2 effective migrants per generation to address the high degree of relatedness of wolves in the current BRWRA."[Emphasis Added] The assertion by the plaintiffs on this issue is that the Service were only going to release 1-2 effective migrants per generation. The Judge relied on this false assumption and the comments of Carroll, et al to rule in favor of the plaintiffs and label the Service's decision arbitrary and capricious;
- b. In regard to revising any of the three forms of allowable take discussed please see our issues and comments in item (3) above.
- 3. The following are our comments and identified issues on proposed changes for Alternative Two, we may revise any of the three forms of allowable take discussed above, consistent with revisions made in Alternative One:
- 4. See the comments and issues identified in the above sub-issues 1. and 2.Gila County commends the Services proposal to provide updated data in the supplemental EIS at the relevant State or county level for Arizona and New Mexico to analyze the environmental consequences (*i.e.*, effects or impacts) of our revisions on the land use, biological resources, economic activity, health and human safety, and environmental justice in the project area.

The Gila County Board of Supervisors appreciates the opportunity to comment and requests to be kept informed and included in the process moving forward.

Item 1 – CALL TO ORDER - PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Cline called the Work Session to order at 10:00 a.m. this date in the Board of Supervisors' hearing room and Homero Vela led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Item 2 – REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

A. Information/Discussion on current and future Public Works Department projects as outlined in the County's 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan.

Steve Sanders, Public Works Department Director, advised that each of his Division Managers were present and would be providing information on their Division. Darde De Roulhac, Floodplain Engineer, Gila County Floodplain District, stated that Floodplain Division staff have been discussing several past and upcoming projects with FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency). These projects are in addition to the routine issuance of floodplain use permits, and monitoring rainfall and streamflow to help alert residents of the potential for flooding. Mr. De Roulhac proceeded to review these new projects, as follows: 1) LIDAR (Light Detection and Ranging), which is a remote sensing method that uses light in the form of a pulsed laser to measure ranges (variable distances) to Earth. The LIDAR provides ground elevations throughout most of the developed areas of the County, excluding tribal lands. This project was funded by FEMA and administered by the USGS (United States Geological Survey). Mr. De Roulhac advised that it is a first step to being able to provide flooding elevations and extents so residents can build in a manner that protects life and property without excessive engineering costs for an additional project. The County received the product data last year and copies of it were provided to the City of Globe and Town of Payson. Each Board member commented that they often deal with complaints from residents on floodplain issues, so they are pleased that this data is available. They thanked Mr. De Roulhac and his staff for their efforts. 2) The next step is the BLE (Base Level Engineering) project which will be funded by FEMA. This is a process for flood mapping areas that have only an approximate study (flood zone "A" which does not have flood elevations) or watercourses that have not yet been studied. BLE uses the LIDAR data in a somewhat automated process to give flooding information at a greatly reduced cost, with accuracy (although not as much as a detailed study would have). In summary, no base flood elevations or crosssections will be put on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps as a result of this BLE. Mr. De Roulhac added that a tentative request for the inclusion of unstudied watercourses has been submitted to FEMA for their consideration, should the Board of Supervisors decide to proceed with this project. Supervisor Humphrey inquired if this data would prove FEMA wrong to which Mr. De Roulhac replied that could be possible. Mr. De Roulhac stated, "We could eliminate some areas from the floodplain that were incorrectly mapped and may include new areas." Chairman Cline entered a discussion about the watersheds and tribes not being included in the LIDAR. Mr. De Roulhac stated that FEMA negotiated that arrangement with the tribes; however, he doesn't know who initiated it. He added that the tribes won't have the data to do BLEs so they would have to work with FEMA. Chairman Cline advised that he get information on the process regarding the tribes and LIDAR. Each Board member thanked Mr. De Roulhac for the information.

Kenneth Keith, Recycling and Landfill Manager, presented the following information for the Buckhead Mesa Landfill in Payson and Russell Gulch Landfill in Globe.

<u>Buckhead Mesa Landfill</u> – Staffed by 1 supervisor, 3 senior operators, and 1 scale house attendant. Operations are Monday- Saturday from 8:00am – 4:00pm.

- 2019 tonnage-21,740.23
- 2019 revenue-\$1,074,486.24
- 495 tons of metal was recycled
- 2020 tonnage-3303.25 (Jan March)
- 2020 revenue-\$151,519.10

• Buckhead Mesa Landfill takes in an average annual tonnage of 21,000. With the expansion in the summer of 2018, the life of the Landfill use is estimated through the year 2025 with proper management.

Dollar Day:

- 2019-3714 vehicles with average Dollar Day being 309 per dollar day
- 2019 tonnage-1,328.29 with an average tonnage of 110.69 per Dollar Day
- Reduced revenue for the year 2019-\$70,558.76
- Year 2020 Dollar Day (January-March 2020)
- 736 vehicles
- 328.65 tons
- Reduced revenue-\$17,457.88

<u>Russell Gulch Landfill</u> - Staffed by 1 supervisor, 3 senior operators, 1 operator, and 1 scale house attendant. Operations are Monday- Saturday from 6:00am – 4:00pm

- 2019 tonnage-37,263.54
- 2019 revenue-\$1,081,211.34
- 265 tons of metal was recycled
- 2020 tonnage-14,379.51 (Jan March)
- 2020 revenue-\$270,311.37

• Russell Gulch Landfill tonnage has increased from an average annual tonnage of 21,500 of solid waste to the 2019 tonnage of 37,263.54. An expansion is planned in the next few years that will extend the use until 2034 if properly managed.

Dollar Day:

- 2019-4,437 vehicles with average Dollar Day being 369 per Dollar Day
- 2019 tonnage-1,412.51 with an average tonnage of 117.70 per Dollar Day
- Lost revenue for the year 2019-\$75,032.53
- Year 2020 Dollar Day (January-March 2020)
- 1061 vehicles
- 290.93 tons
- Lost revenue-\$15,454.20

The various cleanup events throughout the County were also reviewed and the Refurbished Bicycle Program of which 138 used bicycles were refurbished by Department of Corrections inmates and given away to deserving Gila County children at Christmas time. For Earth Day 2019, 508 gift bags were handed out.

Vice-Chairman Martin commented that recently there have been large numbers of visitors to northern Gila County, especially on weekends, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. She thanked Mr. Keith and his staff for placing temporary dumpsters and porta johns in Payson and Star Valley and attending to them. She asked Mr. Keith to track the amount of trash being collected at these dumpsters. Supervisor Humphrey entered a discussion about resuming the Dollar Day Program, which allows anyone to dispose of garbage for a cost of \$1 per vehicle on the first Saturday of each month when the restrictions have been lifted due to the COVID-19 situation even though it is a loss of revenue to the County. The specific monetary losses to each landfill were discussed. The other Supervisors agreed that a lot of good has resulted from the program because many properties have been cleaned up. Chairman Cline suggested issuing vouchers that could be used any day of the week instead of one Saturday per month to reduce the long wait time to enter the landfill. He has learned that many people are no longer taking advantage of Dollar Day due to the long wait time. He stated, "I see ways it can be changed to improve it and still meet the needs of the people." The Board briefly talked with Mr. Keith about the newly implemented Composting Program. James Menlove, County Manager, talked about the many blighted areas within the County and he asked Mr. Keith to think of ways to utilize the landfills to clean up further blighted areas. Mr. Sanders talked about ongoing negotiations with the U.S. Forest Service to acquire approximately 640 acres of Forest Service land to expand the Buckhead Mesa Landfill. He is unsure if the transaction will be completed before the landfill runs out of space; however, should that occur, temporary arrangements are being made with the Forest Service. Chairman Cline offered to talk with Forest Service staff to which Mr. Sanders replied that would be helpful. Mr. Sanders added that not all of the 640 acres will be needed for the landfill expansion, so consideration should be given to utilizing it in the future to centralize County services. The Board thanked Mr. Keith and Mr. Sanders.

Glen Farnham, Public Works General Services Manager, presented information on the Vehicle Replacement Plan. The Plan is based on best practices examples of like agencies in the public sector and the condition of the County's fleet of vehicles. He reviewed spreadsheets for General Fund fleet vehicles, General Fund Sheriff's Office fleet vehicles, HURF (Highway User Revenue Fund) Public Works fleet vehicles, and Enterprise Fund Landfills' fleet vehicles. The data collected for this exercise has been imported from the current AgileFleet fleet management software program as well as the historic data from the previous CFA fleet management software program. Mr. Farnham proceeded to review the age, mileage, utilization, and annual maintenance costs for each of the various fleets as listed above. For FY 2021, it is recommended that 19 vehicles should be replaced with new vehicles, as follows:

• <u>General Fund Fleet</u>: A total of 5 vehicles at a cost of \$205,800; these 5 vehicles exceed 20 years of age and/or 200,000 miles or 100% of the cost of a replacement vehicle has been expended for maintenance on each.

• <u>General Fund Sheriff's Office</u>: A total of 5 marked patrol vehicles at a cost of \$340,000; these 5 vehicles exceed 200,000 miles and 100% of the cost of replacement vehicles has been expended for maintenance on each.

• <u>Public Works HURF Fund</u>: A total of 8 vehicles at a cost of \$460,550; of these 8 vehicles 2 are over 30 years old and 4 are over 20 years old. The remaining 2

vehicles have accrued over or are very near 200,000 miles and 4 of the group have exceeded 100% of the cost of replacement vehicles has been expended for maintenance on each.

• <u>Enterprise Fund – Landfills</u>: One vehicle at a cost of \$35,000. This vehicle is 18 years of age.

Throughout the presentation, Mr. Farnham and Mr. Menlove answered questions from the Board members. Each Board member thanked Mr. Farnham for the information.

Mr. Sanders provided information on Public Works road projects for 2020 through 2023. He stated that the HURF 5-year projection slide was created prior to the COVID-19 situation when HURF revenues were increasing; however, adjustments are now being made anticipating there will be a reduction in future HURF revenues. A summary of the work to be done and the current status of each project was provided, as follows:

2020 for Design, Construction or Chip Seal Projects

Colcord Road (bridge over Gordon Canyon); Gibson Ranch Road; Gisela Road; Mesa de Caballo (Mescalero/Caballero); Rim Trail Bridge; Roosevelt Resort-Stagecoach Trail; Deer Creek Village; Kellner Canyon Road; Old State Route 18-Punkin Center; Six Shooter Canyon Road; and Walnut Springs Subdivision.

2021 for Design, Construction or Chip Seal Projects

Cemetery Road; Golden Hill Road-Sidewalk Project; Main Street-Sidewalk Project; Walliman Road; Pine (chip seal north of SR 87); and Pine (south of SR 87)

2022 for Chip Seal Projects

Strawberry (north of Fossil Creek Road); and Strawberry (south of Fossil Creek Road).

2023 for Design or Chip Seal Projects

Cline Boulevard-Ewing Trail; Control Road; and Houston Mesa Road.

Vice-Chairman Martin commented on the need to complete all these projects, especially Colcord Road. Supervisor Humphrey thanked Mr. Sanders for using in-house staff on many of these projects. Chairman Cline agreed on the need to complete these projects and stated, "...but money will have a big influence on what we do next year." Mr. Menlove asked Mr. Sanders about grant opportunities. Mr. Sanders replied that the BUILD grant application will be submitted this Friday for the Tonto Bridge Construction Project. Another FLAT grant application will be submitted this date to extend paving on Forest Service 512 Road. Each Board member thanked Mr. Sanders and the Division Managers for the presentation.

B. Information/Discussion on current and future Facilities Management Department projects as outlined in the County's 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan.

Homero Vela, Assistant County Manager, provided a slide presentation and reviewed current and future Facilities Management Department projects. A summary is as follows:

<u>Payson Probation/Teen Center</u> – This was a complete remodel of a 5,772 square foot building that began on June 14, 2019 and was completed on December 12, 2019. Most of the work was completed in-house with Maintenance and Probation personnel. Funding Source – Capital Projects/Juvenile Probation funds; Contractor's Cost - \$62,000 budgeted vs. \$61,323 actual cost; and County Materials - \$98,000 budgeted vs. \$98,979 actual cost.

<u>Northern Gila County Health Services Department Building</u> – The project is a complete remodel of 3,000 square foot building that was the former NAPA parts store purchased by the County several years ago. The floor and roof will be replaced, and the interior will be completely remodeled. This building will house the Health Services Department, WIC (Women, Infants and Children) Program, and Animal Control. This project began on January 21, 2020, and construction is estimated to be completed by October 1, 2020. To date, the project is 30% complete. Funding Source – Capital Improvements funds; Contractor's Cost - \$210,800 budgeted vs. \$184,630 actual to date expended; and County Materials - \$138,780 budgeted vs. \$26,568 actual to date expended.

<u>Globe Jail Renovation</u> – The renovation will consist of 26,000 square feet which includes a roof replacement and the HVAC will be modernized. This project began on May 20, 2020 and is estimated to be completed by September 30, 2021. Funding Source - Capital Improvements/Bond funds and expenditures will take place in FY 2020 and FY 2021; and Project Cost - \$1,000,000 budgeted vs. \$3,362 actual to date expended.

<u>New Globe Animal Shelter</u> – The new Animal Shelter will be 7,481 square feet under roof plus 730 square feet for the sally port. It will have 27 dog kennels, 20 cat cages, and equipped to function as an animal shelter of this size, including a surgical suite, sally port, administrative offices, greeting/adoption rooms, washer/dryer area, animal bathing, food storage, etc. This project began on September 1, 2020, and is estimated to be completed by May 19, 2021. Funding Source – Capital Improvements/Bond funds; All-Inclusive Cost - \$3,000,000 budgeted vs. \$42,860 actual to date expended. <u>New Payson Multi-Purpose Complex</u> – The Multi-Purpose Complex will be 11,000 square feet. It will house the Board of Supervisors' Office, Recorder's Office, Assessor's Office, Treasurer's Office, and School Superintendent's Office. This complex will also function as a Superior Court jury trial location. The project also includes building a sally port at the current Payson Jail and a sally port and the new facility. The project began on November 1, 2020 and is estimated to be completed by September 31, 2021. Funding Source – Capital Improvements/Bond funds; All-Inclusive Cost - \$4,770,000 budgeted vs. \$7,594 actual to date expended.

<u>Michaelson Building Remodel</u> – The two-story remodel will consist of 7,000 square feet. This building will be turned into a business hub that is being completed in cooperation with the City of Globe, Freeport-McMoRan, and Capstone Mining. Most of the remodel will be completed in-house with the assistance of the Department of Corrections inmate labor. This project began on November 1, 2018 and is estimated to be completed by May 1, 2021. Funding Source – Capital Improvement/Grant funds; Contractor's Cost -\$200,000 budgeted vs. \$424 actual to date expended; and County Materials -\$100,000 budgeted vs. \$3,016 actual to date expended.

<u>Payson Sheriff's Office Remodel</u> – The remodel will consist of 7,340 square feet. The administration offices will be remodeled, and the booking area, kitchen, and laundry will be relocated. This project will begin on January 1, 2021 and is estimated to be completed by June 1, 2021. Funding Source – Capital Improvements/Bond funds; Project Cost - \$1,000,000 budgeted vs. \$0 actual to date expended.

<u>Regional Drainage-Payson Building Complex</u> - This project is to redesign and construct a new regional drainage plan per the current drainage plan outlined in the Town of Payson Master Drainage Plan 2000. The area of concern for Gila County is the drainage in the parking lot of the new Gila County Health Services Department building. The County has entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Town of Payson whereby both entities will equally share the cost of \$1,000,000 to do this project. The project will begin on August 1, 2020 and is estimated to be completed on October 31, 2020. Funding Source – General Fund funds; Project Cost - \$1,000,000 (\$500,000 from Gila County and \$500,000 from the Town of Payson) vs. \$0 actual to date expended.

At the end of the presentation, Vice-Chairman Martin emphasized the need to remodel the administrative offices in Payson for the Sheriff's Office. Chairman Cline asked Mr. Vela and County Management to not lose focus of the Countyowned acreage that is located on Highway 260 in Payson as it is valuable land. Chairman Cline said that selling some or all of that property could generate substantial revenue to help fund these capital improvement projects. Mr. Vela replied that he would work with County Manager James Menlove to get an appraisal done on the property. Each Board member thanked Mr. Vela for the information.

Item 3 – CALL TO THE PUBLIC: Call to the Public is held for public benefit to allow individuals to address the Board of Supervisors on any issue within the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors. Board members may not discuss items that are not specifically identified on the agenda. Therefore, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute §38-431.01(H), at the conclusion of an open call to the public, individual members of the Board of Supervisors may respond to criticism made by those who have addressed the Board, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda for further discussion and decision at a future date.

There weren't any comments from the public.

Item 1 – CALL TO ORDER - PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – INVOCATION

Chairman Cline called the Regular Meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. this date in the Board of Supervisors' hearing room. J. Adam Shepherd led the Pledge of Allegiance and James Menlove delivered the invocation.

Item 2 – PRESENTATIONS:

A. Public recognition of three employees through the County's Spotlight on Employees Program, as follows: Israel Juarez, Nicole Weaver, and Jerry Irish.

Erica Raymond, Human Resources Assistant, Senior, advised that Nicole Weaver and Jerry Irish were unable to attend the meeting; therefore, she would present their Spotlight nominations at a future Board meeting. She proceeded to read aloud a letter of nomination for Israel Juarez that was submitted by J. Adam Shepherd, Gila County Sheriff. Deputy Juarez responded to a fire on Azurite Drive in Globe and helped a resident out of a burning house. After learning that one of the homeowner's dog was still inside the house, Deputy Juarez rescued the dog. Deputy Juarez has been employed with the Sheriff's Office for a little over a year. Ms. Raymond presented Deputy Juarez with a gift card. Deputy Juarez said a few words of thanks. Each Board member also thanked Deputy Juarez for his courage and willingness to serve on the front lines.

B. Presentation of the University of Arizona's Gila County Cooperative Extension Office Annual Report and FY 2020-2021 Budget request to be considered for approval during Gila County's regular budget process.

Richard (Rick) Gibson, Regional Director, is responsible for the Cooperative Extension programs in Gila County and Pinal County. He provided a slide presentation that highlighted the various Cooperative Extension activities in Gila County over the past year and stated, "It is important for us to give you a flavor of some of the things we are doing although it is not everything." There are 3 Cooperative Extension offices in Gila County: Globe, Payson and San Carlos. Mr. Gibson proceeded to review the following 7 program areas: Agriculture and Range Management, Animal Science, Natural Resources, 4-H Youth Development, Family Consumer Health Science, Horticulture, and Forest Health. He advised that Chris Jones presently covers horticulture and forest health; however, due to the workload that position needs to be split into two positions in the future.

Mr. Gibson reviewed the University of Arizona (U of A) budget for the Cooperative Extension Program. Each year Gila County budgets money for the Cooperative Extension Program and in recent years it has been \$70,000 per vear. Mr. Gibson advised that the U of A receives state and federal funds. grant funds, and funding from the County which supports the program. In 2019, \$448,505 of grant funds were received. He added, "Most is spent on personnel who live in Gila County and many of our expenditures are made in Gila County." He advised that the \$70,000 provided by Gila County is important as it is used for travel and operations and he requested the Board to provide the same amount of funding for FY 2021. Mr. Gibson stated, "We have sufficient funds for our needs at this time, but there may be budget cuts coming in the future....Money from the County partnership allows us to have great flexibility and we feel comfort going into the future; we appreciate you for that." Mr. Gibson announced that he will be retiring from U of A on May 31st of this year and someone will replace him in the position. He stated, "I appreciate working with this Board and people of Gila County over the past years. I appreciated the welcome I received from the people in Gila County. I feel comfortable telling you that you will have a great faculty and staff, even the newer agents, going forward." Each Board member commented that Mr. Gibson will be missed and wished him the very best in his retirement.

C. Presentation regarding Gila County financial data as of 3/31/2020 as it compares to the fiscal year 2020 Gila County Budget and fiscal year 2019 year-to-date performance.

Maryn Belling, Finance Department Budget Manager, advised that per a request of the Board, each month she presents financial updates to the Board. The staff report for this item contains the following information: The Finance

Department has analyzed the year-to-date performance of both revenues and expenditures as compared to the 2020 Fiscal Year Budget. This report contains General Fund fiscal data as of March 31, 2020, as follows: Gila County's General Fund revenues were at 63.32% of the annual budget. General Fund expenditures plus encumbrances were at 69% of the annual budget (65.25% for expenditures). Targeted % of the annual budget for both revenue and expense is 75%, so these ratios are slightly better than expected for 9 full months of activity.

Ms. Belling stated, "Per our Treasurer, we are at 95% of property taxes received so far this year which is so much better than when we ran these reports at 64%." She proceeded to review the graph for 9 months ending on March 31, 2020. The Board members thanked Ms. Belling for the information.

Item 3 – PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to adopt Resolution No. 20-05-02 which authorizes the Gila County Housing Authority to submit its Five-Year Plan (FY 2020-2024) to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and authorize the Chairman's signature on the accompanying certification form.

Malissa Buzan, Community Services Department Director, advised that it is a requirement of the U.S. Department of Housing for housing authorities to submit a 5-Year Plan, which provides the Gila County Housing Authority a basis to run its Section 8 housing programs. Ms. Buzan stated that the Plan must include a plan for violence against women, payment standards, etc. She stated, "We have a resident board now consisting of 3 people from Payson, so we are ecstatic about that." Ms. Buzan added that if there are any changes to the Plan, the Gila County Housing Authority will prepare and include those changes in an annual plan which will be presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval. Chairman Cline opened the public hearing. There weren't any comments so he closed the public hearing and asked for a Board motion. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Martin, seconded by Supervisor Humphrey, the Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 20-05-02 and authorized the Chairman's signature on the accompanying certification form. (A copy of the resolution is permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office and attached to these minutes.)

Item 4 - REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

A. Information/Discussion/Action to approve the distribution of \$1,158,854.34 of Gila County's share of Federal Year 2020 Secure Rural Schools Act funds as authorized through section 24 of P.L. 114-10 for FY

2019-2020 as follows: \$25,000 to Roads, \$903,026.84 to Schools, and \$230,827.50 to Gila County Education Service Agency.

Roy Sandoval, Gila County School Superintendent, advised that in the past the distribution has been allocated to roads and schools. Beginning last year, funding was also provided to the Gila County Education Service Agency which supports the adult education program. Mr. Sandoval stated, "It has become a robust program in Globe and Payson." Mr. Sandoval emphasized the importance of writing letters to Congress to continue receiving PILT (Payment in Lieu of Taxes) funding and stated that each year he writes letters. Chairman Cline replied, "I've been to (Washington) D.C. in the past 2 years pushing for schools on the PILT payment. We are only about 3% private (land) in our county. We have to keep pushing on this and writing those letters as it's a good amount of money." Upon motion by Supervisor Humphrey, seconded by Vice-Chairman Martin, the Board unanimously approved the distribution of \$1,158,854.34 of Gila County's share of Federal Year 2020 Secure Rural Schools Act funds as follows: \$25,000 to Roads, \$903,026.84 to Schools, and \$230,827.50 to Gila County Education Service Agency.

B. Information/Discussion/Action to adopt Resolution No. 20-05-03 designating a portion of Houston Mesa Road as a no parking area.

Steve Sanders, Public Works Department Director, presented this item. The following information is contained in the staff report for this item: Gila County holds a Highway Easement Deed from the Federal Highway Administration for the Houston Mesa Road. The road is included in the County's Maintained Roadway System. A traffic count from 2019 showed the average daily traffic to be 2842 vehicles. That number increases substantially during the summer and on weekends. Houston Mesa Road provides access to numerous communities north of Payson in the unincorporated area of Gila County. The road also provides access to the Tonto National Forest and the East Verde River. The river has become a destination for residents from all parts of the state. Due to the popularity of the location, the County has found that numerous people park along the road with no consideration to other users of the road, oftentimes creating a one-lane road. Emergency vehicles are having a difficult time navigating the road due to vehicles along the roadway.

Mr. Sanders informed the Board that he received an email from the Fire Chief of the Water Wheel Fire District expressing his concern about vehicles parked on both sides of the roadway during the weekends, narrowing the roadway which would cause emergency vehicles to park in the road blocking traffic both directions should an emergency occur. He added that the Payson District Ranger for the Tonto National Forest also supports the no parking request. Mr. Sanders stated, "It has turned into a one-lane road and emergency responders worry about getting through." He added that parking areas owned by the U.S. Forest Service have been closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic because there aren't enough personnel to regulate the use of it. Mr. Sanders stated, "It is just people wanting to get right next to the river. It is a heavily traveled road, almost 3,000 per day traveled." Supervisor Humphrey clarified that with the posting of no parking signs, it means that the Sheriff's Office would be issuing citations which would result in subsequent fines for any violations to which Mr. Sanders replied that was correct. Chairman Cline initiated a conversation on ways that the County could possibly help resolve this problem as he doesn't believe issuing citations is the long-term solution. J. Adam Shepherd, Gila County Sheriff, also expressed his concern regarding the ability for emergency personnel to respond quickly given the high amount of traffic and congestion on this road especially during weekends. It was agreed that Mr. Sanders would contact Forest Service personnel to discuss partnering with the County to develop or find alternative parking. Upon motion by Vice-Chairman Martin, seconded by Supervisor Humphrey, the Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 20-05-03. (A copy of the resolution is permanently on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office and attached to these minutes.)

C. Information/Discussion/Action to approve Amendment No. 1 to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Town of Payson and Gila County, AZ for Centralized Management of 9-1-1 Grant Funds to extend the term of the IGA for one year; from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

Sarah White, Chief Administrative Officer for the Sheriff"s Office, stated that this Amendment would renew the IGA that was approved by the Board of Supervisors last year. Upon motion by Supervisor Humphrey, seconded by Vice-Chairman Martin, the Board unanimously approved Amendment No. 1 to the IGA between the Town of Payson and Gila County, AZ for Centralized Management of 9-1-1 Grant Funds.

D. Information/Discussion/Action to approve the budgeted and unbudgeted inter-fund transfers for FY 2019 in the amount of \$467,519.18 from General Fund to Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund.

Ms. Belling gave credit to Sheriff's Office Chief Administrator Sarah White and her staff for the research conducted which helped identify the availability and proper use of this funding. Ms. Belling stated, "They went back 8 years to find the total dollar amount...and to understand what the fund was for and why to come up with a way to restore this fund and bring it back into compliance. This was an unbudgeted transfer and we are coming to you."

The staff report for this item contained the following information: Past practices for charging return to competency costs in the amount of \$467,519.18 in Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund (CJEF) were not an appropriate use of funds and required reimbursement from the General Fund. CJEF funds are used for jail enhancement expenses and the funds that are reimbursed in the amount of \$467,519.18 will be used for capital improvements to the Globe detention facility.

Chairman Cline was pleased that the County is once again in compliance and he inquired if this money would be in addition to budgeted capital improvement project funds for the Globe detention facility. James Menlove, County Manager, replied "Our intent is this can be used in lieu of bond money, \$1.1M in Globe and \$1.2M in Payson." Sheriff Shepherd added that this money could be used for jail maintenance and other maintenance/repair work that may arise without needing to request authorization from the Board to use General Fund money. Upon motion Vice-Chairman Martin, seconded by Supervisor Humphrey, the Board unanimously approved the budgeted and unbudgeted inter-fund transfers for FY 2019 in the amount of \$467,519.18 from General Fund to Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund.

E. Information/Discussion/Action to consider a sealed bid for the purchase of Assessor's tax parcel number 305-10-022D and, if accepted, authorize the Chairman's signature on the Quit Claim Deed.

Marian Sheppard, Clerk of the Board, advised that the subject property is a small sliver of a road in Young. The property adjoins Gila County Assessor's parcel number 305-10-020B, which is owned by Russell Griffith and Janine Schmitz. The lien amount for this property is \$363.32. Should the Board accept the bid, Ms. Sheppard advised that the Griffiths intend to combine the parcels which she said would be a "win-win" for the County because the Assessor and Treasurer would have to issue fewer notices per year for each parcel. Ms. Sheppard asked the Chairman for permission to open the sealed bid envelope which was granted. She stated, "I have a bid on parcel number 305-10-022D from Russell Griffith in the amount of \$75." Upon motion by Supervisor Humphrey, seconded by Vice-Chairman Martin, the Board unanimously accepted a bid of \$75 from Russell Griffith for the purchase of parcel number 305-10-020B and authorized the Chairman's signature on the Quit Claim Deed.
